

PIPER'S RIVER AND BRIDPORT.

MEMORIAL IN FAVOUR OF HALL'S TRACK.

Laid upon the Table by the Minister of Lands and Works, and ordered by the House to be printed, December 1, 1871.



To His Excellency Charles Du Cane, Esquire, Governor of Tasmania, in Council assembled, &c.

The humble Memorial of the undersigned Householders and Residents at and in the vicinity of Piper's River and Bridport.

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That the population of the localities above named has of late greatly increased, and the traffic in like manner been vastly extended.

That the Road between Piper's River and Bridport is in a wretched condition; and that the want of a proper Road is a deplorable drawback to the advancement of a locality which, from the nature of the soil and other advantages, is well adapted for agriculture;—but there being no facilities for the transport of produce, the progress of improvement is held in check.

Your Memorialists therefore most humbly pray that it may please Your Excellency in Council to order such measures to be taken as will ensure the speedy construction of a proper Road towards Forester's River and Bridport, known as Hall's Track.

And your Memorialists, as in duty bound, shall ever pray, &c.
