

PETITION FROM HOBART TOWN.

To the Honorable Members of the Legislative Council, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Residents of Hobart Town and its vicinity in Public Meeting

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That in the opinion of your Petitioners the proposed alteration in the Tariff is unjust in its nature, would be highly injurious to the commercial and industrial classes of the Colony, and exceptionally oppressive to a most important section of the community, as represented by Hobart Town and Launceston and their Suburban Districts.
