

REPORT OF THE CHIEF INSPECTOR OF SHEEP.

Inspector of Sheep Office, Hobart Town, 31st July, 1876.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to submit the following Report upon the working of the Scab Act, and the condition of Sheep in Tasmania during the years 1875-6 to this date.

Although I cannot report a further diminution of the number of infected Sheep in the Colony, I am glad to say that the area in which disease or infection exists has been very much reduced; and several districts on the North Coast, as well as in the South, where disease existed 12 months ago, may now be pronounced clean, although I do not think it advisable to have that done formally until after next shearing season. I may observe that the reduction of area in which disease exists is of more importance than the diminution in numbers of Sheep under licence at the stage we have now arrived at in freeing the Island from Scab. I feel constrained, however, to say that I am not altogether satisfied with the amount of progress towards complete eradication attained during the last twelve months. At the same time I am bound to state, in justice to Inspectors, that quite as much, if not more, has been effected than I could have anticipated with the curtailed powers under the Consolidated Act of 1875.

If the powers which existed under the former Scab Acts, and the fixed minimum penalties, had been maintained, I have no hesitation in saying that, instead of now reporting a diminution of infection as regards country, I should have been in a position to report the Colony clean, with the exception of the possibility of stragglers existing in the ranges and unoccupied country.

The abolition of the power to destroy diseased and infected sheep in certain cases has, I think, tended to tempt a small class of dealing Sheepowners to remove visibly diseased sheep from lots intended for sale at auction, and run the risk of detection. To this source nearly all the cases of re-infection are traceable, although not so conclusively as to ensure a conviction of the offending parties.

There is another source of infection to which I think several cases that have arisen during the last year may reasonably be attributed; and that is, to shearers having shorn infected sheep afterwards passing into other sheds without proper precautions being enforced by the sheepowner to secure the disinfection of the shears and clothing of the shearers. In support of this opinion I may quote from the Report of the Chief Inspector of Sheep, Hawkes Bay, New Zealand, for 1875. That gentleman, in recording his satisfaction at the sheep of the Province of Hawkes Bay being free from disease, refers to the risks of infection from shearers as follows:—"A serious risk of Scab being communicated to a flock in this province was incurred during the past shearing by taking on a shearer from a scabby shed of a neighbouring province; fortunately he had been but a few hours at work when the circumstances became known, and the manager happened to be a thoroughly practical man well up in scab, and at once took prompt measures to avert the possibility of the disease being communicated to the flock; and I wish some means could be devised of having the fact ever present to the minds of sheep farmers, that scab is as likely to be unintentionally introduced by shearers and others from scabby stations as by any other means."

The large sheepowners are quite alive to this now, and I believe do take the necessary precautions, but the great mass of the smaller holders never think of doing so; in fact, they do not believe that any such danger exists, and consequently do not insist upon shearers stripping their shears and disinfecting their clothing.

The risks of infection from the above-mentioned sources are, however, becoming diminished every month; and in the course of another year I trust will have ceased to exist altogether, even under the impaired and defective powers of the present Act. On this point, however, I do not feel absolutely confident; and I am not prepared to say that it may not yet become a necessity to restore the power to destroy diseased or infected sheep in certain cases before thorough and complete eradication is finally accomplished. After the next shearing season I shall be in a better position to give a more decided opinion on this point.

I am glad to be able to report that the Westbury District, where so much disease existed last year, may now be considered a Clean District. The same may be said of Deloraine, Port Sorell, and the whole of the North Coast. This result is clearly due to the increased number of Inspectors in that portion of the Colony which the increased contribution for the current year enabled the Government to afford me.

I do not, however, think it desirable to recommend that these districts should be declared "Clean Districts" until after next shearing season. If no new cases of disease are found in Westbury, Deloraine, Port Sorell, and Horton before the month of December, I think immediately thereafter they may safely be declared clean.

In the Southern portion of the Oatlands District the greatest number of sheep are now under Licence; viz., 9362. These sheep have principally, if not wholly, been re-infected, I believe, from contact with sheep in a flock of 1700 on Flat Top, which I have now every reason to believe was never actually clean, although believed to be so by the Inspector at this time last year. If information had been given to me in a less vague and guarded way by some of the neighbouring sheep-owners, the disease would have been stamped out in January last, instead of infection having been conveyed to other flocks which had been clean for from 3 to 4 years. The owners of these flocks are, in my opinion, much to blame, and are now suffering the consequences of their own laches, or rather sentimental folly, in not giving me promptly intelligible information of the existence of disease in one of their neighbour's flocks.

That portion of the Oatlands District which embraces the runs on which these sheep are depastured has been taken out of "No. 5 Clean Sheep District," and as energetic measures have been taken to have them thoroughly dipped, I am in hopes that any extension of the infection has been prevented, and that when the existing Licences expire these sheep will be found to be clean. Even in that event, however, I do not think it will be desirable to replace the southern portion of the Oatlands District in "No. 5 Clean Sheep District" until after next shearing season.

The number of sheep has still increased on last year's Returns, as the Table underneath discloses. It also shows the quantity of wool exported each year, from the 30th of June of one year to the 1st July of the following, and was made up from Customs Returns, under the authority of the Government, by an officer well qualified to perform the duty.

The above Return speaks for itself. It needs no comment from me further than drawing attention to the fact that now, with about the same number of sheep as in 1868-9, the quantity of wool exported in 1875-6 shows an increase on the average quantity exported in former years of 1,600,000 lbs.

The value of the export trade in Stud Sheep to the neighbouring Colonies continues gradually to increase, as the following Return shows :—

To these values may fairly be added from 20 to 25 per cent. to ascertain the true value, as sheep are frequently passed at the Custom House at £5 each, when they may have been sold at three or four times that amount.

The value to the Colony of Sheep exported in 1875 may safely be stated at from £28,000 to £30,000.

That this trade will go on increasing there cannot be a doubt, if we consider the advantages of climate Tasmania possesses over the Northern and Western Colonies of Australia. To put this trade on a firm basis, and secure it from the possibility of being checked for a time, it is absolutely necessary that the whole of the Tasmanian flocks should be freed from the taint of scab. So strongly am I impressed with the necessity of this, if we desire to keep the channel open for our exports in the future, that in the event of any disease existing in Tasmania at this time next year, I would recommend the sheepowners to come to the Legislature and ask for a law to enable them to destroy all diseased sheep, and give moderate compensation to the owners, leaving the runs vacant for such time as would ensure their being clean, or with the option of putting cattle on them during that period.

I still hope that no such extreme measure will be required; but certainly, if any Scab exists next year, the power to destroy ought to be given in some form if the sheepowners study what is likely to be most conducive to their immediate as well as their future interests. There cannot be complete safety for sheepowners so long as a single infected flock exists in the Island. The ignorance and recklessness of some, or the cupidity and selfishness of others, are ever existing agencies to smuggle infected sheep into the market when it is known that there is no power to destroy; and even if detection results, and a prosecution follows, the probability is in favour of the offender escaping with a penalty of a few pounds, as has been the case in so many instances.

Fortunately the dipping provisions of the present Act are quite as stringent, if not more so, as in the former Acts; and it is those powers which have effected what has been done towards eradication

during the last nine months; and not the penalties which have been inflicted ; some of which have been so small in amount that instead of acting as deterrents they seem more calculated to operate the other way.

The alteration in the law with regard to sheep taken into "Clean Sheep Districts" has, I think, operated injuriously. Formerly, if they entered a district of that kind without a permit from an Inspector, the owner was not only liable to a penalty as now, but the sheep might be destroyed if the Chief Inspector should think it necessary. It is one of the gravest offences under the Act in my opinion ; and the Inspector is powerless in such a case excepting to institute a prosecution against the offending person or persons, when some trifling penalty may be inflicted totally insufficient to deter any one from committing the same offence next day. So long as the power to destroy in such cases existed, there was not the slightest fear of any infringement of the law. The only safety in respect of this now is, that the great majority of flockowners are desirous to comply with the law in every particular ; and when they do not do so, err from want of knowledge and not by design. The number of owners inclined to set the law at defiance is very small indeed ; and those few are principally dealers as well ; and it was, therefore, to curb them that the former stringent clause was inserted in Scab Act, No. 2. To the small class of owners alluded to it seems to me that nothing but the fear of having their sheep destroyed will deter them from what they term "trying it on," when the chances of escape are so many, and the risks of being fined in a heavy penalty so few.

The number of bullocks and sheep imported in 1875 exceeds that of 1874 by 420 bullocks and 3013 sheep.

The increased importation in 1875 over 1874 may be accounted for from there having been a smaller supply of Colonial fat cattle. The number of sheep passed through the Slaughter Yards was greater by 5300 in 1875 than in 1874, and the number of cattle upwards of 400 head less. This would seem to prove that in 1875 there was a very considerable falling off in the home supply of beef as compared with the preceding year ; and, combined with the fact of money having been more plentiful, accounts for the very high prices both beef and mutton have maintained throughout 1875 and during the current year to this date.

The number of cattle returned in the Live Stock Statistics for the last four years shows a considerable increase.

In 1874 rabbit skins to the number of 474,468, valued at £3725, were exported, principally from Hobart Town. In 1875, 433,404 skins were exported, valued at £3653. But, in addition to this, a large number of rabbits, amounting to many thousands, were exported from Launceston to Victoria for the purpose of being preserved there for shipment or home consumption.

I again regret to say that, from my own observation while travelling through the country, I cannot state that any diminution of this plague has taken place generally. On the contrary, I am disposed to believe that, although their numbers have been greatly diminished in some parts of the Oatlands and other Midland Districts, and also about Hutton Park and the Black Marsh, where a few years ago they were so numerous, yet, taking the country throughout, there are at the present moment more rabbits in Tasmania than at any former period. They are now to be seen in numbers where a few years ago hardly a rabbit was to be seen in a day's walk.

I again reiterate, what I stated last year, that it is no exaggeration to say that at this time rabbits are consuming the food of 250,000 sheep; which represents an annual loss of £62,500, without taking into account the money expended in merely keeping them down and mitigating the plague to a small extent.

Settlers generally whose runs are free, or nearly so, from rabbits, are indifferent on the subject; object to an assessment for the purpose of destroying them on their neighbours' runs, and laugh at the idea of theirs being invaded.

I believe they are labouring under a fatal delusion. The rabbit is surely and rapidly advancing; and I feel assured that before long, unless more energetic measures are adopted to check that advance, they will overrun the whole Island. If settlers would only combine and act simultaneously for one year, I believe they might so root out the rabbit that a very small annual outlay afterwards would be sufficient to keep them down so far that no very serious loss would arise from their presence. But I fear there is little likelihood of settlers combining for any such purpose until the evil has become more generally extended throughout the country, and its destructive results more generally brought home to them in the form of impoverished stock, ruined crops, and, in consequence thereof, a smaller balance at their bankers; probably, in some cases it may produce a balance on the wrong side of the ledger.

Some of my country friends may probably laugh at this as a fancy picture. I greatly fear, however, that those who laugh now will look grave enough ten years hence, when their own experience has taught them that it is no fancy picture but sober truth.

It is not here alone that the evil has become great and is still becoming greater. The question has become a serious one in South Australia, and in that Colony they either have or are about to legislate on the subject. The same in Queensland.

In Victoria we know to what a ruinous extent it reached in some places. In one part of the country, not so extensive as the District of Oatlands, £40,000 in money was expended on the destruction of rabbits in the course of two years by some six or eight settlers. They effectually accomplished their object, however; and now very few rabbits are to be seen on the runs which at one time they had completely taken possession of.

The reports from New South Wales, Queensland, and South Australia are, that the sheep in those Colonies still remain absolutely free from the Scab disease; and, within the last few months, Victoria has been declared clean.

I have much pleasure in recording my satisfaction with the energy and intelligence which the members of the Inspecting Staff have evinced in the performance of their several duties,—duties which frequently call for the exercise of no ordinary amount of tact, temper, and discretion.

The number of Sheep specially inspected by the District Inspectors from the 30th June, 1875, to 30th June, 1876, is 861,433; and miles travelled, 33,328.

Appended to this Report is a detailed Return of Sheep throughout the Municipal and Police Districts, showing their condition at this date, together with the names of the owners.

NOTE.—The Returns for the current year show 8673 lambs less than in 1875,—so small a difference that nothing can be deduced from it. The number of sheep being greater by 80,000 than in 1875, notwithstanding a nominal falling off in lambs, would seem to prove that the improved condition of the flocks, from being clean and consequently less disturbed on their runs, has materially lessened losses by deaths from poverty and other causes, incidental to the old system of running the sheep through the yards every 3 weeks.
