#### RE GUARANTEE.

Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company, Limited, General Manager's Office, Hobart, 14th October, 1889.

SIR.

I have the honor to forward you herewith an Abstract of the Traffic Receipts and Expenditure of the Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company, Limited, so far as it can be made up in this Colony, for the quarter ending the 30th ultimo.

The large increase in expenses is due to our having received the greater part of twelve months' supply of permanent way material during the quarter.

I also enclose an account of the amount now due from the Government to the Company, of which the full guaranteed interest of £8125 is payable on the past quarter—the balance of the Account consisting of items of which an Account was rendered to you on the 21st August last. I beg to request that the amount due may be paid to the Company in accordance with the terms of the Contract.

It is with much regret I notice, by your letter of the 9th instant, that the Government refuse to recognise the Company's claim for £11,345 19s. 1d., the more especially as it is rendered in accordance with the Judgment of the Supreme Court of this Colony, after a very costly and exhaustive trial and subsequent appeal.

The Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company, Limited, have certainly had a just cause for complaint against the Government, in that not only are they improperly kept out of the payments due to them, but they are put to an enormous expense, which they have been unable to recover on taxation of costs, in substantiating their contract demands.

I also enclose, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, a statement showing the balance of Profit and Loss on the year 1889, from which it would appear that the result of the year's operations is a loss to the Company of the sum of £34,357 ls. 6d.

The Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company, Limited, are therefore entitled to receive the whole subsidy guaranteed, of which the quarterly proportion is £8125, and for which an account is

herewith rendered; together with a statement of the whole amount due to the Company, being £19,634 8s. 9d., and respecting which, in your letter of the 2nd November last, you informed me that you proposed to pay some of the items.

I should be greatly obliged if you would do this forthwith, because the progress of the suit instituted by the Company against the Government to have the contract properly declared has been impeded, and still is kept back waiting for your final action on this matter.



SIR.

I have the honor to inform you that the Accounts of the Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company, Limited, for the year ending 31st December, 1889, have been examined, and to submit my Report thereon for the information of the Government.

The total Receipts credited to Revenue Account amounted to £81,658 0s. 5d., showing an increase over the previous year of £5563 12s. 2d.,—the average receipts per train mile being 4s.  $2 \cdot 9d$ . as compared with 3s.  $10 \cdot 8d$ . for 1888; the total train miles for 1889 having been 384,899, and for 1888, 390,226.

The Expenditure debited to Revenue Account in the Company's books amounted to £81,587 11s. 5d., having largely increased as compared with that for 1888,—the increase being £9621 8s. 0d.,—leaving, according to the Company's account, a small profit of £70 9s. 0d., which would, according to the custom hitherto adopted, be available for reduction of the guaranteed interest payable by the Government to the Company; but this profit would be increased by the disallowance of expenditure incurred during the year for new works, which have been considered by the Government as chargeable to capital, as hereafter explained.

The increase in Locomotive Charges is due to the cost of a new engine, about £2600, (replacing one worn out), and partly to an increase in the cost of ordinary repairs, about £2000,—the difference being made up by larger credit for sale of material than in 1888, to the extent of about £1700. The increase in Carriage and Wagon Charges is due to the further renewal of

Stock to replace a reduction in former years. No doubt improved and more costly carriages have been substituted for those gone out of use; but, following the principle adopted hitherto, the increased cost for better material has not been considered as an element for reduction of the guaranteed interest. The increase in Miscellaneous Charges is due to expenses incurred in law and other charges. The decrease in Permanent Way Charges is caused in part by increased credits for sales of material, &c. of over £1200, and partly by a reduction in 1889 in this class of expenditure, that for 1888 having been unusually high (over £4000 in excess of the amount for 1887). The increase in the General Charges, London, is mainly due to an increased estimate, and to an adjustment of the expenditure for 1888 charged to 1889 account, explained as follows:—

The item "Trustees' remuneration" has not been considered a proper charge to revenue.

The sum of £43 ls. appears in the London account for "Weekly Wages," but no vouchers have been supplied for the amount. The Accountant has explained that it has been disbursed in small payments to "caretaker, cleaner, &c."

The Engineer-in-Chief reports (Appendix A.) that the cost of new works, not being renewals, constructed during the year amounted to £2060; but some uncertainty as to an item, £1500, for expenditure in additional bridging at Clarendon, consequent upon replacement and alteration necessary through damage caused by floods, having been expressed by Mr. Fincham as to whether this may not be considered a renewal, and, looking at the fact that improvements on the railway, although introduced at a greater expense than for former works or material, which secure greater safety and comfort to the public, have on former occasions been allowed by the Government as renewals, I think it advisable to exclude the amount from the statement of the sum available for reduction of guaranteed interest, and, following the usual custom, I now give the amount of £709 4s. as so available; viz.—
