

PETITION

FROM PARISH OF BARRINGTON FOR REPRODUCTIVE WORKS.

Presented by Mr. Davies, and ordered by the House to be printed, 12 September, 1865.

To the Honorable the Members of the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Landholders and Residents in the Parish of Barrington, of Tarleton, of the River Don, and their vicinities.

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

THAT some time since a road was opened from the Township of Tarleton to Kentish Plains through the Parish of Barrington, and from the Township of Tarleton was formed for about three miles where there had previously been a passable road, the remaining portion being left unfinished, and it is now absolutely impassable; so much so that the Settlers in that vicinity are unable to convey their produce except in very small quantities, and with very considerable risk.

Your Petitioners would beg to refer you to the public Plans of the neighbourhood, which will show how populous the locality now is, and the vast extent of crown land, at present worthless, which would be valuable if the projected road was completed.

Your Petitioners with much regret observe that their claims to assistance are overlooked in the Schedule of Reproductive Works now under consideration.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray, that works of a reproductive character may be undertaken in the District referred to.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.
