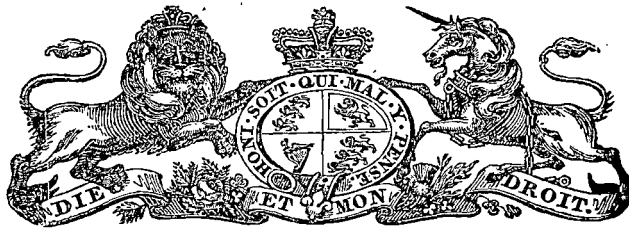

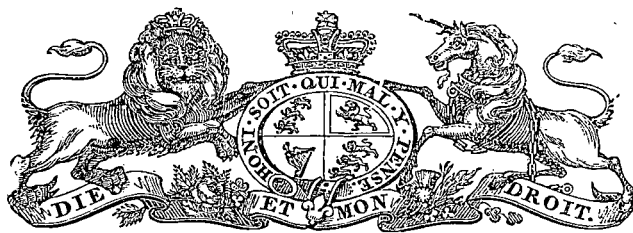

SIR,

THE Treasury Statements of Accounts for the year 1895 were received at this Department on the 28th April last, and, after due audit and examination, were certified to on the 3rd instant. I have now the honor, in accordance with the provisions of the Audit Act, to return the Statements, accompanied by the following Report:—

REVENUE.

The Revenue proper for the year 1895 amounted to £761,970 18s. 9d., an increase of £65,175 9s. 1d. over that for the year 1894, which amounted to £696,795 9s. 8d. The particulars were as follows:—

The large increase of £44,939 10s. 4d. shown under the head of Income Tax is owing principally to the fact that the greater part of the amount due for the year 1894 was collected in 1895, as well as the bulk of the amount due for the latter year. The decrease in the proceeds from Land Tax resulted from the reduced rate imposed for the year 1895, although a large portion of the 1894 rate was collected during 1895. The decrease in Companies Tax, or Dividend Tax, is explained by most of the Companies now paying under the Income Tax Act, and that for Interest by the invested amount having been smaller than in 1894.

The item Interest on Public Accounts, &c., £12,644 11s. 11d. includes the sum of £3574 6s. for interest charged to the Bank of Van Diemen's Land, in liquidation. This increases the aggregate amount credited to the Revenue, but not paid by the liquidators, for interest to the end of 1895, to £15,965 12s. 4d.

The sum of £52 12s. 7d. has been transferred to Miscellaneous Revenue from the Stock Act Fund in the same way as that for £697 2s. 11d., referred to in last year's Report, was treated for the year 1894. The attention of the Honorable the Treasurer was drawn to the provisions of Section 15 of "The Stock Act," 39 Vict. No. 20, which require Parliamentary approval for the application of the moneys in this Fund, and it was promised last year that a Bill would be prepared for the purpose of giving legal effect to these transfers. As this was not done, attention has again been drawn to the matter, as well as to the necessity for the amendment of the provisions of "The Stock Act" requiring the collection of contributions from sheepowners,—these collections having been suspended owing to the appropriation for the carrying on of the Stock Department being now made from the Consolidated Revenue instead of from the Stock Act Fund as formerly.

Instalments and Rents under Waste Lands and Crown Lands Acts.—Complete lists, showing arrears of Instalments and Rents due to 31st December, 1895, have been received from the Secretary for Lands, and checked by this Department. The amounts owing at that date were, for Ordinary Selections and Purchases, £44,050 0s. 3d.; for Residence Areas, £4447 8s. 1d.; and for Pastoral Leases and Occupation Licences, £1369 10s. 6d.—Total, £49,866 18s. 10d. Notices of Forfeiture preliminary to the preparation of lists for Default Sales have been recently gazetted, and these notices embrace amounts due to the extent of £22,218 16s. 10d. Some long-standing amounts appear on the notices. In one instance a holder of an area has remained in undisturbed possession of land for more than eighteen years, the deposit only having been paid: the fourteen yearly instalments were all in arrear four years since, the amount due (no interest being chargeable) being £767 13s. Many Default Sales have been held during the eighteen years, but this land does not appear to have been submitted. In a number of cases, where occupiers of land appear in the Return of Arrears, extension of time has been granted by the Governor in Council under the provisions of "The Crown Lands Amendment Act, 1894," 58 Vict. No. 13, the instalments overdue carrying interest. These cases of course are not included in the Notices of Forfeiture, and the interest accrued, but not paid, is not included in the amount above stated to be outstanding at the end of the year.

Collectors of Revenue, &c.—Several cases of default in connection with the accounting for Government money have taken place during the past year. The following are the particulars:—

1. Upon an inspection of the Post and Telegraph Accounts on 30th September last, a deficiency of £2 1s. 2½d. was found in the stamp chest of one of the counter clerks. Two other counter clerks were found to have lost £15 0s. 8d. from their chests, and again two others reported having had to make good sums amounting to £10 10s. previously. There was reason to connect these two latter amounts with the deficiency of the counter clerk first mentioned. This officer was suspended, and his services afterwards dispensed with; portion of the salary due to him was applied to make good the shortage in his own stamp chest, the balance, £6 5s. 6d., being paid into the Revenue. The deficiency in the other four chests, £25 10s. 8d., has been met by the Treasury, and the amount placed upon the Supplementary Estimates to be voted by Parliament.

2. An examination of the accounts of the Postmistress at Exton, on 13th December last, disclosed a deficiency of £14 9s. 10d. This amount was paid in shortly afterwards, as a subsequent examination showed. The Honorable the Treasurer advised that there were special circumstances in this case which caused him to abstain from further enquiry, as the account had since been found correct.

3. An inspection of the accounts of the Registrar of Mines at Launceston was made, and concluded on the 1st October last. Negligence and irregularity in the keeping of these accounts was brought under notice, as well as the absence of acknowledgments for certain repayments alleged to have been made. Much difficulty was experienced in obtaining explanations from the Registrar, and from information received a subsequent inspection was made in January last. It was then found that the Registrar had failed to account for the sum of £137 8s. 1d., the whole of which default had arisen subsequent to the October inspection. The details are as follows:—

In addition to this, the Registrar failed to produce acknowledgments from persons entitled to certain repayments made through Launceston from Hobart. The amount of these to be accounted for, including those mentioned in connection with the first inspection, but not including the £32 10s. mentioned above, totalled to £210 13s. 6d. To the 4th March last acknowledgments for £137 17s. were received and passed, leaving the sum of £72 16s. 6d. to be accounted for. This amount, together with the £137 8s. 1d. deficiency actually ascertained, and 10s. for a Transfer Fee since found to be unaccounted for, makes a sum of £210 14s. 7d. A cheque for £210 14s. 6d. was paid on behalf of the Registrar, and accepted by the Government on 10th March last, and it was handed to the Secretary of Mines to liquidate the several accounts. Further acknowledgments for £13 have since been seen, but the whole £72 16s. 6d. on this account is held, as other irregularities have since been alleged against the Registrar, and they are under investigation. This officer was dismissed from the Government Service as from the 3rd of January last.

4. An apparent irregularity in the method of bringing to account a cheque received for Income Tax led, in December last, to an investigation of the accounts of the Collector of Taxes at Launceston, the examination being completed in January. It was discovered that amounts totalling to the sum of £51 8s. 6d. had been received from Country Districts by the Collector from time to time in part payment of various liabilities for Land Tax and Police Rate. The Collector stated it was on the ground that the several payments were not in full that he had not paid in the instalments to the Office, but he was not able to produce the money. To bring the amounts due fully to account, required, from the taxpayers liable, a further sum of £24 6s. 7d. This amount, however, together with the £51 8s. 6d. received, or £75 15s. 1d. in all, the Collector subsequently paid in, and it was brought to account. The Collector's services have since been dispensed with.

5. In the Defence Department the late Colour-Sergeant of the Hollow Tree detachment was found to have appropriated £11 3s. 5d., balance of capitation grant, for prizes for shooting, instead of retaining the money for clothing. The amount was a balance from 1894. Late in 1895 a payment of £1 3s. 5d. was paid over by the present corporal of the detachment, leaving £10 to be accounted for. The matter was placed in the hands of the Honorable the Attorney-General, who advised that the man liable for the amount had become bankrupt, and that proceedings had consequently been stayed.

6. The late Registrar of the Court of Requests and Police Clerk at Beaconsfield being about to leave the Colony, a special examination of his accounts was made in November last, with the result that a deficiency of £15 17s. 6d. was discovered, consisting of £12 7s. 6d. for unstamped documents, £1 for costs, £2 for dog licences, 10s. for slaughtering licences. The amount was thereupon paid in. In February last it was found that the Registrar had collected the sum of £6 10s. 6d. under a warrant of execution issued at Launceston for service at Beaconsfield. As there was no record of any levy or receipt thereunder in this case when the November inspection was made, the default could not be then discovered. In the meantime this officer had left the Colony.

7. In July last the accounts in connection with "Pender's Weighbridge," then owned by the Government, were inspected. The sum of £25 3s. 11d., representing 2666 weighings, were alleged to be outstanding and owing, for the greater part by masters of various sailing crafts; but upon an attempt being

made subsequently to collect the amounts only £2 14s. 7d. for 345 loads was recovered, the alleged debtors in nearly 40 cases enquired into by an officer of the Public Works Department declaring that they owed nothing. The clerk in charge of the weighbridge gave no satisfactory explanation, but later he made a statutory declaration that he had paid over all moneys received by him for weighings. The Solicitor-General, to whom the matter was referred, stated that under the circumstances he could not advise that any proceedings be taken in this case. The sum of £1, due to the clerk in charge for wages, was paid into the Treasury by the Public Works Department. The amount remaining due was £22 9s. 4d., and for 2321 weighings, but from this is to be deducted the £1 paid in. Although this is not an absolutely proved case of default, it is reported in this connection, as there are several unsatisfactory features surrounding it. In the previous year the Public Works Department was asked to restrict the number of credits given and reduce the items to a few names only; then there were only 1036 loads for £9 7s. 9d. owing, but this was allowed to increase to 2666 for £25 3s. 11d. The clerk in charge referred to is not now employed by the Department.

In connection with the foregoing cases of default and irregularity, it may be mentioned that the officers referred to in cases 1, 2, 3, and 4 were assured with the United Australian Mutual Insurance Company of Victoria, the premiums being paid by the Government. It has evidently been found unnecessary to make a claim upon the Company, as the moneys short have been otherwise recovered by the Government.

It was reported last year that the requirements of Regulation 16 under the Audit Act had not been fully complied with, in that there were many collectors of Revenue in the Departments under the control of the Honorable the Attorney-General, in the Railway, and other Departments, who had not been guaranteed. A large number of Railway officials have since been secured with the Company mentioned above, for a total sum of £8750, the premiums paid amounting to £32 16s. 3d. This makes an aggregate of premiums yearly paid by the Government of £131 17s. 4d., the amount secured being £35,165. The Honorable the Treasurer was, on the 14th March last, again addressed with reference to the officers under the Law and Lands Departments who have not yet been guaranteed, those still requiring to be secured being as follows:—Police Clerks and Registrars of Courts of Requests, Collectors of Stamp Duties, Deputy Sheriff, Launceston, Registrars under Small Debts Act—Supreme Court Jurisdiction, Collector of Probate Duties, Commissioner of Police, Superintendents of Penal Establishments, Record of Titles, and Sub-Collectors under the Mines and Lands Departments. It is most desirable that all these officers should be brought within the requirements of the Audit Regulation.

Treasury Bills in aid of Revenue.—Of the £255,000 outstanding at the date of last year's Report for these, Treasury Bills for £40,000 matured and were paid off in 1895, leaving £215,000 in value of Bills still outstanding as shown by the Treasury Balance Sheet. These will be due as under:—

The Act 58 Vict. No. 41 authorised the issue and sale of Treasury Bills to the amount of £149,800 for the purpose of redeeming Bills falling due in 1894 and 1895. This authority, however, has not been availed of, it being understood that the Stock authorised under "The Local Inscribed Stock Act, 1895," 59 Vict. No. 6, in part took the place of the Bills; but the Act 58 Vict. No. 41 has not been specifically repealed. If the additional £149,800 is not required, it appears necessary that this should be done.

Local Inscribed Stock.—Of the £250,000 authorised under "The Local Inscribed Stock Act, 1895," the sum of £183,154 18s. 1d. had been raised to the end of 1895, as exhibited in the Treasury Balance Sheet. The whole of the authorised amount of £250,000 has since been raised. Prior to the first payment of interest, the attention of the Honorable the Treasurer was called to the provisions of Sections 5 and 6 of the Act, which require the signature of every lender or his authorised agent to be inscribed in the Local Inscribed Stock Book, and the question was raised as to whether interest should be paid to the holder of any Stock who had failed to comply with this requirement. The Honorable the Attorney-General, to whom the question was submitted, advised the Treasurer to insist upon every holder signing the book in order to avoid any difficulties, but there was nothing in the Act actually prohibiting the Treasurer paying the interest although the book is not signed. The interest has since been paid in such cases, but these are few, and are those of holders in Launceston. Transfers of Stock have recently been made without the payment of duty under "The Stamp Duties Act," but the Treasurer promises to submit to Parliament the proposal to include these transfers in the exemption clause of "The Stamp Duties Act." Stamp Duty, amounting to £2 15s. in all, has been paid from the Treasury upon the powers of attorney of holders of Stock, and the item has been placed upon a Supplementary Estimate to be voted by Parliament.

EXPENDITURE.

Ordinary Expenditure.—The Expenditure for the year 1895 amounted to £748,946 3s. 9d., a decrease on that of the previous year of £40,859 6s. 3d., showing a saving for 1895 of £13,024 15s. as compared with the Revenue, and a reduction of the aggregate Revenue deficiency to £442,103 2s. 1d.

Expenditure requiring Parliamentary Provision.—Under Appendix A. annexed is a Return of Expenditure authorised by the Governor in Council on account of the year 1895, under Regulation 19 of “The Audit Act,” the total being £9801 12s. 1d., and consisting of £7925 for excesses over votes, or for new expenditure, and £1876 12s. 1d. for lapsed votes or arrears of previous years. Under Appendix B. is given a Return of balances to the debit of certain accounts on 31st December, 1895, for which no sufficient authority has been given, and for which the sanction of Parliament is necessary, or which should be dealt with by transfer to authorised heads of expenditure. These balances include that of an original loan to the Strahan Marine Board, £500. It was promised by the Honorable the Treasurer in 1893 that this loan would be submitted for the sanction of Parliament in the Session of that year, and the matter was again brought under notice in last year’s Report, but the legislative authority has not been obtained. Interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum has been paid on the loan to the 31st December, 1895, and the loan itself has been reduced by £100 since the beginning of the present year.

The Treasury Balance Sheet also includes the following debit balances, being amounts paid for sundry persons or associations and which require to be collected, namely :—£78 due by the Metropolitan Drainage Board for Fuel in 1892 and Rent in 1893 and 1894,—the whole of the amount has remained on the books since the end of 1894; £442 12s. 7d. due by the Tasmanian Exhibition Association for Rent in 1893 and 1894, and for various payments on Exhibition account during 1895; £230 1s. due by the Sawmillers’ Association for payments made on their account during 1894 and 1895. The Tasmanian Exhibition Commissioners also owe an amount approximately of £25 for Customs Duties.

Under Appendix C. a number of credit balances are shown. None of these appear to be now required for the purposes for which they were originally voted, or have arisen from other causes, and it is desirable the Treasury books should be cleared of the balances. The list is the same as that reported last year.

DEBT OF THE COLONY.

The net indebtedness of the Colony at the date of this Report is £7,782,470, and the amount added to the Debt since the end of 1894 has been £367,825 6s. 5d. The following tables explain the net indebtedness, and the increase since 1894 :—

The gross proceeds of the £750,000 Loan were £737,308 7s., the expenses of floating being £9158 14s. 2d., making the net proceeds £728,149 12s. 10d. As the amount required for the purposes of the Act was £738,830 18s. 7d., there was thus a deficiency of £10,681 5s. 9d., and the Local Public Works Loans Acts Account has been short-credited with this amount.

TREASURY BALANCE SHEET AND ACCOUNTS.

Several improvements have been made in the keeping of the Treasury Accounts, to which it is desirable that attention should be directed. The Consolidated Revenue Fund Account of each year had hitherto been burdened with entries relating to the provision for, and the payment of, Debentures, Treasury

Bills, and Stock maturing. These entries have now been transferred to a new account called the "Debentures and Treasury Bills Redemption Account," and an old account, partially used for a similar purpose, closed. The effect of this change is, that the "Consolidated Revenue Account" in the Balance Sheet shows, for the first time, clearly set out under the head of "Transactions," the actual receipts and expenditure relating to the Consolidated Revenue proper; and the Redemption Account clearly exhibits the amounts raised in anticipation of maturing Stocks, the amount redeemed, and the balance on hand towards redemptions.

An account has been opened with the title "Trusts Funds Investment Account," for the purpose of clearing the "Fixed Deposits Account" of amounts belonging to various Companies and Trust Funds, and of enabling the full amount to credit of all these Funds to be shown against each individual account, instead of the non-invested amount only, as was the case in some instances. For example, in the 1894 Balance Sheet the "Assurance Fund, Real Property Act Account," and the "Launceston Marine Board Sinking Fund Account" showed balances at the end of the year as £100 12s. 11d. and £151 19s. 3d. respectively; these at the end of 1895 appear as £10,923 7s. 11d. and £3264 10s. 6d., the latter figures being the true amounts to credit, the former being the amounts remaining uninvested simply. The "Fixed Deposit Account" being cleared, this shows the amount invested on behalf of the Colony pure and simple, as will any future account with a corresponding title. The amount invested on behalf of the Treasury at the end of 1895 will be seen to have been £141,000. These alterations have been carried out at the suggestion of the Auditor, and it is hoped they will render the Balance Sheet somewhat clearer.

Of this balance there was invested in Government securities £112,644, in fixed deposits £9820, and 2d. remained in the bank at current account.

The Treasury payments for Pensions on account of 1895 amounted to £19,686 7s. 2d., of which the Sinking Fund advanced £19,600; there therefore remains a balance of £86 7s. 2d. to be paid by the Sinking Fund to the Pensions Account. On the other side of the account there was due from the Treasury to the Fund £161 for Pensions amounts placed on Supplementary Estimates, £1038 15s. 6d. balance of Reserves, and £337 1s. 8d. on account of Mount Cameron Water-race. The aggregate receipts of the Fund to the end of 1895 were £368,942 19s. 2d., the aggregate payments having been £246,478 19s., leaving the balance of £122,464 0s. 2d. as above stated.

The necessary amendment has not yet been made, although a similar amendment has been made in connection with the Post Office Savings Account, as mentioned below.

For the first time, the amount to credit of depositors has reached, and exceeded, £100,000. The addition to the account for 1895, £16,280 0s. 5d., is nearly double the amount added in 1894, which was £8302 1s. 7d., a gratifying proof of the increased popularity of the Institution, and of its usefulness to depositors. The amount to credit of Profit and Loss, £530 0s. 2d., has been paid into the Consolidated Revenue in accordance with usual practice. Last year it was pointed out that the Post Office Act did not allow of investments in Fixed Deposits; the amending Act, 59 Vict. No. 18, passed last Session, supplied the necessary authority: the placing of £7000 at Fixed Deposit is, therefore, now fully sanctioned.

Post Office Money Order Account.—This account has been adjusted to 31st December, 1895, there being an unexplained debit balance of £10 12s. 4d., which has been left open for further investigation, but the result may be considered sufficiently satisfactory, considering the nature of the account and the magnitude of the transactions. The sum of £35 8s. 6d., which was represented by void orders, has, in the usual way, been paid to the Consolidated Revenue.

Of this balance, £1200 was at fixed deposit, £24 6s. 5d. being due from the Treasury.

The balances to the credit of both branches of this Fund have been considerably reduced during the year owing to the suspension of the deductions from pay, and consequent additions to the Superannuation Branch in the one case, and of the transfer of the moieties of fines and penalties, and consequent additions to the Reward Branch in the other case, and also owing to an increased number of retirements from the Police Force, and the resulting increased payment in compensations, &c. The sufficiency of the authority issued for the suspension of the contributions to the Provident Fund was questioned, and this was referred to in last year's Report. Further correspondence has taken place with the Honorable the Attorney-General, but the matter has not been satisfactorily settled, and no authority has been received for suspending the contributions for 1895.

Fox and Dexter Bequests.—These accounts have been received from the Chief Secretary's Department, and passed to 31st December, 1895. The interest from the invested capital of the *Dexter Bequest*, £19 9s. 5d., was distributed to the Boys' Home, Hobart; the Girls' Industrial School, Hobart; and the Girls' Industrial School, Launceston,—the capital, £447 4s. 11d., being placed at Fixed Deposit. The interest from the invested capital of the *Fox Bequest*, £38 0s. 10d., was distributed to Boarded-out Children; St. Joseph's Orphanage, Hobart; the Boys' Home, Hobart; the Girls' Industrial School, Hobart; and the Girls' Industrial School, Launceston,—the capital, £800, being invested, £300 at Fixed Deposit, and £500 in Treasury Bills.

Spring Bay Municipality.—The 1895 Statement of Accounts of this Municipality was returned to the Council Clerk for the signature of a fourth Councillor, as required by the Act, and some little time after the Statement had been again received with the extra signature, it was noticed two further signatures had been written, apparently by the Council Clerk, who is also Superintendent of Police. The two Councillors whose names had thus been appended were communicated with, and from their replies it appeared no authority had been given by them to the Council Clerk to sign on their behalf. Had the Council Clerk or Warden expressed regret for the circumstance and acknowledged the gravity of the error committed there would have been no necessity for now publishing the matter; but as both these gentlemen have in their replies attacked the Audit Department, and, if the published reports be correct, as the Council Clerk has most unwarrantably charged all other Council Clerks with attaching unauthorised signatures to statements, the correspondence is published that Parliament may judge whether the Auditor has exceeded his duty herein.—(See Appendix D).

Dorset Road Trust.—A local inspection of this Trust's Accounts was made on the 11th September last, when the Secretary, who was also Collector, failed to produce £67 0s. 9d., the balance of cash required to adjust his accounts, and he admitted having used the same for private purposes; the accounts generally also were in a very incomplete state. The deficiency was reported to the Chairman of the Trust, who was in Hobart, the same evening, and he replied on 29th October that all rates collected to the latter date had been banked. However, upon the annual accounts to 29th February being received on 28th April last, it was found the "cash in hand" unbanked amounted to £19 4s. 2d. as at 29th February. Upon request the Collector supplied information showing this amount had not been fully paid in two months later, and owing to further collections there was still £14 7s. 0d. unbanked. The Chairman was communicated with, it being pointed out that the bankings by the Collector had been irregular for years past, the previous annual (1894-5) accounts having shown £45 7s. 5d. unbanked at the end of the year. The Chairman replied on 1st May that the Collector had resigned that office, but it is understood that the officer in question still holds the position of Secretary. The £14 7s. above referred to was banked on 4th May.

Richmond Road Trust.—A sum of £41 5s. 9d. remained to be banked on 29th February last. Many attempts have since been made by this Department to have this cash account adjusted, but the late secretary and collector, who has given several promises to do so, has not yet satisfactorily cleared the matter up.

Turner's Marsh Road Trust.—As the accounts of this Trust could not be obtained for examination, a special local inspection was recently made, with the result that it was found that the accounts were in a state of confusion. The whole of the past year's collections had remained unbanked, the expenditure being defrayed therefrom. A sum of £19 10s. 11d. was required to adjust accounts as at 29th February last. The late chairman and treasurer, who was the officer concerned, banked £14 7s. of the amount, and has promised to clear up the accounts and send proof that the greater part of the balance of cash is in the hands of the collector.

New Norfolk Municipality.—Failing to obtain the vouchers for payments alleged to have been made by the Registrar of the Court of General Sessions, and reported last year, the Auditor made a personal visit to the Council Clerk or Registrar, and succeeded in inducing that officer to write for the vouchers, and a few were received. The result, however, cannot be considered altogether satisfactory.

Glenorchy Water Trust.—The accounts of this Trust for the past year have not yet been passed, owing to the non-banking of the cash shown to be "on hand." This, it is stated, is due by a late secretary of the Trust, and the Trustees have been urged to cause the money to be brought to account. The amount involved is £28 13s. 4d.

Dundas Town Board.—Great difficulty was experienced in obtaining this Board's accounts to end of year 1894. They were received incomplete in August last, and were at length passed on the 28th April last. The Board had some time since ceased operations, and its accounts were closed and balanced off. A balance of outstanding rates, £32 3s. 3d., remained; but this is a very doubtful asset, and there were liabilities amounting to £56 16s. 6d., including £10 19s. due to the Treasury for preliminary expenses on formation of the Board. The Board having ceased to exist, the position of affairs was reported to the Honorable the Minister of Lands and Works.

Hobart Municipality.—It had been arranged that the Hobart Municipal Accounts should be audited by the Auditor-General as from the 1st January, 1896, but as the provisions of "The Hobart Corporation Act, 1895," passed on 24th October last, required the submission of accounts to this Department without fixing this limitation, it became necessary to make such an examination as would justify the Auditor in attaching his certificate to the accounts for 1895, and this certificate was given with an explanation and qualification on 9th instant to the two copies of accounts to be laid before Parliament, but the Municipal authorities inadvertently published the account in the *Gazette* without the Auditor-General's certificate. The accounts had been examined in detail by the City Auditors, and, as has been reported by them, the £9230 15s. paid for interest in 1894 from the Debenture Fund, or unexpended Loans balances, has not been repaid to the Fund. Of the £4750 advanced by the Honorable the Treasurer last year, and referred to in my previous Report, £2500 has been repaid with interest, the balance, £2250, being still outstanding. A question was recently raised upon the omission of the Hobart Corporation to collect rates upon empty houses exceeding an annual rateable value of £20, the Act appearing, both to the officers of the Corporation and myself, to require the collection; but the Honorable the Attorney-General has given his opinion, that in interpreting Section 112 of Act 57 Vict. No. 11, the words "rates payable in respect of such property" must be read with Section 104, which makes rates payable only by occupiers. As this was the section principally relied upon, and acting under the opinion quoted, the Auditor withdrew his objection. The extra provision made last Session—£1150 instead of £600 per annum—for the Sinking Fund under "The Loans Consolidation Act," has placed this Fund on a more satisfactory footing; the first half-year's contribution, £575, for 1896, has been paid over by the Corporation.

Launceston Municipality.—The 1895 accounts of this Corporation have been fully audited, and the statement was passed and certified to by me on 25th February last. The work of examination occupied a large share of the inspecting officers' time, but this duty was much facilitated by the generous assistance rendered by the City Treasurer and by the other officials of the Corporation. The legislation of last Session has cleared away the difficulties in connection with the various Sinking Funds referred to last year, with the exception of that of the "Waterworks Sinking Fund." It was on the distinct understanding that this Fund was to be amalgamated with the Sinking Fund under the Loans Consolidation Act that the reduced provision for the latter was approved; however, it has been promised that the omission will be remedied during the approaching Session. The balance formerly standing against the Albert Hall Construction Account (£12,224 8s. 7d.) has been transferred to the Water Account, in accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of 59 Vict. No. 52. A considerable amount in rates and for work performed for associations and private people remained on the books, but it was promised that every effort would be made to recover arrears. Nearly £400 remains due by the Launceston City and Suburbs Improvement Association; this amount includes interest charged, but even the interest is not being paid, while the Corporation continues to do work for the association. The contributions due by owners in connection with the construction of private streets is already much in arrear, and as prompt payment is most essential to the success of the scheme of repayments drawn up, it is very necessary that these liabilities should be regularly liquidated. The sum of £128, part of £508 expended on Church-street, has been charged to the General Account of the Corporation instead of to the Private Streets Account, and the money recovered from owners of frontages as required by Section 241 of Act 58 Vict. No. 30. It was explained that this departure is consequent upon an error being made in the original estimate of cost, and the resulting short demand on owners. Much attention has been devoted to the questions arising from expenditure on Electric Lighting Account, and the devia-

tions from the schedule of quantities and prices, which were considerable, and the two Aldermen appointed auditors of accounts by the Municipal Council addressed a letter to me bringing under notice their objection to the payment of a certain progress account and their protest to the Council, on the ground that the superintending officer had not complied with the resolution of the Municipal Council to the effect that that officer should furnish a report showing whether the items in the account not specified in the contract or schedule are extras, additions, deviations, or alterations. An independent inquiry was made, with the result that there could not be seen any sufficient reason for refusing to pass these progress payments, as they bore the certificate of the superintending officer; in view of the ample powers conferred on this officer; and from the Town Clerk's assurance that these accounts, with the remarks of the Aldermen who act as auditors, are considered by the Finance Committee, who submit a report to the Council recommending their payment, which report, after remaining on the table for a fortnight, is adopted by the Council.

The Loans Acts passed last Session have remedied the ambiguity previously existing in connection with the date on which the Debentures issued under the Launceston and Hobart Loans Consolidation Acts are to be redeemed. The Treasury system of posting accounts to Abstract Books has been introduced in the Launceston Municipality, and the advantages of this system are plainly apparent. The same plan of accounts will also be adopted by the Hobart Municipality, and the two sets of books will thus to this extent be uniform with each other and those kept on behalf of the Colony.

Hobart and Launceston General Hospitals.—The accounts of these two Hospitals have been regularly rendered and examined during the year. The result of the operations for 1895 was a return to the Treasury of £320 19s. 10d. by the Hobart Board, and of £330 by the Launceston Board, these sums representing the year's profits or savings. The amounts were placed to the credit of the respective Parliamentary votes for the Hospitals.

Southport Village Settlement.—The accounts of this Settlement have been examined on 1st May, 1896, and a claim for £145 10s. passed under the provisions of Act 58 Vict. No. 24, making a total subsidy paid by the Government of £600. Inclusive of this amount, the total receipts on account of the Settlement have been £1014 0s. 6d., and the expenditure, £817 12s. 7d., leaving a balance in hand of £196 7s. 11d. on accounts as at 1st May.

Local Bodies' Accounts examined.—The number of Accounts of the several Local Bodies which have been examined and passed for the year, in addition to those specially mentioned under the various heads of this Report, are—

Grants-in-aid to Road Trusts and Town Boards.—The number of Road Trusts entitled to Grants-in-aid under the Act 59 Vict. No. 14 is 28, the amounts due being £2899 17s. 5d. The number of Town Boards so entitled is six, and the amounts due £944 10s. 6d.—or a total amount payable under the Act of £3844 7s. 11d.

The sum of £4231 11s. was invested, namely, £3225 14s. 6d. in Government Securities, and £1005 16s. 6d. at Fixed Deposit. In last Report it was pointed out that the Act requires the Sinking Funds to be invested entirely in Government Stock, and that it is necessary, to legalise the placing of any portion at Fixed Deposit, to amend the Act. This has not yet been done, and attention is again drawn to this necessity.

Of the loans there is still a balance of £5600 under Act 56 Vict. No. 53, £2200 for Latrobe Water Trust, and £3400 for Glenorchy Water Trust, not having been drawn. There is also a balance under Act 58 Vict. No. 40 of £17,500 not drawn, namely, for Launceston Corporation, £15,000, and St. Helen's Water Trust, £2400. The total balances remaining, therefore, amount to £23,000, from which, however, there has to be deducted the sum of £10,681 5s. 9d., the amount short on Loans Act 58 Vict. No. 40, and which sum has been short-credited to the Local Public Works Loans Acts Account by the Treasury. The balance at present available for appropriation to these Local Bodies is thus £12,318 14s. 3d.

The Glenorchy Water Trust is the only local body which is in arrear with interest, and this Trust owed the large sum of £649 18s. to 1st January last on this account, and in a few days a further sum of £215 will be due, making a total of £864 18s., equal to more than two years' interest, £691 18s. 5d. of which is due to the Consolidated Revenue, and £172 19s. 7d. to Sinking Fund.

INSPECTION OF ACCOUNTS.

The following is the number of Accounts inspected locally by officers of the Department :—Departments, 114; Post Offices, 52; Public Bodies, 122; total, 288. The work of examining the Launceston Municipal Accounts has occupied much of the time of inspecting officers, and that of examining the Hobart Municipal Accounts will take up much further time, and this makes it extremely difficult to have the necessary local examinations of all accounts made within the year.

INSPECTION OF STORES BRANCH.

The "Colonial Storekeeper's Personal Account" is now permanently closed, and the Inspector of Stores and Secretary to the Board of Tenders is thus enabled to devote his undivided attention to the duties appertaining to the offices he holds. The Stores Accounts kept by the various Departments and Establishments have been examined, and stock taken where supplies of stores are held, the result in nearly all cases being satisfactory. A number of economies have been effected in fuel, light, and water supplies, and in the supply of stores for the Government Service generally. This has been especially the case where advantage has been taken of the system of obtaining quotations from various firms, and goods supplied as they are required, instead of considerable stocks being kept on hand, as under the old system. Supervisors of Stores have been appointed both in Hobart and Launceston to take custody of and control the issues of stores required for the Public Offices. This plan of centralisation has worked with the most satisfactory results.

The Railway Stock Accounts have been examined to the end of the year 1895, and stock was taken also at the end of the year. The accounts were well kept, the stores were found in good condition and in close agreement with the balances on the books. The balance of the Railway Stock Account was £49,416 16s. 4d., of which £36,965 16s. 3d. was represented by Undistributed Renewals Account, and £12,451 0s. 1d. Ordinary Stores.

QUERIES, LETTERS, &C. NOT SATISFIED.

Customs Accounts.

1. *Deposits received on Travellers' Samples.*—The system established under the authority of the Honorable the Treasurer, and reported upon last year, has been continued, and is still in operation. The transactions since September, 1894, when these accounts were opened, and up to the end of May, 1896, were :—

No sanction for the continuance of this system has been given by Parliament; and it is a most unsatisfactory position for the Audit Department to occupy in having to institute a particular check over accounts which are opened contrary to the provisions of the law. The whole of the £2179 12s. 2d. mentioned above should have been paid to the Treasury as Customs Revenue, and only that returned which is allowed under "The Drawbacks Act," which would probably be little or nothing; but the money is kept in Deposit Accounts under the control of the Customs Department, and handed back upon exportation. A small portion, £109 12s. 7d., the proceeds of sales, was brought to account as revenue during the year. A promise was given that a Bill would be introduced last year to deal with these matters, but no legislation on the subject took place.

2. *Repayment of Duty on four packages Boots passed on account of W. Halsey, upon Warrants 3 and 4 of February, 1895.*—This repayment, amounting to £6 10s. 5d., was made in June, 1895,—the duty having been paid to the Treasury in February, 1895. Upon an explanation being asked, the Inspector of Customs replied that the amount had been paid on "Travellers' Samples," and the withdrawal from the Treasury had been made as the traveller was desirous of taking advantage of the Hon. Treasurer's instructions. It was then pointed out to the Treasury that the repayment had been improperly made, and that the usual provision of the Governor in Council (involving vote by Parliament) was necessary to pass the payment. The Hon. the Treasurer's reply was: "I take the full responsibility for refund of duty." Thus a most dangerous precedent has been established, for the amount returned had been properly paid to the Treasury as revenue, and should only have been withdrawn therefrom by Parliamentary appropriation, preceded if necessary by the Governor in Council's authority under the Audit Act Regulations. If the action taken by the Treasurer be correct, there is no reason why revenue of any kind should not be repaid upon the Minister's sole responsibility.

3. *Carriage, value £18, admitted free of Duty and Wharfage.*—This was a four-wheeled carriage, addressed "Mrs. Mather," imported on Warrant No. 1535 of June, 1895, and passed free of duty and wharfage as "personal effects" by "authority of the Honorable the Treasurer." The opinion of the Law Officers of the Crown was sought through the Honorable the Treasurer, and the following was given by the Solicitor-General:—"Carriages" are specially chargeable under Schedule (1) of 58 Vict. No. 4, and I incline to the opinion that 'carriages' are not within the table of exemptions contained in Schedule (4) of above Act, and do not come within the words 'passengers' baggage' or 'household furniture and effects,' and that, therefore, 'carriages' would be liable to duty, even though accompanying a person coming to settle in Tasmania and not being imported for sale. See also Section 4 of 48 Vict. No. 13 as to *Drawbacks*, which seems to throw some light upon the matter." Notwithstanding this opinion, the duty and wharfage were not collected, the Hon. the Treasurer endorsing the reply of the Inspector of Customs that "the subsequent interpretation of the law should not have effect retrospectively." The amount involved is, for duty £12, and for wharfage £1, the latter being a Marine Board due.

4. *Poultry Coops and Material—Deposit in lieu of Duty.*—On the 14th August last the Honorable the Treasurer issued an authority for the admission of poultry coops and material upon deposit of £25, to be returned on coops being reshipped. As the amount should have been paid to the Treasury, and not placed to an outside account, reference to the provisions of the Customs Act under which the authority was issued was asked, and the Treasurer replied "there is no existing authority other than Ministerial, but provision is being made in Drawbacks Amendment Act—this seems to meet such cases." The amending Act has not yet been passed.

5. *Exhibition Pictures and Statuary loaned to Art Galleries.*—17 packages, comprising 84 pictures, 2 cases pictures, and 3 cases statuary, value £6130 19s., were loaned by the owners to the Art Galleries Hobart and Launceston, and they were cleared from the Exhibition Bond Accounts by entries free of duty as "works of art for a public institution," and with the approval of the Honorable the Chief Secretary. It was pointed out that the pictures are the property of private individuals, and should not be passed free, but the Inspector of Customs and the Honorable the Treasurer declined to do anything further, although it was suggested that the difficulty might be surmounted by the proclamation of the Launceston and Hobart Art Galleries as bonding warehouses for the purpose of storing pictures: at present the Customs Department has no proper control. It is understood, however, that the Trustees have given guarantees for safe keeping, and that duty will be collected on any pictures sold from or taken from the Art Galleries. It is thus evident the passing of entries "free" was an error.

6. *Imported Pictures on exhibition in Launceston Art Gallery.*—Two cases of pictures by Mr. Pignenit comprising three pictures valued at £115 10s., and which are intended for sale, were passed in Launceston in August last free of duty as "Works of Art for Public Institution" under authority of the Hon. the Treasurer, the pictures being forwarded to the Launceston Art Gallery for exhibition with a view to sale. The remarks made under the preceding item "Exhibition Pictures, &c." apply to this importation.

7. *Duty owing by Exhibition Commissioners.*—An amount for duty is owing by the Exhibition Commissioners on one case gas-fittings, two cases flags, one case lampware, and twenty-one cases glass globes, the duty charged upon the original valuations being £44 5s. 8d. The goods were sold, and the Commissioners claimed to pay upon the amount realised. The Commissioners were met by the Hobart Collector of Customs with an allowance upon the flags and globes which had been in use and had been lessened in value through deterioration and breakage. This would leave an approximate amount of duty due of £25.; but the payment has not been made, although it is understood duty was collected from purchasers by the auctioneers.

8. *Sale of Liquor without Packet Licence.*—In December and January last questions were raised with respect to the sale of liquors on board the steamers *Oonah*, *Waihora*, and *Tambo*, while making

excursion trips, there being no Packet Licences taken out for these vessels. After interviewing the local Managers of the two Companies owning these vessels, the Hon. the Treasurer replied :—"The matter will be considered by Cabinet with a view to amendment of the law, exonerating these two Companies from liability for Packet Licences."

Loans without Parliamentary sanction.—Loan £500 to Strahan Marine Board, reported last year; Loan £4750 to Hobart Corporation, referred to in this Report; and £120 lent this year to Zeehan Cemetery Trust. These loans require legislative sanction. £100 of the Strahan Marine Board Loan has lately been repaid.

Rent on Powder, &c. in Magazines.—It was reported last year that an amendment of "The Gunpowder Act" was necessary to allow rents to be collected for periods of less than five years. It appears desirable that it should be enacted that rents may be collected at least once a year.

Dividend Duty on certain Shipping Companies.—The long outstanding query, No. 149, of 16th May, 1892, has not yet been satisfied, the matter being still in the hands of the Law Officers of the Crown.

Curator of Intestate Estates Accounts.—These have not been submitted to audit, although Resolutions, referred to in previous annual Reports, were passed in the Session of 1887 expressing the opinion of the Houses that they should be so submitted. As this matter has been so often referred to in these Reports without Parliamentary action resulting, no further special demand has been made upon the Curator for the production of accounts.

Gratuity to Widow of late G. F. Evans.—The sum of £40 10s. 6d., balance of £75, was paid under this heading on 16th August last in anticipation of legislative action—there being no sufficient authority, the payment was questioned. The Appropriation Act, 59 Vict. No. 15, was not assented to until 27th September, six weeks after the payment.

Latrobe Chamber of Commerce.—Balance of Accounts.—A balance of cash, £10 13s., remained in the Bank of Australasia, Latrobe, from expenditure made on Government account, and which was referred to in last year's Report. It was also necessary that a piece of land, which had cost £50, should be transferred to the Government. This matter was brought under the notice of the Honorable the Minister of Lands on 16th December last, and several reminders since sent, but the accounts have not been adjusted.

Fees retained by Crown Solicitor.—It appearing from the Hobart Deputy Sheriff's statement of moneys received in November last that a sum of £397 7s. had been paid over to the Solicitor-General in the Government cause *Bain v. Findlay*, and that £350 only had been paid to Treasury, a query was raised as to the disposal of the balance, £47 7s., and the Solicitor-General gave particulars as follows :—"Collector of Customs for valuers, £6 6s.; Miller and Miller's costs and Court fees, £8 1s.; cost of action, Crown Solicitor, £33." The Hon. the Attorney-General's opinion was sought as to whether the terms of the appointment of the Solicitor-General permitted of the latter retaining the £33 for his own use in a Government cause, and a reply was given in the affirmative. The Attorney-General's attention was then drawn to the Civil Service Regulation disallowing the keeping by any Government officer for his own use any fee, reward, or remuneration beyond his salary for the performance of any service connected with the Department in which he is employed, and questioning whether the Consolidated Revenue should not receive the benefit of the costs as against the salary voted and paid. The Hon. Attorney-General pointed out that these Regulations were not made under the authority of any Act of Parliament, and the contract made by the Governor in Council with the Solicitor-General when he was appointed is of equal force with the Regulations and emanates from the same source. A perusal of the contract being requested, the Hon. the Attorney-General replied, on 5th February last, "The contract was a verbal one, and was made between myself and Mr. Dobson when I offered the appointment to him and he accepted it."

Charges made against Votes for the Houses of the Legislature for Cab Hire.—Charges for cab hire for officers of Parliament to attend official levées, official dinners, and funerals, the expense being debited to Public Funds, were questioned, and the correspondence ensuing is published under Appendix E., with a view to an instruction being conveyed, if possible, to the Auditor for his future guidance, as the question raised has come up for consideration from time to time, and as it is obviously undesirable that he should be at issue with the officers of Parliament if it can be avoided. Charges in connection with the presentation of the Address in Reply have not been questioned, this appearing to be a duty of a compulsory nature.

Auditor-General's Salary.—The correspondence which has taken place with the Government in this matter is shown in Appendix F. The arrears of salary claimed for the year 1895 have not been paid, presumably in consequence of the memorandum of the Honorable the Attorney-General wherein he states that he is unaware of any resolution or other record of any action taken or opinion expressed by either of the Houses of Parliament on this matter during the last Session. The Honorable the Premier reiterates his regret that the Auditor-General should have deemed it proper to bring up the question again; but the Act of Parliament under which his salary is voted does not condition the vote for the year 1895 in any way, the full amount having also been passed in that year's Estimates and Appropriation Act, and the Auditor-General feels that he would have failed in his duty had he not required a compliance with the intention of Parliament with respect to this vote. It is respectfully requested that at least one of the Houses of Parliament will so express its wishes with regard to the Auditor-General's salary for 1895 that there may no longer exist any doubt thereon, and thus cause the matter to be finally disposed of.

CONCLUSION.

A considerable strain has been put upon the services of each officer in the Department owing to the extra work brought in by the checking of Income Tax, Launceston and Hobart Corporation, Stores, Hospital, Charitable Grants, and other accounts, in addition to the conduct of the ordinary routine of the Office. The investigations connected with the many cases of default reported have taken up much time and attention. The increase in the number of irregularities which have occurred proves the necessity for frequent local inspection, and there is not so much of this duty performed as could be wished, as all the clerks must be kept at the Office while the pressure due to the receipt and audit of annual accounts continues. The checking of Treasury accounts has been much facilitated by an arrangement made with the Under Treasurer to have Expenditure and Revenue vouchers more closely posted than hitherto; the examination of these documents now takes place almost immediately after the occurrence of the payment or receipt, and errors are thus more speedily adjusted. A meed of praise is due to the staff of this Department for the loyalty and zeal displayed by many of the officers giving up much of their spare time to keep the work of the office from falling into arrear.

Auditor-General's Memo. 8c—244 of 23rd August, 1895.

1. The reasons why this item "Hire of Landau" for Levees was made a charge against the public funds were fully explained in my Minute to the Hon. Chief Secretary of 14th December, 1885, upon which the item was authorised, and has ever since been so charged.

2. Hire of Landau (Black Rod's funeral). That this charge is incorrect, and that the amount should be refunded to the Treasury, are mere assumptions. The charge was certainly not "incorrect;" for according to Stormonth's Dictionary "incorrect" means "not exact, . . . not according to the truth;" whereas the amount was "exactly" that demanded by the proprietor of the vehicle, and was "according to truth," being just what he claimed. The first assumption is therefore itself "incorrect." The second assumption is purely gratuitous, and will be for the Hon. the President to deal with. The service was a public one, and is, I submit, a proper charge against the public funds.

WITH regard to the first question raised on 7th December, 1885, the then Chief Secretary (Hon. Aye Douglas) agreed with the then Colonial Auditor that the hire of a carriage to attend the Levee was not a proper charge against Public Funds; however, upon receiving Mr. Nowell's Minute, to which this gentleman refers in his Memorandum of 14th instant, the Chief Secretary altered his opinion. The principal reasons for the charge to Public Funds advanced were,—(1) "That the attendance of the officers of Parliament at the Levee is an official act and not a matter of choice." (2) "That they have to go in their official costume." The question the Auditor-General now raises is,—Is the attendance at Levees not a matter of choice as much as it is in other instances, such as those of the Judges, Registrar of Supreme Court, and others who attend in official costume, and who never charge their cab hire to Public Funds? With reference to the second question raised, it was surely unnecessary for Mr. Nowell to have replied in the way he has done to an Auditor's query. The Auditor-General did not say positively that the charge made was "incorrect," but that the item was "apparently an incorrect charge." There could be no contention as to the correctness of the charge as between the carriage-owner and the hirer; the relation with which the Auditor dealt was as between the charge made and the *Public Funds*. In this connection the Auditor-General has no hesitation in now saying the charge is *incorrect*, and selects his meanings from "The Library Dictionary" "not correct," "not according to established rules," . . . "erroneous," "illegal."

MEMO.

As whatever decision is arrived at in this case will govern all future cases of a similar kind, I beg respectfully to submit for further consideration—

1. That the attendance of the Officers of Parliament at the Levees is an official act, and not a matter of choice.

2. That they have to go in their official costume, unlike most other Government Officers, who wear evening dress, and can therefore walk to and from the Levees without inconvenience or expense of cab-hire; and

3. That in other cases an Official is not expected to pay out of his own pocket expenses necessarily incurred in the discharge of his public duties.

It is a recognised Rule of the Service that whenever an Officer is obliged to employ a conveyance to enable him to perform a public duty he is allowed to charge the expense to the Government. It is submitted that the same principle applies to the charge now under query.

I think it right to add, that the Honorable the President is in no way whatever responsible for the item having been included in the account.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to attach a printed copy of the opinion of the Honorable the Attorney-General, of date 15th February, 1895, on the question of the Auditor-General's salary, and draw attention to the grounds upon which the opinion was given that the Auditor-General was justified in authorising the payment of the lesser salary to himself, and to the concluding portion of the opinion, that "if either of the Houses of Parliament is dissatisfied with what has been done, the arrears of the larger salary can then be paid to him."

The Honorable the Attorney-General's opinion was mainly based upon the supposed understanding with the Member of the Legislative Council "who moved the insertion of the sum of £500;" but this morning's "*Mercury*" report of last night's proceedings of the Legislative Council shows that in Committee of the Legislative Council the Honorable Member referred to, in dealing with the Appropriation Bill, stated the Auditor-General "was being most improperly kept out of a part of his just emolument by the Government. It would be a crying shame if the Auditor-General did not receive his salary of £500 in full as Parliament intended . . . Why had the Auditor-General not received his full

salary? Why had the expressed desire of both Houses been set at defiance by the Government?" And further on, "If the Auditor did not get his full salary for 1895, they should see about it at the next meeting of Parliament. (Hear, hear.) If the Auditor had any pluck he would sue the Government for the amount held back from him."

If the published report of the proceedings be correct, it would appear that the Honorable Member (Mr. Douglas) and other Honorable Members who supported him, and with them apparently the Legislative Council, are dissatisfied with the payment of the lesser salary to the Auditor-General. If the Honorable the Chief Secretary is correctly reported as saying, "the amount was held back by the consent of the Auditor," this would create an erroneous impression, as the Auditor-General has only held the matter in suspense pending the obtaining of the expression of the desire of either House of Parliament, as advised by the Honorable the Attorney-General.

In view, therefore, of the expression of opinion of Members of the Legislative Council as above referred to (if the published report be correct), will the Honorable the Chief Secretary be good enough to obtain for me the opinion of the Honorable the Attorney-General as to whether it is not now the duty of the Auditor-General to claim and authorise payment of the arrears of salary due for the current year to him?

Opinion.

THE Auditor-General is the servant of Parliament, and would be acting illegally if he consented to any reduction being made in his salary contrary to the knowledge and intention of Parliament. But, in the matter of his salary for the current year, Ministers announced to Parliament the arrangement they had made with him, and the House of Assembly passed a Bill fixing his salary at the sum agreed upon by him and Ministers. When the Bill reached the Legislative Council exception was taken to the insertion of any sum less than £500 as the nominal salary attached to the office, and the sum of £500 was inserted. But I am instructed that the Member who moved the insertion of the sum of £500 stated that the adoption of his amendment by the Council need not interfere with any arrangement made between Ministers and the Auditor-General in regard to his salary for the following year, and upon that understanding the amendment was carried in the Council, and was agreed to by the House of Assembly. In view of these facts I am of opinion that the Auditor-General will not be acting in any way contrary to the knowledge or wish of Parliament in authorising the payment to himself of the lesser sum agreed upon by himself and Ministers. It will be his duty to place this correspondence and opinion before Parliament in connection with his annual Report, and if either of the Houses of Parliament is dissatisfied with what has been done, the arrears of the larger salary can then be paid to him.
