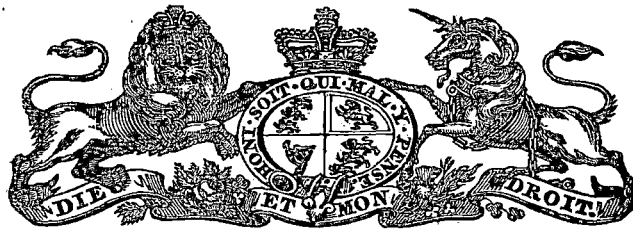

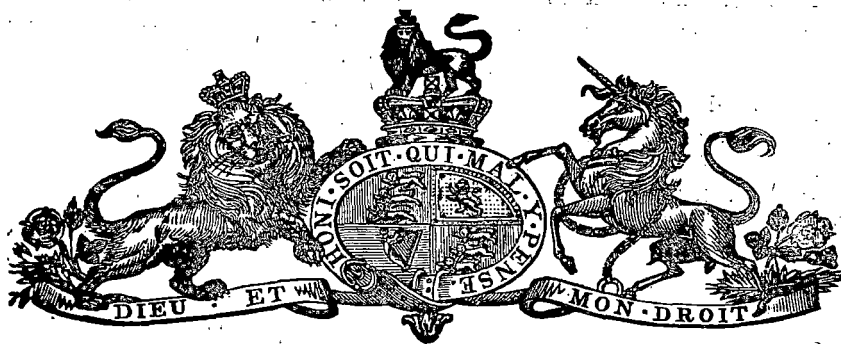

## HOBART INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL FOR GIRLS.

### TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT, 1889.

In presenting their Twenty-first Annual Report, the Ladies' Committee are able to record with thankfulness the success which has attended their efforts during the past year.

The Committee have especial pleasure in knowing that many of the girls who have been trained in this Institution are conducting themselves well in domestic service, and often acknowledge, with affectionate gratitude, the benefits which they have received.

Considering that they were taken into the School as a place of refuge from dangerous influences, and would probably have fallen, in many instances, into vice or crime, without the protection afforded them, their present condition as useful members of the community affords the Committee much pleasure, and enables them to appeal with confidence to all benevolent persons for a continuance and increase of their support.

The health of the children has been good; and the Committee have to congratulate the Institution on the continued untiring interest shown for the inmates by the Matron, and also the efficiency of its Teachers.

Mrs. W. L. Crowther and Mrs. Davenport, who are both in England, still continue to show interest in the School, by sending their annual subscriptions, also letters and gifts of cards, &c.

The Committee also beg to acknowledge with thanks the receipt of £8 from the Chief Secretary, being part of accrued interest of Fox's Bequest,—the said sum to be expended on an annual feast.

Mr. Rule examined the girls at the end of the year, and reported that they had made good progress. The ministers of the various denominations have visited the School during the year and have imparted religious instruction.
