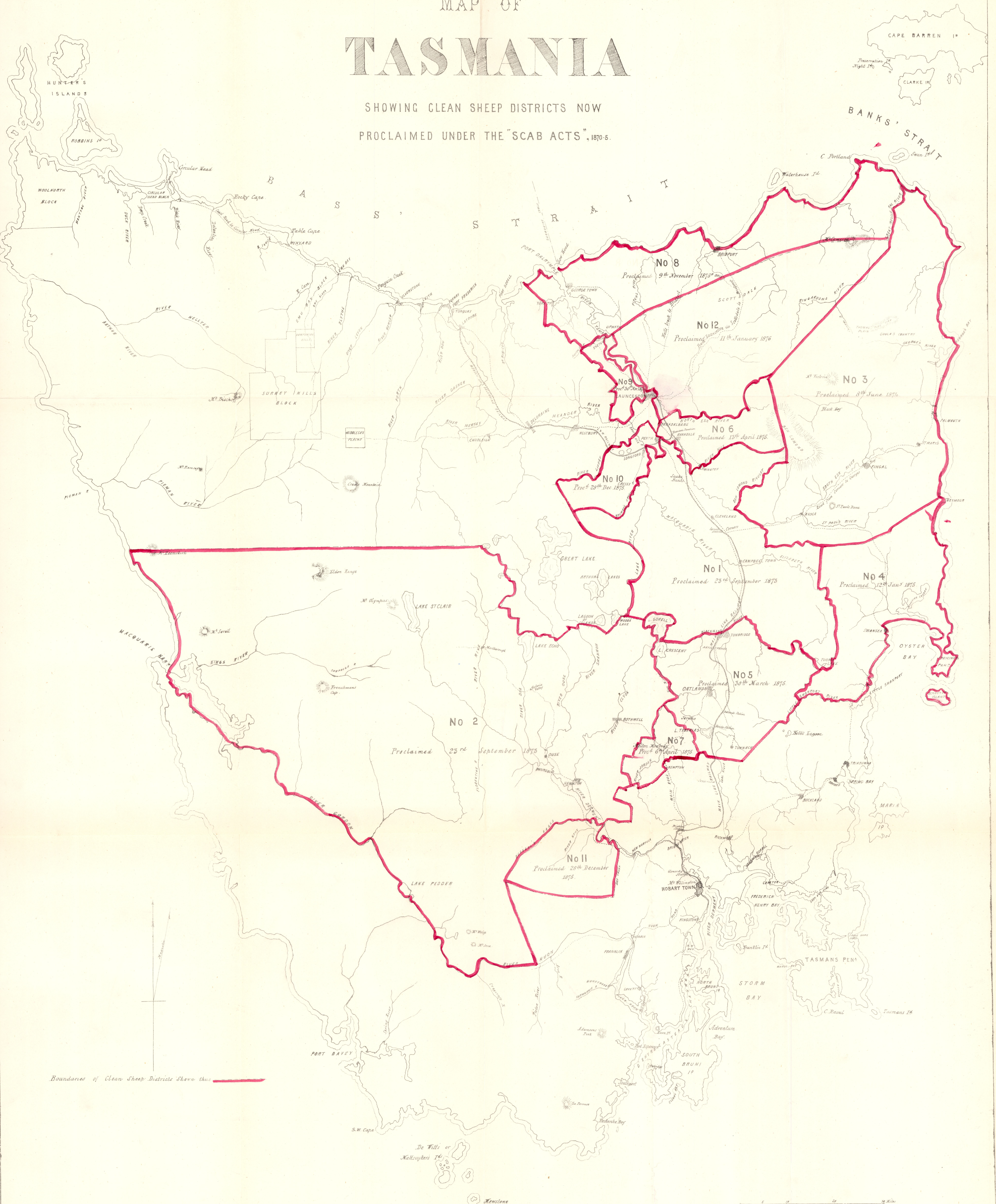

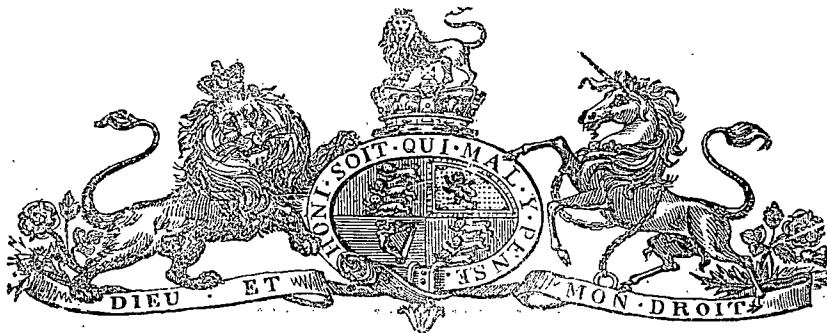
Return to an Order of the Council dated September 15, 1875. (Mr. Grubb.)

RETURN of CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICTS proclaimed under "The Scab Act."

Gazetted 23rd September, 1873.

No. 1 CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICT.

THE Municipality of Longford, south of Brumby's Creek, to its junction with the Lake River, to its junction with the River South Esk, and south of that river to the Municipality of Evandale.

The Municipality of Evandale east of the River South Esk, and south of the River Nile to its junction with the South Esk.

The Municipality of Campbell Town.

The Municipality of Ross.

No. 2 CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICT.

The Municipalities of Hamilton and Bothwell.

Gazetted 8th June, 1874.

No. 3 CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICT:

The Rural Municipality of Fingal.

Gazetted 12th January, 1875.

No. 4 CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICT.

The Rural Municipality of Glamorgan.

Gazetted 30th March, 1875.

No. 5 CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICT.

The Rural Municipality of Oatlands.

Gazetted 13th April, 1875.

No. 6 CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Municipality of Evandale lying to the north of the Rivers South Esk and Nile respectively.

Gazetted 6th April, 1875.

No. 7 CLEAN SHEEP DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Municipality of Green Ponds lying to the north west of the following described line :—

Commencing at the south angle of a grant to Peter Murdoch and extending along that grant and along a grant to F. Reynolds and W. Hodgson to the River Jordan, by that river southerly after crossing the same to a grant to Andrew Reid, thence along the north-west boundary of that grant along land purchased by B. Smith and a north-easterly line to the south angle of Lot 451 purchased by John Jones, by the south-east boundary of that lot, by the south-east boundary of grants to W. M. Orr and E. Bisdee, part of the south-west and south-east boundaries of a location to T. F. Gorringer, by part of south-west and south-east boundaries of another location to T. F. Gorringer to the Green Ponds Rivulet, by that rivulet north-westerly to the west angle of a grant to Thomas Ransom, by the north-west and north-east boundaries of a location to W. Whitechurch, the west boundary of Lot 24 purchased by Joseph Johnson, and thence by a due easterly line to the eastern boundary of the aforesaid Municipality of Green Ponds.
