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
PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

ROAD TRUST SUBSIDIES DISTRIBUTION:

REPORT OF SELECT COMMITTEE, WITH MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS.

Brought up by Mr. Woollnough, November 15, 1899, and ordered by the House of Assembly to be printed.

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SELECT COMMITTEE appointed on the 5th September, 1899, to consider and report upon a Re-adjustment of the present mode of distribution of the Amount voted annually for Subsidies to Road Trusts.

REPORT.

Your Committee, appointed to consider the re-adjustment of the Road Trusts subsidy, has the honour to submit the following Report:—

We had before us the annual value and mileage of the several Road Districts, together with the amount per mile that would have been raised in 1898 by a Shilling Rate, had it been levied by every Road Trust.

It was found that owing to great variation in the annual value of the several Road Districts some had much more money of their own than others wherewith to maintain their roads in average repair. This inequality is increased by the present practice of giving the larger subsidy to such richer Districts. It was also found that many of the poorer Districts, levying a Shilling Rate, still raised less per mile than other richer Districts levying less than a Shilling Rate.

Your Committee therefore recommend—

- 1. That the practice should be continued of granting subsidies only to those Road Trusts which levy a Shilling Rate.
- II. That Town Board Districts and other Districts whose Shilling Rate raises more than £10 per mile should receive one-fourth of the subsidy, and the remaining Districts three-fourths of the subsidy.
- III. That one-half of the subsidy should be distributed in proportion to the mileage actually open for traffic, and upon which Road Rates or public money has been spent, and the remaining half in proportion to the amount raised by the several Trusts.
- IV. That Town Board Road Districts should be placed on the same ground as other Road Districts, and should not be entitled to a subsidy unless they levy a Shilling Road Rate.

It was reported to the Committee by the Chairman that he had been informed by officials in the Lands and Works Department that there would be no difficulty in ascertaining the mileage in the several Road Districts.

MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 5, 1899.

To which an Amendment was proposed by leaving out all the words after "Committee," and inserting "all Roads, which rate themselves at Sixpence and upwards, should receive subsidies in proportion to their rate." (Mr. Burke.)

Question-That the words proposed to be struck out stand part of the Motion, put and agreed to.

And the original Motion being put;

Resolved, That, in the opinion of this Committee, subsidies should be granted only to those Road Trusts which levy a Shilling Rate.

At 4 o'clock the Committee adjourned till 11 o'clock to-morrow.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 6, 1899.

The Committee met at 11 o'clock,

Resolved, That, in the opinion of this Committee, Town Board Districts and other Districts whose One Shilling Rate raises more than Ten Pounds a mile should receive one-fourth of the subsidy, and the remaining Districts three-fourths of the subsidy. (Mr. Burbury.)
