



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

MOUNT BISCHOFF PROVIDENT HOSPITAL:

REPORT FOR 1889.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



NINTH Annual Report of the Mount Bischoff Provident Hospital for Year ending 31st December, 1889.

Sir,

The Committee have much pleasure in presenting you with the Ninth Annual Report and
Financial Statement of the above Institution, trusting the same will meet with your approval.

Buildings and Improvements.—The buildings are in a thorough state of repair, ventilators having been fixed in the wards on the recommendation of the Medical Officer, and the whole has been repainted. Tenders have been invited for a morgue.

Medical.—During the year the Medical Officers have treated 143 cases as outside patients, and 5 in-door patients in the Institution. Two deaths occurred during the year. A change in the Medical Officers has taken place, Dr. Percival having resigned, and Dr. R. A. Brewis appointed in his stead.

Financial.—The year has closed with a credit balance of £206 19s. 5d., against £202 12s. 8d. of last year.

Subscriptions.—The subscriptions for the year amount to £215–18s. 8d. (out of which the sum of £43–1s., subscriptions from visitors to the mine, and generously handed over by Mr. H. W. F. Kayser to the funds of the Hospital), against £144–7s. 1d. of last year.

This year, again, the Committee are deeply impressed with the amount of sympathy evinced by the Manager of the Mount Bischoff Company, Mr. H. W. F. Kayser, in the welfare of the Institution.
