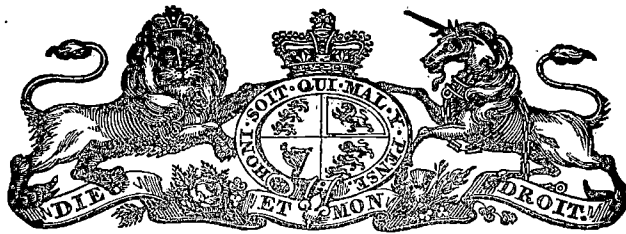

STEAM COMMUNICATION BETWEEN NEW ZEALAND AND SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

DARLING & Co., Dunedin, New Zealand, offer to run a Steamer every four weeks between Dunedin and South Australia, calling at Hobart Town both going and returning. Ask for a subsidy of £6000 a year for ten years. Would commence within two years.

Vessels to be exempt from all Port and Customs charges, and every facility to be granted to obtain supplies in Bond.

Proprietary to be in England, but Contract to be made with Darling & Co., with right of transference.
