



REPORT OF EXAMINERS.

Hobart, 29th June, 1891.

THE Examiners present their Report on the Annual Examination for Exhibitions from State Schools, which was held at Hobart and Launceston on the 23rd, 24th, and 25th instant.

Twenty-four candidates were examined—seventeen boys and seven girls.

Reading.—A few of the candidates read deliberately, distinctly, and with force and expression; but they were the exceptions. A large proportion of the reading was more or less hasty, and, consequently, indistinct and inaccurate.

Writing and Spelling from Dictation.—The writing, taken as a whole, was very fair. A few of the candidates lost marks heavily on account of defective spelling.

Arithmetic.—Some excellent work was shown up under this head, and as the paper was one which fully tested the capabilities of candidates, the results must, on the whole, be considered satisfactory.

Grammar.—The results generally in this subject were good. Only four of the candidates fell below half marks.

Geography.—The work in Geography was fair on the whole, the average of marks exceeding half the maximum. The answering of several of the candidates wanting in explicitness.

History.—The marks on the average are low, though one of the candidates did very well, and nine others passably. A high average, however, is not to be expected from children under twelve in a subject of such wide range as this.

General Questions.—The marks obtained this year were not on the average so high as those of last year; but this arose evidently from want rather of thought than of knowledge. Many of the papers gave evidence of undue haste, and some of them showed clearly that the writers could have done much better had they taken more time for consideration.
