

PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL UNDER THE SUPERANNUATION ACT.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



ORDERS of the Governor in Council under "The Superannuation Act" made since the last meeting of Parliament.

MONDAY, JANUARY 3, 1888.

MINUTE No. 4.

The Governor approves that in calculating the amount of Pension to which any Civil Servant may be entitled whose emoluments include quarters, or a money allowance in lieu of quarters, one-sixth of the average salary during the three years preceding retirement be reckoned as the value of such emolument, in accordance with the established practice of the Imperial Government.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 1888.

MINUTE No. 68.

His Excellency grants a Retiring Allowance to Mrs. Edgecombe as a Female Assistant under the Board of Education.

To take effect from 1st February instant, and to be provided for by Supplementary Estimate.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 1888.

MINUTE No. 93.

His Excellency grants to Richard Walsh, Office-keeper and Messenger, Executive Council, and Messenger to the Law Officers, under the 5th Section of "The Superannuation Act," (24 Vict. No. 15), in consequence of the abolition of the office of Office-keeper, Executive Council, a Retiring Allowance at the rate of £111 8s. 8d. per annum.

To take effect on 1st March next, and to be placed upon a Supplementary Estimate.

THURSDAY, APRIL 12, 1888.

MINUTE No. 176.

The Governor grants to Mr. Christopher Spotswood, Chief and Bench Clerk, Police Office, Launceston, a Retiring Allowance at the rate of £125 per annum.

To take effect on 1st January last; the amount to be placed upon a Supplementary Estimate.

MONDAY, APRIL 23, 1888.

MINUTE No. 192.

His Excellency grants to Mrs. Charlotte M'Ginniss, Teacher, State School, Nugent, a Retiring Allowance at the rate of £34 1s. 8d. per annum, from 1st June next.
