

The following proposed Regulation is published in accordance with Section 13 of "The Fisheries Act, 1889."

By virtue of "The Fisheries Act, 1889," the Commissioners of Fisheries do make the Regulation following:—

Protection of Seals.

No person shall take or kill, or cause to be taken or killed, any Southern Fur Seal—Arctocephalus Cinerus (Otaria)—upon Hogan Islands and the rocks adjacent thereto, situate and being in Bass Straits, and being Dependencies of the Colony of Tasmania; and any person committing any breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.
