



WE have the honor to forward to you the Annual Report of St. Joseph's Orphanage and Industrial School for the year 1887. During the year there has been a great increase in the number admitted, not only from Government, but from parents and others who were desirous that children under their care should share in the advantages afforded by the Institution.

The friends of the Institution have proved, by continuing their subscriptions, that they appreciate the useful training which is given to the girls at the Orphanage.

There is still a heavy building debt; any surplus that remains when the household expenses are paid is appropriated to it. The money borrowed from the bank at 8 per cent. has been paid, kind friends lending the money at a much less rate.

The children had their usual trip to Brown's River, and feasts were given to them by Dean Woods and other kind friends.
