



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

DEATH OF THE EMPEROR FREDERICK OF GERMANY:

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF ADDRESSES OF CONDOLENCE.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.

With reference to your Despatch (No. 76) of the 10th July, I have the honour to acquaint you that the Addresses of Condolence from the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of Tasmania have been duly laid before the Empress Frederick; and I have received from the Foreign Office, and have the honour to enclose, a copy of Her Imperial Majesty's reply, conveyed through the German Acting Minister for Foreign Affairs in Berlin.
