

I HAVE the honor to submit my Report upon the state of the Municipal Police for the year 1881, for the information of His Excellency the Governor.

No important changes in organization have taken place during the year.

There was a general diminution in reported cases of serious crime and minor offences, including drunkenness.

The number of drunkards proceeded against was less than last year, but more than in the year preceding. It is difficult to account for these fluctuations; increased or diminished police vigilance no doubt affects them.

The state of the Municipal Police would be much improved if the superannuation arrangements were made general. Nothing would tend so much to give a character of permanency to the Force.

TWENTY-THIRD Annual Report of the Inspector of Constabulary Forces of Municipalities in Tasmania, for the Year ending 31st December, 1881.

HOBART.—(Established 1st February, 1858.)

Force.—1 Superintendent, 2 Sub-Inspectors, 4 Sergeants, 2 Detective Sergeants, 3 Acting Sergeants, 6 Constables 1st Class, 26 Constables 2nd Class.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength.

Four Constables had resigned, and another had died.

Eighteeen publicans were proceeded against for breaches of the Licensing Act, 16 of them were fined, one case was dismissed, and another withdrawn; nine of them were for selling liquor after hours, six for breaches of the Sunday Clause, one for being drunk in his licensed house, one for allowing dancing, and another for permitting a disturbance in his house.

This Force has been increased by three Constables. One Constable was dismissed.

Four publicans were convicted: two for Sunday trading, one for allowing persons in his house after hours, and another for allowing cards to be played in his licensed house.

The Superintendent is Examiner of Weights and Measures, and the Sub-Inspector is Inspector of Common Lodging-houses. One of the Special Constables is Town Surveyor, and another is Police Office Messenger.

The strength of this Force has again been increased by the appointment of a Special Constable.

The Superintendent is also Council Clerk and Secretary to the Road Board. The Sub-Inspector is Bailiff of the Court of General Sessions.

This Municipality, although of large extent, is thinly inhabited, and the poorest in assessed value of property. The amount of subsidy is proportionately large, although the efficient force of constables is so small. The fact of the Superintendent acting as Council Clerk is less objectionable here than elsewhere, the work of either office being so light.

The District enjoys a state of great tranquillity, as the single arrest for an indictable offence would indicate.
