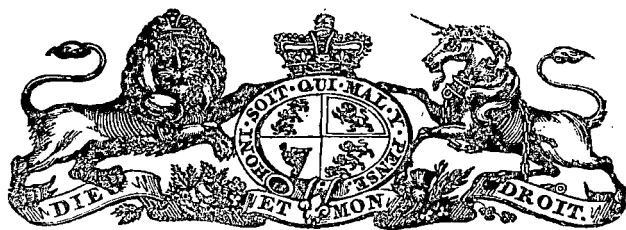

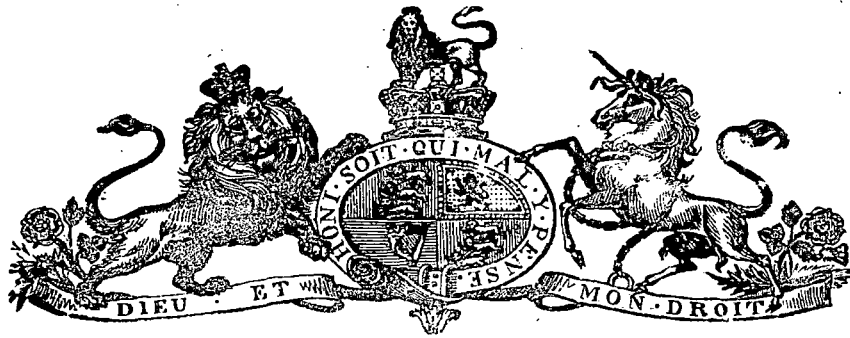

PETITIONS FOR AND AGAINST.

Presented, September 16, 17, 21, and 23; and ordered by the Council to be printed, September 23, 1880.



1. IN FAVOR OF THE BILL.

To the Honorable the President and Members of the Legislative Council, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Owners and Occupiers of Orchards in Tasmania,

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

THAT your Petitioners are of opinion that unless immediate action be taken to prevent the destruction of our fruit crops by the Codlin Moth the whole of the orchards of the Island will become infected with the pest, to the serious injury of the fruit trade in Tasmania.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Honorable House will pass into law a measure to provide for the destruction of the insect known as *Carpocapsa pomonella* or the "Codlin Moth."
