

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT of the Inspector of Constabulary Forces of Municipalities for the Year ending 30 June, 1880.

Office of Inspector of Police, 21st September, 1880.

Sir,

I HAVE the honor to forward, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, my Report upon the state of the Municipal Police for the year ending 30th June, 1880.

The changes that have taken place during the year have not had a general tendency to lower the strength or efficiency of the Force. The Police Provident Fund Act for the City of Hobart Town will have a beneficial effect upon the service affected by it. It is to be regretted that its provisions were not made general.

The returns of crime disclose a circumstance exactly the reverse of that of last year. Indictable offences have decreased, but drunkenness has increased very materially in the Municipalities.

I furnish the general return of crime, as well as the local return, with my report in detail.

The strength of the Municipal Force on the 30th June last was as follows :----

The number of this Force remains unaltered, but considerable changes were made in its organisation.

The Superintendent, a Sub-Inspector, a Detective, two Sergeants, and a Constable, having attained the age of 60 years, were superannuated, under the Hobart Town Police Provident Fund Act, which took effect in June, 1879. A Sub-Inspector had died, three Constables had resigned, and five Constables were dismissed for misconduct.

Fourteen publicans were proceeded against for breaches of the Licensing Act; 12 of them were fined, one case was dismissed, and another was withdrawn.
