#### A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the National Trust Preservation Fund (Winding-up) Act 1999

Be it enacted by Her Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

#### 1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the *National Trust Preservation Fund (Winding-up) Amendment Act* 2016.

#### 2. Commencement

This Act commences on the day on which this Act receives the Royal Assent.

### 3. Principal Act

In this Act, the *National Trust Preservation* Fund (Winding-up) Act 1999\* is referred to as the Principal Act.

## 4. Section 3 amended (Interpretation)

Section 3 of the Principal Act is amended as follows:

(a) by inserting the following definition after the definition of *Heritage Fund*:

planning scheme means a planning scheme within the meaning of the Land Use Planning and Approvals Act 1993;

(b) by omitting the definition of *National Trust*.

#### 5. Section 5 amended (Distribution of funds)

Section 5(3) of the Principal Act is amended as follows:

- (a) by omitting "an entry in" and substituting "places in the city of Hobart that are";
- (b) by omitting paragraphs (a) and (b) and substituting the following paragraphs:

- (a) heritage listed under a planning scheme in effect in that city; or
- (b) entered in the Tasmanian Heritage Register.

# 6. Repeal of Act

This Act is repealed on the three hundred and sixty fifth day from the day on which it commences.
