



To His Excellency Charles Du Cane, Esquire, Governor of Tasmania.

That many of us, particularly those residing at Kentishbury, Barrington, Green's Creek, Sassafras, &c., are greatly inconvenienced in having to travel to the extreme limit of the District to attend the Local Court at Torquay.

We therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased, by and with the advice of your Executive Council, to place a sufficient sum on the Estimates for the purpose of erecting suitable buildings for holding of Petty and General Sessions at Latrobe.
