

## ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION OF PRINCE ALFRED.

DESPATCH IN REPLY TO ADDRESS OF CONDOLENCE.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Wilson, and ordered by the Council to be printed, August 24, 1869.

Downing-street, 12th October, 1868.

Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch, Separate, of the 13th of August, transmitting Addresses to the Queen from the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of Tasmania, conveying to Her Majesty the expression of their sorrow and indignation at the attempt made to assassinate His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh.
