THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve, upon the recommendation of the Salmon Commissioners, of the following Regulation under "The Salmon Act."

By His Excellency's Command,

THOS. REIBEY.

No person shall fish or take fish in any manner in the White Kangaroo River, or in the Coal River, during two years from the twenty-seventh day of January instant, under a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds for each breach of this Regulation.

All nets used in contravention of the foregoing Regulation shall be seized and forfeited, destroyed or removed, as each case may require.
