

REPORT FOR 1878.

Electric Telegraph Department, 21st April, 1879.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to furnish a Report on the working of the Electric Telegraph Department for the year ending the 31st December, 1878.

As compared with the year 1877, the several Returns show a steady progressive increase; viz.—

1. The gross Receipts for 1877 were £9489 10s. 9d., and 59,419 Messages; for 1878 were £12,144 3s. 10d., and 69,197 Messages; being an increase of £2654 13s. 1d., and 9778 Messages.

2. Increased Tasmanian Fees paid into the Treasury for 1878, as compared with 1877, stand thus—

3. Fees to Submarine Cable Company show an increase of £1044 2s. 9d.

4. Fees paid to other Colonies on account of Intercolonial and European business show an increase of £944 3s. 7d.

A Comparative Statement of the Receipts for the last five years is furnished at page 5, from which it will be seen that the gross receipts for 1878, as compared with 1874, are almost doubled.

I think it right to note that the Submarine Cable was interrupted from the 12th to 16th May, and from the 12th to 21st June,—causing an estimated loss of £300. New and heavier shore ends were, however, laid in December last, and will, I hope, prevent further interruption to traffic from the same cause.

The following extensions have been completed during the year; viz.—Huon line as far as Geeves Town, Emu Bay to Mount Bischoff, Longford to Carrick and Bishopsbourne, Deloraine to Chudleigh: total, 147 miles of line,—placing in circuit 13 new Stations.

On the first of August last an arrangement was entered into by the Government with the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company to work the Low Head Telegraph Station for a fixed annual subsidy of £150; and I am glad to be able to state that the office has been worked to my entire satisfaction, and with a desire on the part of the Company to consult the convenience of the separate interests involved in the efficient working of this Station.

I cannot report that, as a whole, the lines have worked satisfactorily. The second wire to Launceston has been frequently interrupted through crossing with the old line,—rendering both almost useless at times; and reference to the weekly returns furnished to you will show that communication on the North-west Coast line has been very uncertain, and that the other lines have been frequently interrupted.

I feel it my duty to draw your particular attention to the means at present employed to effect, promptly, repairs to the lines, as this Department is often unjustly censured for the delay which

occurs in effecting repairs. In some Districts the difficulty of securing, at a moment's notice, a competent repairer to restore communication is very great; and labour has frequently to be obtained at charges in excess of those which some regular system of maintenance would entail. At present the Department is compelled to accept the services of the best labour available to execute *urgent repairs*, which the Department has been asked to attend to in pressing cases; the workmen employed, in many instances, possess no experience whatever as to the proper manner in which the repairs should be executed.

It appears to me to be an absolute necessity that some improved system for the maintenance and repairs of lines should be introduced at as early a date as possible. I am of opinion that sections of the lines should be let by tender, for shorter distances than at present; that, in some cases, a permanent line repairer should be employed; and that an efficient Inspecting Officer should be appointed, whose duty it would be to supervise all repairs and continually inspect and report on the condition of each line of telegraph, with a view to the prevention, as far as possible, of unnecessary interruptions to the lines, by the removal of all defects and faults likely to interfere with the working of the same; or, without awaiting for a break-down, to call attention to the defective state of any line. The Inspecting Officer should be always moving over the lines, and would find ample work to keep him fully employed. Such an Officer is much required, and should be a man of considerable experience to fit him for the important duties to be performed.

I am aware that the branch "Maintenance" is not under my control, and that I am not responsible for the manner in which the work is carried out; but feeling as I do the importance of the subject I cannot refrain from directing particular attention to it. All the efforts of an efficient in-door operating staff must be lost if the lines are not kept in good working order; and I respectfully submit that the community have a right to expect that the Telegraph branch of the Public Service shall be worked so as to secure to them the fullest benefits to arise therefrom.

Since I took charge of the Telegraph Department, on the first of July last, the staffs at Hobart Town and Launceston have undergone considerable re-arrangement, with satisfactory results to the public; and, with the addition of an Assistant Counter Clerk at Hobart Town—an appointment which you have been pleased to provide for in the Supplementary Estimate to be laid before Parliament on Tuesday next—I hope to be able to entirely separate the clerical duties and counter work of the office from the Operators', and to secure more complete control over the Messengers, whom I propose shall take their instructions in future from the Counter Clerks, who will be held solely responsible for the prompt receipt and delivery of all messages. The effect of this arrangement will be that each branch of the staff will have its proper and distinct duties to attend to, and will not be permitted to interfere with other work.

The building at present used as a Telegraph Office is most inconvenient, and quite unsuited to the purpose. The work of the Department having so largely increased during the past few years, and the staff having been so considerably augmented, it is impossible that the work of this important branch of the Public Service can be conducted with any high degree of satisfaction in the limited space available.

I beg earnestly that the subject may engage your serious consideration, with a view to the requisite accommodation being afforded. The position of the present Office is very convenient and central; and if an Operating Room could be added upstairs, taking the whole length of the building, with the ground floor re-arranged so as to give additional accommodation to the public, and provide the necessary rooms for the performance of the work of the Department, further outlay would be unnecessary, as the building would then be suitable for the purpose, and would enable me to assign to each branch its proper position and work. Until something of the kind is done, the work of the Office must continue to be carried on under great disadvantages.

The accommodation provided in Launceston is convenient but insufficient; and some further provision is required in the shape of Rooms for Messengers, Batteries, and Stores.

I trust you will not consider I have unduly pressed matters in this Report. I feel it incumbent on me to make known to you the difficulties which beset the working of this Department; at the same time respectfully submitting suggestions which I believe, if carried out, will tend to make the Department command the confidence of the public.
