SIR,

The several statements setting forth the transactions of the Treasury for the year 1900 were received at the Audit Department for examination on various dates between the 30th April and 14th May last—These were examined, and passed on the 16th May, the accounts being well and carefully kept. They are now returned accompanied by my Report, as directed by the provisions of Section 26 of "The Audit Act, 1888."

#### CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND ACCOUNT.

#### REVENUE.

1. The Revenue from all sources received and placed to the credit of the several heads during the year 1900 amounted to £1,054,980 7s. 11d., this being the largest amount of Revenue ever collected in Tasmania in any one year, £14,873 7s. 11d. above the estimate of the Honourable the Treasurer made on the 18th July last, and £111,009 19s. 4d. in excess of the Revenue for 1899.

The following table shows the amount received under each Head of Revenue, as compared with that received during the preceding year:—

The principal increases in the above table are thus explained:

Customs Revenue.—The increases were, for Hobart, nearly £11,000; Launceston, over £24,000; Burnie, over £3500; Strahan, over £2000; Devonport, over £500; while small decreases were shown for the ports of Stanley and Ulverstone.

Land Tax.—The large increase shown was caused by the non-completion of the Assessment Rolls in 1899, and the consequent collection in the year 1900 of the greater part of the amount due in the first-mentioned year.

Inland Revenue.—Increases are shown for sale of Postage Stamps, and Stamp Duties collected at the Post Office, over £5000; Stamp Duties collected by Departments, over £4000; Publicans' Licences, over £1000; Fees of Departments, nearly £1000; Reimbursements, about £1000. Smaller increases under various other items of Inland Revenue total over £2000, while the following exhibit decreases:—Probate Duties, nearly £6000; Unclaimed Intestate Estates, over £1000.

The increase under the head of *Income Tax* is due to the larger amount paid in dividends during 1900; and that under the head of *Railway Revenue* is due almost entirely to ordinary expansion of traffic. The railway accounts show the increase for coaching traffic as £3783, and for Goods, &c., traffic as £6017, or a total increase of £9800. Practically, the only head of decrease was that of *Territorial Revenue*, and this is explained by the falling off in the receipts for Rent and Fees received under "The Mining Act, 1893," and for Fees for Surveys, which together showed a decrease of over £5000, while the rent of ordinary Crown Land showed an increase of upwards of £1600, small increases on several other items accounting for the balance.

#### CROWN LANDS INSTALMENTS AND RENTS OUTSTANDING.

2. The detailed Returns of arrears of Instalments and Rents to the 31st December, 1900, received from the Secretary for Lands, &c., have been audited. These show that the amounts due were for—

In addition, the interest due on postponed Instalments was £483 5s. 3d. The amount owing in Instalments and Rents is less by nearly £5500 than that owing at the end of the year 1899, and the amount due for Interest is less by nearly £330. Since the end of the year 1895 these arrears have been reduced from nearly £50,000 to about £23,500 by the action of the Department of Lands and Surveys, and the result must be considered as highly satisfactory.

#### SEMI-PUBLIC AND PRIVATE BILLS.

3. This subject has been referred to in previous Annual Reports, and further communications were forwarded to the Treasury on the 26th October and 1st November last, asking whether there had been produced to the Government Printer the Under Treasurer's certificate of the payment of £50 to the credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund in the case of each of the Semi-public and Private Bills mentioned below, and which appeared to have been printed and dealt with by the House of Assembly during the then present Session; and if no such certificate had been signed, an explanation, to be

obtained from the Government Printer, was requested as to why the provisions of Nos. 413 and 423A of the Standing Orders of the House of Assembly had not been observed:—

The Honourable the Treasurer replied that the practice could not well be stopped that Session; and that it began with suspension of the Standing Orders in regard to certain Bills, and then year by year it became the habit to ignore the Standing Orders, and that the Government hoped to enforce a more regular and orderly procedure next Session.

#### TREASURY BILLS IN AID OF REVENUE.

4. At the end of 1899 the amount of £50,000 of these Treasury Bills, issued under Act 57 Vict. No. 40, was outstanding. The whole of these matured during 1900, when the sum of £2600 was paid off, and the balance of £47,400 was paid off early this year.

#### LOCAL INSCRIBED STOCK IN AID OF REVENUE.

5. The balance of this Stock outstanding at the end of the year 1899 amounted to £91,726 15s. 10d. The whole amount matured, and was paid off, during the past year, no new Stock having been authorised or raised.

#### RECORDS DESTROYED BY FIRE.

6. Upon a visit of inspection being paid to East Devonport in December last, it was found that the Records of collections contained in the Police Clerk's Licence Books, for a period of ten months, and the Registrar's Records and Processes, for a period of eighteen months, had been destroyed in the fire which had previously burnt down the Court House. The complete audit of the accounts of the Police Clerk and Registrar was, therefore, impossible. The Hon. the Attorney-General forwarded for perusal the report of the Superintendent of Police, and a report on the inquest held by the Coroner, and the Minister expressed his satisfaction that there were no suspicions resting on any official.

#### CASE OF DEFAULT.

7. No cases of default in accounting for public money came under notice during the year 1900; but during the current year an investigation by the Railway Department of the accounts of the porter in charge at Apsley, disclosed a deficiency of £122 2s. 6d., a large number of items appearing in his returns as "outstanding" having been found to have been paid. He admitted that he had appropriated the money for his own use. Steps are being taken with a view to recovery of £100, the amount for which the porter in charge was assured, and it is understood a warrant was issued for his arrest, but the police were not able to execute it.

#### EXPENDITURE.

8. The Expenditure chargeable to Consolidated Revenue for the year 1900 was £923,731 ls., being £10,639 l2s. 3d. less than the amount authorised by the various Appropriation Acts. The amounts in the cases where excesses arose over the sums authorised total £14,699 9s. 2d., and those of cases where the sums were less than those authorised total £25,339 ls. 5d. The particulars of the items over and under the authorised amounts are shown in the accompanying Treasury Comparative Statement, No. 3.

The 1900 Expenditure was greater than that of 1899 (£871,453 10s. 4d.) by £52,277 10s. 8d., which sum was £58,732 8s. 8d. less than the increased Revenue; but the latter was affected, as already explained, by the Land Tax collections in 1900 including large arrears of the year 1899, owing to the non-completion of the 1899 Rolls.

#### MILITARY CONTINGENTS.

9. The premiums of assurance on the lives of two officers and forty-four men of the Tasmanian Bushmen Contingent, which served in South Africa, have been paid during the current year, all, with the exception of one officer, being assured to the 5th September next. The majority of the men, however, have since returned to Tasmania.

Nine members of the first Contingent, and one member of the Bushmen Contingent, are deceased. £500 has been paid into the Treasury, and £200 remains to be recovered from the Assurance Company, both under policies assuring the lives of seven of the deceased men; and £300 has been provided under authorities of the Governor in Council for the representatives of three men whose lives were not assured. £400 has been paid away by the Treasury, and this amount, together with any further payments under this head, should be placed on Supplementary Estimates for voting by Parliament.

The pay due to members of Contingents whilst absent, and which had been banked, under orders issued to the Under Secretary, has been handed over to claimants, with the exception of a sum of £302 11s. 5d., which remains to the credit of men who have not yet returned. This account is made up to the 20th instant. Returns in connection with these moneys have been rendered to and audited by this Department from time to time.

The appended Treasury Balance-sheet shows an amount of £9654 12s. 2d. under the head of "Imperial Australian Contingent Suspense Account." Of this sum £9604 2s. 5d. has been paid over by the Imperial Government, the balance, £50 9s. 9d., awaiting insertion in a claim to be made for expenditure since incurred in connection with Imperial Contingents.

EXPENDITURE ON CONSOLIDATED REVENUE ACCOUNT, &c., REQUIRING PARLIAMENTARY PROVISION.

10. The expenditure incurred by authority of the Governor in Council, under the provisions of Regulation No. 19 of the Audit Act, for the year 1900, amounted to £15.393 8s. 7d chargeable to Consolidated Revenue, being, for lapsed votes and arrears, £315 3s. 8d.; and for excesses on votes, and new expenditure, £15,078 4s. 11d. The sum of £4 5s. 6d. was similarly authorised for sundry public works.

The particulars of this Expenditure appear in the appendix, which Expenditure requires to be authorised by Parliament.

## SURPLUS REVENUE, &c.

11. The Surplus Revenue on Consolidated Revenue Account for 1900 amounted to £131,249 6s. 11d., and the Debit Balance remaining at the end of the year was £52,555 11s. 4d., made up as follows:—

There were no Deficiency Bills or Stock outstanding against this Debit Balance, the whole of those previously issued and charged against Revenue Account having matured, and no further issue of any such securities has been authorised by Parliament.

Expenditure on Roads under Waste Lands and Crown Lands Acts.

12. It was shown in last year's Report that the fund provided for this expenditure was largely overdrawn. Since then Stock has been issued for the sum of £20,000, and this amount was credited to the account, which showed at the 31st December last, as may be seen by the Treasury Balance Sheet, a credit of £2601 0s. 7d. available for expenditure under the several Acts. Since the end of the year, however, this credit has been cancelled by subsequent expenditure, and the account is now overdrawn to an amount of over £2000. Further issues of Stock or Debentures are required to place the account in funds.

In accordance with the arrangement previously reported, the Public Works Department has again furnished an elaborate statement showing the amounts available, appropriated, and expended in the various Crown Lands Districts and Parishes. This statement has been examined and checked. The amounts in certain districts found to have been appropriated in excess of available amounts total £11,036, the actual excess expenditure in such cases being £4356; but against this there are still a large number of unappropriated and unexpended balances to the credit of other districts. The excess expenditure has been reduced by more than £400 as compared with the previous year, and the Crown Lands Districts showing excesses have been reduced from 21 to 18, and it is stated that a further reduction will, under the present system, take place during the current year.

In the last Annual Report attention was drawn to the power of the Public Works Department to widen the arbitrary or artificial boundaries of districts, and to amalgamate districts, making it impossible or difficult to find if appropriations or expenditure exceed available amounts, and suggestions were made with a view to improving the legislation on this subject.

#### Loans requiring Parliamentary Sanction.

13. Of the Loans granted by the Hon. the Treasurer without Parliamentary sanction, and which were reported last year, those to the Trustees of the Zeehan, St. Marys, and Fingal Public Cemeteries were authorised by Act 64 Vict. No. 33. The following, however, still await statutory authority:—

#### COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.—EXPENDITURE.

19. The Hon. the Minister of Lands and Works, under date 11th March, 1901, authorised the undermentioned votes to be expended under the direction of the Hon. the Treasurer:—

Upon the question being raised as to the legality of the expenditure of State moneys upon works which had passed to the control of the Commonwealth, the Hon. the Treasurer forwarded a copy of a letter which had been received from the Treasurer of the Commonwealth, which reads as follows:—

The Treasury,
Melbourne, 27th February, 1901.

Sir,

WITH regard to Loan expenditure for works in course of construction in connection with Departments of Defence and Posts and Telegraphs, it is, I think, advisable that the States should complete the works, charging their own loan funds, and that the amount expended be taken into consideration when the value of the property handed over to the Commonwealth is assessed. I may also state that the Prime Minister concurs in this course being taken.

Should, however, this not meet with your concurrence, further expenditure may be paid out of the Commonwealth Consolidated Revenue Fund; but as the Commonwealth has no loan moneys on hand, the result would be that a less amount would be returned to the State at the end of the month than would otherwise be the case; so that the Revenue of the State would be affected.

In forwarding this communication the Hon. the Treasurer writes that it has been arranged by communication between the Federal Treasurer and the State Government that authorised Loan expenditure in connection with the transferred departments shall be continued by the State, and charged, as hitherto, against the Loan funds, the amount of all such expenditure being eventually included in the value placed upon all the property transferred to the Commonwealth.

With the exception of £72 1s. 11d. cash in Commercial Bank, the above balance was invested in Government Securities. These Securities have been examined, and the whole account audited as usual.

The sum of £15,822 1s. 9d. was paid in 1900 by the Treasury in Pensions, out of the £16,000 advanced as above, the unexpended balance, £177 18s. 3d., having been since repaid to the Sinking Fund. For Reserves under the Waste Lands and Crown Lands Acts there was, at the end of 1900, £9672 13s. 7d., and for moiety of rentals and

profit on working under the Mount Cameron Water Race Act, £723 9s. 6d., due to the Sinking Fund. These amounts have also since been paid over by the Treasury. The addition of these amounts would increase the balance of the Fund as at the end of 1900 to £180,120 9s. 10d.

Excluding the adjustments mentioned, the aggregate credits made to the Fund amounted to £516,261 16s., and the charges £346,715 7s. 6d., leaving the balance at the end of the year £169,546 8s. 6d., as shown in the above table.

The inspected securities consisted of £306 in Fixed Deposits and Local Inscribed Stock, £56 being due to the Treasury.

The provisions of Section 2 of "The Police Regulation Amendment Act, 1900," 64 Vict. No. 18, require that if there shall be standing to the credit of the Reward Branch of the Police Provident Fund, a sum in excess of £250, then such excess shall, from time to time, be transferred to the Superannuation Branch of the Fund. In accordance with these provisions, the sum of £1044 3s. 2d. was transferred as shown above, resulting, with the addition of forfeitures, to the substantial addition of 17s. 7d. nearly, for every £1 contributed during the year by the members then remaining in the Fund, and in addition, from the interest earned, a sum of  $5\frac{3}{8}d$ ., nearly, was distributed for every £1 standing to the credit of members at the end of the year. These forfeited altogether £93 1s. 2d., which amount, in accordance with the Regulations, was distributed among the remaining members; 5 other members resigned and received their amounts in full, totalling in all £551 16s. 3d. Of these 4 had served in the force for over 18 years, and 1 left Tasmania for South Africa.

# RAILWAY REWARD FUND.

27. The accounts of this Fund, which is managed by Commissioners appointed under Section 62 of "The Railway Management Act, 1891," 55 Vict. No. 40, has been examined and passed to the end of the year 1900. The transactions for the year were:—

The Interest earned on the investments of the Fox and Dexter Bequests was £31 15s. 9d. and £13 11s. 10d. respectively. These sums were duly paid over to the various Institutions entitled to them. The capital of the Fox Bequest was invested—£500 in Local Inscribed Stock, and £300 at Fixed Deposit, or £800 in all; and that of the Dexter Bequest, £447 4s. 11d., was invested at Fixed Deposit.

No additional Loans were raised under this head during the year 1900, nor were any paid off. In last year's Report an amount of £380 6s. 11d. was shown to credit of the Sinking Fund formed in connection with a Loan of £2000 paid off by the Devonport Town Board in the year 1899. This amount was increased to £383 9s., when it was paid over to the Board towards redemption of £400, part of the £2000 Loan, the balance, namely £1600, having been renewed and raised under the Local Public Works Loans Act.

By the Act No. 34 of last Session the Treasurer was authorised to invest any money forming part of any Sinking Fund under the Local Bodies Loans Act on fixed deposit at interest in any bank in Tasmania. This provision disposes of the objection referred to for a number of years in these Annual Reports.

A further sum of £40,350 was authorised under Act 64 Vict. No. 75, to be raised for Loans to Local Bodies under the provisions of the Local Public Works Loans Act, but none of this Stock was issued before the end of the year, the Act being assented to on 31st December last only.

The Glenorchy Water Trust has increased its indebtedness for interest during the year by £235, the amount owing under this head being £1782 8s., at the 1st January last. Of this sum, £1135 18s. 5d. is due to the Consolidated Revenue, and £646 9s. 7d. to Sinking Fund.

The St. Helens Water Trust has further increased its indebtedness for interest by £5, three years' interest, namely £15, being due on 1st January last.

The Ross Municipality owed £30 under this head at the commencement of the current year.

## ACCOUNTS OF PUBLIC BODIES.

# HOBART CORPORATION.

32. Arrears of Rates, Rents, &c.—Among the amounts outstanding for Rates and Rents and for services rendered, due to the Hobert Corporation, are several which it is thought should have been long ago collected. An amount of £25 15s. 6d. due on the Theatre Royal was wrongly remitted in 1897, and has been previously referred to. The Mayor now writes that these Rates have been applied for, and the reply given was, that the amounts were remitted by the Council, therefore the Council must bear the loss, and it is suggested that they be now written off. With respect to some of the other, amounts, it is promised they will be pressed for; some accounts await adjustment, and several have been handed to the solicitor for recovery.

General Account.—As the Accounts for the year 1900 included charges for expenses incurred in forwarding a telegram to the Tasmanian Contingent in South Africa, hire of vehicles, &c., for reception of Troops, and for the funeral of a deceased Alderman, the items were questioned, and the replies not being considered satisfactory, the Certificate to the Annual Statement of Accounts was qualified accordingly.

Water Account.—Among the matters dealt with in last year's accounts was a long-standing question relative to the non-payment of water dues by the Cricket Association for water supplied and used during several years. It transpired that the

land and property were not included in the Roll of the District in which these are situated. An opinion obtained from the Solicitor-General was forwarded to the Corporation for information, and with an expression of the necessity for the property being placed upon the Assessment Roll, in order that the dues may be collected. The reply received was, that the matter was under consideration.

The Water Supply, or Loan, Account, was charged with several amounts paid for refreshments, hire of drags, &c., and as these appeared unusually large charges, explanation was sought, the reply being that these were charges in connection with taking Members of Parliament, Aldermen, and officials to the North-West Bay Rivulet, with a view to placing them in possession, with full particulars, of what was desired by the Municipal Council from the Parliament. This reply was printed with the Certificate to the Annual Accounts.

Cab Hire.—A question has recently arisen with respect to the expenditure of a sum of £3 10s., for the hire of two cabs to convey men from the Waterworks, to enable them to record their votes at the last Annual Municipal Election. The amount was entered upon Waterworks paysheets; but apart from this fact, the charge was objected to upon the ground that it was not one proper to be made against the Corporation funds. The Mayor justified the expense as one incurred "for the sole object of saving twice the amount to the ratepayers, which has been approved by the latter," and incidentally he questioned the right of the Auditor to interfere, "with any expenditure which has been shown was incurred in the interest of saving the ratepayers' money." His Worship was under the impression that the larger expense incurred in allowing men to lose their time was approved, while the smaller expense of providing conveyances was objected to. This, however, was not the case, but it was explained how difficult it is for the Auditor to deal with the one case as compared with that of the other where expense is incurred in providing cabs. The matter is one still open to be dealt with in considering the Annual Accounts, if the charge is allowed to remain on the Corporation books.

Balances of Accounts.—The General Account shows a substantial balance of £3355 1s. 8d. to Credit, but the Water Account shows a Dr. balance of £4656 7s. 3d. at the end of 1900, and it has been estimated that this Dr. balance will increase to over £8000 by the end of the current year. An additional rate, however, has been levied, and it is expected that the debit balance will disappear by the end of the year 1903.

The Debt of the Municipality at the end of the year amounted to £233,100 (exclusive of £1000 borrowed for private streets, and which remains on the accounts as an unexpended balance). Against this debt, the Sinking Fund showed investments, £21,200, and cash, £13 12s. 1d.—together £21,213 12s. 1d., of which £14,390 12s. 3d. stood to the credit of Water Account, and £6822 19s. 10d. to credit of General Account.

The accounts of the Corporation were, as usual, well kept and in good order, and the officers continue to render valuable assistance in the work of examination and audit.

## Launceston Corporation.

33. Arrears of Rates, Individual Accounts, &c. —A very large sum remained outstanding at the end of the year, but it is reported that a considerable reduction in these amounts was made during the year 1900. The sums due for work done, material supplied, &c., independent of the Rates and Electric Light dues, amounted to upwards of £1400. It was promised that steps would be at once taken to recover in all instances, and it was pointed out that in connection with the Water,

City Surveyor's, and Electric Light Departments, and deep drainage, the work carried out by the Council necessitates claims being made against almost every citizen, and the proportion of outstanding claims, consequently, cannot be considered as very great.

General Account.—A small charge for advertising in connection with the Patriotic Fund, and another for the cost of a wreath for a funeral, were objected to upon principle, as not being legitimate expenses against Corporation Account, and the Certificate to the Annual Accounts was qualified accordingly. An allowance to the Mayor to enable him to meet expenses in connection with the return of the Military Contingent from South Africa was sanctioned by the Corporation Act, as not exceeding the total legal allowance to the Mayor, and was therefore passed.

Balances of Account.—The General Account having been credited with £4200 borrowed for general purposes under Act 64 Vict. No. 50, showed a reduction of the Dr. balance from £3519 10s. 11d. to £321 15s. 9d., the Water Account had been credited with £2000 borrowed under Act 64 Vict. No. 31, and this assisted in changing a Dr. balance of £928 14s. 9d. to a Cr. balance of £621 12s. 4d.; several other accounts show Dr. balances which require adjustment. The Electric Lighting Maintenance Account reduced its debit balance by over £500 during the year, and may be considered to be in a fairly satisfactory position.

The Debt of the Municipality at the end of 1900 amounted to £281,152 7s. 9d., against which the Sinking Fund, managed by Commissioners, amounted to £27,744 3s. 6d., the Private Streets Loan Sinking Fund amounted to £279 13s. 10d., and the Electric Light Loan Sinking Fund amounted to £2196 18s. 9d., £750 was due to the Commissioners' Sinking Fund, and the Treasury held a Sinking Fund amounting to £2169 3s. 7d., and to this £175 has since been added—a total to credit of Sinking Funds of £33,314 19s. 8d.

The accounts of this Corporation, also, continued to be in good order, and were well kept; the Stores accounts, particularly, necessitated a large expenditure of the time of audit clerks and inspectors, but the officers of the Corporation, as usual, assisted, and much facilitated this work.

## HOBART MARINE BOARD.

34. Hire of Cabs.—Although, as recorded in last year's Report, the Honourable the Attorney-General had given an opinion that the Auditor-General should not allow payments for the hire of cabs for attendance at the funerals of officials and of public men to be charged against the Marine Board funds, an expense of £2 5s. for the hire of three landaus was so charged by the Board in last year's accounts for attendance at the funeral of a deceased pilot. After some correspondence on the subject, the Board consented to the amount being omitted from the published Accounts, with the view to legislation on the subject.

36. Expenditure for Patriotic Purposes.—The following amounts were struck out from annual accounts for expenses in connection with Advertising, Rent, Presentation of Address, Demonstrations, &c., for Patriotic purposes:—

Town Boards.—Queenstown, £1 7s.; Strahan, 10s.; Zeehan, £1 13s. 6d.

The Hon. the Attorney-General has ruled that such expenditure is illegal.

Iravelling Expenses, Horse Hire, Refreshments, &c.—The following amounts were disallowed under this head:—

Road Trusts.—Boobyalla, £3 19s.; Chudleigh, £1 9s. 6d; Esperance, 12s. 6d.; Deloraine, £6.; Gould's Country, £5 3s. 6d.; Leven, £1 13s.; Midhurst, £10 10s.; Ringarooma, £1 16s.; Railton, £1 2s.; Tankerville, 10s.

In June, 1899, a copy of a circular was sent to each Road Trust, covering an opinion of the Hon. the Attorney-General that there was nothing in the Roads Act warranting Trustees recouping themselves for travelling expenses, and stating that under this ruling all such claims would in future be disallowed. The question was discussed in Parliament last Session, and a proposal to allow certain charges for refreshments and travelling expenses was rejected. It became, therefore, necessary to disallow all such expenses where Trusts continued to charge them. In the performance of this duty some opposition has been met with, Trustees in several instances considering the enforcement of the decision a hardship. The Ringarooma Road Trustees who drew expenses have refused to refund them, and the Chairman has been called upon to recover them.

# ASSESSMENT ROLLS.

37. A number of the Road Trusts alter the Rolls, for various reasons, without the sanction of the Local Authority, required by the Assessment Act. Much trouble is given in this matter, the Trustees appearing to be unacquainted with the provisions of the Act.

# FEES AND FINES.

38. The provisions of "The Magistrates Summary Procedure Act, 1899," 63 Vict. No. 27, require, that in cases of offences committed within any Police District other than a Rural Municipality, the fines, penalties, and fees shall be paid to the Treasurer on account of the Consolidated Revenue Fund. These provisions had the effect of diverting income previously received under this head from the City Municipalities, Town Boards, Fruit Boards, and other local bodies, to the Treasury. In reply to a memorandum from the Audit Department, the Hon. the Attorney-General writes that it is his intention to have a Bill prepared authorising the payment of penalties and fines to the Fruit Boards from 1900, and amending the law in the direction of exempting Fruit Boards and, probably, other bodies, from the provisions of the Act.

# ACCOUNTS OF PUBLIC BODIES EXAMINED AND PASSED.

39. In addition to the accounts of the City Corporations specially referred to, and those of various Trust Funds, and other accounts mentioned throughout this Report, the following have been specially examined and passed during the year:—

Accounts of Rural Municipalities, 19; Road Trusts, 97; Main Road Boards, 53; Town Boards, 20; Marine Boards and Light-house Fund, 8; Cemetery Trusts, 27; Water Trusts, 10; Miscellaneons, 14. Total, 248.

The Miscellaneous Accounts included those of the Tasmanian Public Library, Tasmanian University, General Hospitals, Metropolitan Drainage Board, Queen's Domain Committee, Fire Brigade Boards, &c.

#### ACCOUNTS NOT YET PASSED.

40. The following Local Bodies' Accounts have not been passed:-

Esperance Road Trust.—The General Abstract of Accounts has not yet been signed, although twice prepared and forwarded for that purpose.\*

Dorset Road Irust .- Statement of Accounts not yet signed.\*

Southport Road Irust.—Accounts not yet complete.\*

Branxholm Cemetery Irust.—Accounts not yet complete.

Glenora Cemetery Irust.—Accounts not yet received, though repeatedly applied for.

St. Helens Cemetery Irust.—Accounts not yet received, though repeatedly applied for.

Both the Southport and Dorset Road Trusts give much trouble by ignoring repeated applications for their Accounts, which are due early in the year. This happens year after year. The same may be said of some of the small Cemetery Trusts.

#### GRANTS IN AID OF RATES.

41. Two Grants in Aid of Road Rates were provided under Act 64 Vict. No. 40, namely, one of £8500, and one of £1500.

The claims under the firstmentioned Grant amounted to £10,318 7s. 3d., and those under the second, £1710 5s. 6d. A pro ratā reduction had therefore to be made, which resulted in the distribution of the following amounts for every 1s. raised by the Road Rates:—

The Bellerive and Glebe Town Town Boards appear to have overlooked the provisions of the Act dealing with the minimum rate required to be levied, and so failed to participate in the distribution.

The Esperance, Franklin, and Southport Road Trusts would have shared in both Grants, but their Accounts were not duly rendered. The Franklin Accounts were not received till May; the Southport\* Accounts, after many applications, have only just come to hand; and the Esperance\* Accounts are still waiting for the signed Statement to be forwarded.

Much correspondence has ensued in connection with the Esperance Road Trust In the first place, when some incomplete papers were sent in in the middle of March, the signed Statement required by the Act was not forwarded. the Accounts were examined, and towards the end of the month, a Statement was prepared in this Department, with certain items of expenditure objected to omitted, and sent for signature, most emphatic advice being given that non-completion would risk loss of subsidy. The statement was not signed. In addition to certain travelling expenses, the law-costs of a proceeding against one of the Trustees were disallowed, after advice had been sought from the Magistrate who tried the case, and on the ground that action was, apparently, improperly taken under the Act, as a charge against Road Trust funds. The Honourable the Treasurer personally investigated the matter, and laid the case before the Honourable the Attorney-General, who considered the Trust had acted in good faith, and these charges were then passed. ment, including this allowance, was forwarded for signature, but up to the present time it has not been returned.\*

## ACCOUNTS EXAMINED LOCALLY AT OFFICES AND STORES.

42. Visits of inspection were made by the Officers of the Audit Department, and Accounts locally examined during the year, to the number of 649; these consisted of the Accounts of Public Departments and Offices, 174; Post Offices, 131; State Schools, 16; Railway Stations, 23; Special Stores Accounts, 17; Local Bodies, 288. These figures include those connected with the taking of stock of stores at the Hospitals, Gaols, Charitable Institutions, Post and Telegraph Office, Railway and Defence Departments, Hobart and Launceston Corporations, Bonding Warehouses, Gunpowder Magazines, &c., the stock and accounts of which were again found in a generally satisfactory condition.

## THE EMU BAY RAILWAY COMPANY, LIMITED.

43. The construction accounts of this Company have been examined to the 28th February, 1901, the date of the last rendering of the Accounts. The amount passed, subject to the production of certain vouchers, and any future adjustment which may be found necessary, was, to the date mentioned, £319,723 5s. 9d. The Accounts, as rendered and examined, showed the following particulars:—

promised that when the line is inspected by a Government Engineer, a list of accomodation works will be obtained, similar to those obtained in connection with the Mount Lyell Railway. It is proposed to file this list, together with Valuation Rolls, and Plan, with Accounts in this Department for future reference.

The Accounts continue to be furnished in a complete and satisfactory condition.

# THE MOUNT LYELL AND STRAHAN RAILWAY.

44. No further accounts in connection with the construction of this Railway have been received since last Report, when it was shown that these had been examined up to 28th February, 1900, and that the amount of £180.627 1s. 7d. had been passed, subject to certain adjustments; and that the question of allowing the charge of £15,103 17s. 5d. for "Mixed Gauges" had also been raised. Since then it was ascertained the Company did not desire to include the expenditure under the head of "Mixed Gauges," and deducting £389 3s. 1d. legal expenses objected to on audit, the amount passed for Construction Work to the date mentioned was £180,237 18s. 6d., at which figure the account still stands in this Department.

In October last the Auditor-General visited the Line, and, with the Resident Government Engineer, was conducted over the Line by special train, a complete list of accommodation works being afterwards supplied. This list, together with the Plan showing approved positions of termini, and Valuation Rolls of the District, will be placed with the Accounts of the Railway in this Department for future reference.

The official date of opening has been advised as 2nd November, 1899. All new works of construction after that date will require to be approved by the Governor in Council.

The utmost courtesy and kindness was shown by the General Manager, Railway Manager, and other officers, in the endeavour to ascertain the extent and condition of construction works.

# THE NORTH MOUNT LYELL AND MACQUARIE HARBOUR RAILWAY.

45. The Construction Accounts of this Railway have been examined up to dates in June 1900, but they are not rendered in sequence as to dates, and the final period cannot be given. The total Construction Expenditure passed amounted to £173,809 2s. 3d. Accounts for Equipment were also examined to the amount of £4488 7s. 4d., but these are not a charge under the Act as a possibly prospective claim against the Government.

Further accounts have been received, but returned for adjustment. Information as to date of opening, approved positions of termini, and list of works, has been applied for, similar to that referred to in connection with other lines.

# THE GREAT WESTERN RAILWAY.

46. No Accounts have yet been submitted in connection with this Railway. The Company's Act provides that all vouchers for expenditure incurred by Promoters

in connection with the construction of the Railway are to be certified by the Supervising Officer of the Government. Information was requested some time since as to the appointment of the Supervising Officer, but no advice has yet been received.

# THE ZEEHAN ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER ACT, 1898.

47. The Accounts of the Projector under this Act were examined by the Auditor-General at Zeehan in October last, and Accounts passed amounting to £1812 16s. 3d. The deposit of £500 made by the Projector under the Act has been returned by the Treasury upon compliance by the Projector with certain conditions of the Act.

#### MISCELLANEOUS ACCOUNTS.

48. The Post and Telegraph and Defence Departments.—These Departments having passed over to the control of the Commonwealth Government, it is with pleasure that the Auditor-General testifies to the assistance rendered him, by the officers of those Departments, in connection with the duty of examining and inspecting accounts. The Post and Telegraph Department, which deals with so many details in connection with receipt of money, is in a most satisfactory condition, the accounts and books being well and systematically kept. The Customs Department Accounts were referred to favourably last year.

## MOUNT DUNDAS AND ZEEHAN RAILWAY.

- 49. This Railway, which is now owned by the Emu Bay Railway Company, has been maintained and worked by the Government Railway Department under an agreement concluded under the authority of Resolutions of Parliament, which are rendered legal by the Act of 63 Vict. The charge against the Company under this agreement amounts to £5 10s. per day, and all accounts were paid up to the end of April last, the date to which the last account had been rendered. The agreement under the Resolutions expired on 23rd December last; the line is, therefore, now being worked without sufficient parliamentary authority.
- 50. Railway Renewals Account.—The balance of this Account on the 31st December, 1900, was £8808 17s., a reduction in the year, of £6672 0s. 4d. An amount for "Renewals" has been placed on the 1901 Estimates, and a further amount, it is understood, will be placed upon the 1902 Estimates, sufficient, it is anticipated, to clear off this Account by the end of next year.
- 51. The Launceston and Western Railway Rights Purchase Act, 63 Vict. No. 52.—The sum of £25.000 voted under this Act was paid over to the Liquidators on the 1st of August last, the assignment and release having been duly executed and handed over by the Liquidators.
- 52. Tattersall's Consultations.—These Consultation accounts have been examined to 31st May, 1901, when the last of 159 Consultations conducted since the Audit Department commenced to check the accounts, was inspected. Of the total, 22 had been closed, and 137 were still open, the whole of the prize money in these cases not having been distributed. Omitting the two more recent Consultations, in which a few prizes only had been distributed, the unclaimed money in respect to the remaining 135 was £12,428 14s. 11d, or nearly £7000 less than at the same time in the previous

year, when there were 114 reported upon. Of the £19,009 17s. 6d. then outstanding, £14,582 19s. 9d. has been paid away, leaving £4426 17s. 9d. of that amount still unclaimed. This latter amount is included in the £12,428 14s. 11d. found unclaimed at 31st May last.

It is reported by the Audit Inspectors that holders of tickets entitled to prizes unclaimed have been advised to the "Melbourne Cup" last, and advices were being sent out to the end of 1900; also special efforts were being made by the Manager to reduce the amounts unpaid.

In addition to information already supplied, the Manager is now forwarding to this Department a balance-sheet, showing the proposed distribution of amounts of each Consultation, as soon as the sheets are printed.

To afford some idea of the work of examination of these accounts, the following list of the undistributed balances is appended, comparing the position of these against each Consultation, on the 31st May, 1900, and the 31st May, 1901:—

#### House of Assembly.

53. Hire of Cabs. - An expense for the hire of a landau for attendance at the funeral of a deceased Member of the House of Assembly was questioned, as it did not appear to be a proper charge against the vote debited, namely, "Incidental Expenses, including Catering." The Honourable the Speaker contended that the Parliamentary Privilege Act makes the Speaker, and not the Auditor-General, the judge as to whether carriages for official functions should be charged to public funds. It has been pointed out, however, that it is the Auditor-General's duty, under the Audit Act, to ascertain whether moneys charged to public accounts are legally available for, and applicable to, the service or purpose to which the same are charged, and he is required to surcharge the Treasurer with any amount which "it appears to the Auditor" has not been properly applied. The Honourable the Speaker's powers truly extend to the control of the moneys provided in the Estimates under the head of "Contingencies" voted for the House of Assembly, but the question raised is as to whether hire of cabs for funerals of public men is so provided. With the view of disposing of this question, the opinion of the Honourable the Attorney-General was sought, and he has fully endorsed the views of, and supported the position taken up by, the Auditor.

### DEPARTMENTAL.

54. Audit Act Amendment.—The desirableness of amending the existing Audit Act was referred to in the last annual Report. A Bill for the purpose has this Session been introduced, and when passed will prove of great advantage in connection with the operation of Governor's Warrants, form of accounts, repayments of revenue, local authorities' accounts, authorities of the Governor in Council, and other important matters.

An application for a Warrant for the payment of salaries on the 31st May last was at first not complied with, as not being in accordance with the Regulations under the Audit Act. However, upon it being pointed out by the Hon. the Treasurer that the arrangement had been made with the Bank to avoid the inconvenience of payment on Saturday, 1st June, and upon the Treasurer promising to provide for an amendment in the Act to allow of such payments in certain contingencies, the Warrant was prepared and submitted for His Excellency's signature.

55. Personal.—In order to provide for the audit of the accounts of Departments which had passed over to the Commonwealth, as well as for the preparation of Warrants and other such necessary work, the Auditor-General was appointed an Officer of the Commonwealth during the pleasure of His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. It is respectfully trusted that the acceptance of the position is approved by Parliament.

The Auditor-General has also been appointed a Commissioner of the Public Debts Sinking Fund, and the Government representative upon the Hobart Fire Brigade Board. These appointments, of course, do not carry increased remuneration.

56. General.—The officers of the Department have worked considerable overtime in order to keep the auditing well forward; the examination of Accounts specially referred to in the foregoing Report being, of course, additional to the ordinary

routine work of checking the Revenue and Expenditure of the Treasury and other Departments. Additional duties have been undertaken during the past year in connection with the collections made by the members of the Police Force; no less than 128 new and separate Returns being sent in for examination monthly.

I am glad to be able thus publicly to acknowledge the loyalty and ungrudging labour of the several officers.
