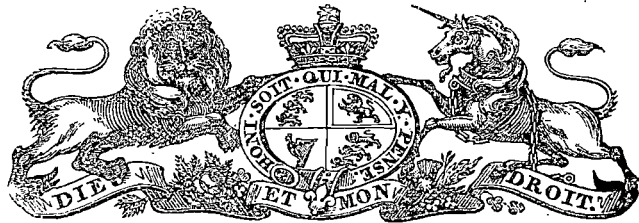

## CORRIGENDUM.

E. C. NOWELL : under column "Date of last Increase," *for* "January, 1883," *read* "none since first appointment;" the salaries for the two offices being the same in 1891 as they were on the establishment of the present form of Government in 1856. The sum of £100, which was assigned to this officer while discharging the duties of Government Statistician (1867-82), was taken from the stipend previously received by him as Clerk of the Legislative Council; and on his being relieved of those duties, the salary of the Clerk of the Legislative Council was restored to its original amount, as it stood in 1856. There was, therefore, in 1883, a re-arrangement of salary, but no increase on the whole.
