[†] There is a further sum of £154 6s. 4d. which has been expended for Contingencies under this Service; viz.,—Advertising for Tenders for Conveyance of English Mails to and from Launceston and Melbourne, Freight and Cartage of empty Mail-boxes returned, Travelling Expenses of Postmaster-General to and from Melbourne, and for the Mail Coach travelling on Saturday night instead of Sunday. The last mentioned is in dispute.

§ There is a further sum of £3141 16s. 8d. claimed by Tasmania from the Australian Colonies and New Zealand, being the amount of their proportion of the moiety of the cost from 1st January, 1857, to 31st March, 1861, under the Treasury Minute of November, 1855. There will however, in all probability, be counter claims forwarded from Queensland and New Zealand. A claim from South Australia, for a portion of the time, has already been received. From the 1st April, 1861, this arrangement ceased; and from that date the expenses of the Branch Services are divided equally between Great Britain and the respective Colonies concerned.
