

PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

PENAL ESTABLISHMENT, HOBART:

REPORT FOR 1885.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



H.M. Gaol and Penal Establishment, Hobart, 30th April, 1886.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to furnish my Report for the year 1885, with the usual tabulated statistical Returns.

The expenditure for the year was kept within the sum provided in the estimates. The gross expenditure, less value of stores on hand on 31st December, was £5965 11s. 1d., as compared with £6667 14s. 7d. in 1884; the net cost of the Establishment, deducting balance to credit, and value of labour for which no cash payments were received, as per Return No. 2, was £3929 8s. 10d., and the net cost per head £35 8s.

The return of labour shows a value of £5686 18s. 5d., including £434 2s. 10d. for prison purposes and less £4084 19s. value of material, a net value of £1601 19s. 5d. Owing to the age and infirmity of many prisoners who could not work, or only partially employed at picking hair or oakum, the return is less than it would be under more favourable circumstances, and the cost per head is proportionally large.

The gross cost of the female branch was £626 6s., the net cost £289 2s. 2d., allowing for value of labour performed; and the net cost per head £12 0s. 11d.

The total number of prisoners on the 31st December was 123 males and 28 females, as compared with 134 and 25 respectively at the corresponding period of the previous year.

The daily average of males was 111, as against 126; and females 24, as against 28, in 1884.

The number of prisoners convicted at Superior Courts received was 24, being one less than during 1884; of whom 11 were natives of the Colony.

Convictions from Inferior Courts were 106 less than the previous year.

During July last the Stone-shed in Campbell-street was pulled down, and nothing has since been done to provide another place in which prisoners could be employed during wet weather, the result being loss of labour when out-door gangs could not leave the buildings. I hope, however, this will be remedied very soon.

Two male prisoners died; and the number under medical treatment was unusually large, owing to the numerous convictions of old and feeble men and women.

There were no escapes during the year.

The conduct of the prisoners, with a few exceptions, has been satisfactory.

School work was maintained, and fair progress made by those who availed themselves of the instruction imparted.

During the year five constables resigned.

The conduct of the officers, with one exception (since retired), was good; and I avail myself of this opportunity to acknowledge the very satisfactory manner in which order and discipline have been maintained by them in both branches of the Establishment.
