



## REPORT.

The Select Committee appointed, on the 26th ultimo, to consider the "Bill to vest a Portion of Mulgrave-street, Launceston, in Her Majesty," after a careful perusal of the Evidence submitted to them, beg now to report to your Honorable House that they have arrived at the following Resolutions:—

- 1. That there never was a continuation of Mulgrave-street on the east side of Mulgrave-square, either reserved for the public use or laid out by the Crown.
  - 2. That no such street, in fact, exists.
- 3. That the purchasers of the Allotments on that side of Mulgrave-square, as shown by the plan exhibited at the time of the sale of those Allotments, as well as by the records of the Memorials furnished from the Registrar of Deeds' Office, prove to the satisfaction of your Committee that the purchasers of those Allotments of French's bought those Allotments with a full knowledge that they had no right of entry into a supposed Mulgrave-street.
- 4. That the diagram upon which those purchases were effected does not even show the existence of such a street, nor even does it show a right of entry into Mulgrave-square; and your Committee are therefore of opinion that no such street legally existed.

5. That the Evidence confirms the opinion before expressed to which your Committee have arrived. They are, therefore, unanimously of opinion that the whole of the Land called Mulgrave-square was simply reserved by the Crown for public purposes.

Your Committee therefore recommend that the Bill referred to them be withdrawn and would further recommend that the whole of the Land in question, upon part of which the new Cornwall Hospital has been built, should be vested in Trustees for the use of that Hospital, and that such Trustees should from time to time be appointed by the Crown.
