

REPORT FOR 1893.

In presenting the Annual Report for 1893, the Committee desire to record with thankfulness the continued success of the Institution, and feel that there is great cause for encouragement in the steady manner in which the duties of the School are carried on, owing in a great measure to the continued and unceasing interest the Matron takes in the girls committed to her care. To her, and those under her, the Committee desire to tender their thanks.

The health of the children during the year has been good, with the exception of the prevailing epidemic (measles), when 21 of them suffered from that complaint.

Mrs. W. L. Crowther (England) has kindly sent a box of needlework to be sold for the benefit of the School; and as there is a small debt still remaining on the Institution, the Committee hope shortly to hold a Cake and Produce Fair to reduce the same. Mrs. Crowther still takes the warmest interest in the School, writing to the Matron, and expressing her sympathy in a substantial manner.

To the many friends who so kindly helped to make a happy Christmas for the girls, and to the givers of fruits, vegetables, &c., the Committee desire to tender their thanks.

The Committee earnestly hope that the friends of this Institution will not relax their efforts on its behalf, and trust that it will continue, under the Divine blessing, as in past years, to further unceasingly the important social and moral interests for which it has been established.

HOBART INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL FOR GIRLS.

Annual Examination, 14th December, 1893.

THIRTY-NINE girls were examined, thirty of whom had been present at the previous yearly examination. The progress made by 3 was found to be good; that of '8 fair; that of 12 moderate; that of 7 slow.

CLASS I.-Two were examined; both were new scholars. Their classification was found satisfactory.

CLASS II.—Five were examined. Four of these had been in the lower class in the previous year; one was a new scholar. All passed fairly in Reading, and three passed in Writing and Arithmetic.

CLASS III. -- Fourteen were examined. Four of these had been in the same class in the previous year; eight in a lower class; two were new scholars. All passed in Reading, and twelve passed in Writing and Arithmetic.

CLASS IV.—Eighteen were examined. Eight had been in the same class at the previous Annual Examination; six in a lower class; four were new scholars. All passed in Reading, ten with credit. Seventeen passed in Writing, four with credit.

There has been a noticeable improvement in the school work generally.
