

OF MURDERS, AND TRIALS FOR MURDER, FROM 1857 TO 31 DECEMBER, 1863.

Return to an Order of the House, 14 July, 1864. (Mr. Balfe.)

Laid on the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, 3 August, 1864.
