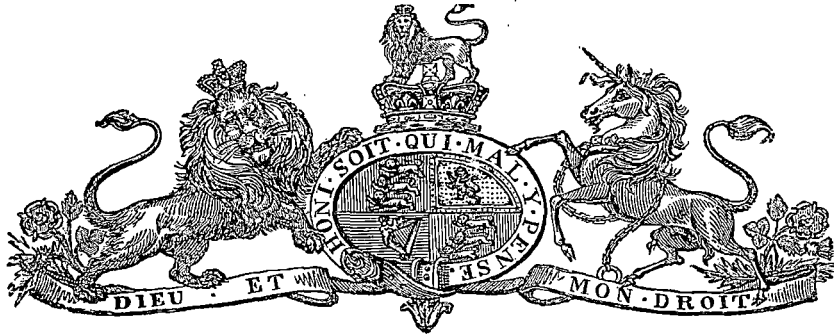

R E P O R T

OF

COMMITTEE ON STANDING ORDERS.

Your Committee report to your Honorable House—

1. That it has, in exercise of the powers committed to it, conferred with the Standing Orders' Committee of the Legislative Council upon the Rules to be observed in communications between the two Houses of Parliament, and in the preparation of Bills for the Royal Assent; and has agreed to submit to the consideration of your Honorable House Rules on those subjects similar to those proposed for adoption by the Legislative Council.

2. That, in framing the general Rules and Orders now submitted to your Honorable House for adoption, your Committee has been guided by the desire to prepare a complete code of Rules, founded upon the Rules and Orders by which the House of Commons regulates its procedure.

3. That your Committee believes that the code of Rules now submitted to your Honorable House will be found to embrace all the Rules necessary for the conduct of the business of your Honorable House; and your Committee would recommend that, in the event of any new Rules being from time to time required, such new Rules should be framed and adopted on the several occasions which may show their necessity, and that no general Rule should at the present time be framed referring to the Rules of the Imperial Parliament as the guide for your Honorable House. The adoption of a contrary course by the late Legislative Council was, your Committee believes, the cause of frequent and lengthened discussions on points of Order and Procedure.
