

Your Committee have the honor to report, that since the last Report which was brought up on the 17th November, 1857, they have, as far as practicable, carried out the Resolutions agreed to in the Report in question.

- 1. They have, as favorable opportunities offered during the two recesses of Parliament, obtained by purchase at public auctions books valuable for reference,—the purchase being in every case authorised by the Honorable the President and the Speaker.
- 2. They have made arrangements for an interchange of Parliamentary Papers with the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and New Zealand; and they have obtained the Statutes and Acts of Parliament of Canada up to the end of the year 1857.
- 3. During the last recess, on the application of the House of Assembly, a transfer has been made to the Parliamentary Library of many thousand volumes of the Papers of the British Parliament, which have hitherto been deposited in the Colonial Secretary's Office. Of these books a classified and alphabetical arrangement and catalogue have been made by the Librarian,—who, however, reports that the series of volumes on many important subjects are very deficient.
- 4. The number of volumes added to the Library since the date of the last Report is 1018. This, however, does not include those from the Colonial Secretary's Office.
- 5. Your Committee have to request the sanction of your Honourable House to the appointment of a purchasing Committee, to consist of the Honorable the President, the Honorable the Speaker, and the following Members resident in Hobart Town; viz.—

Innes,—

of whom two shall be a quorum, with power to sit and act during the recess.

In conclusion, your Committee wish to record their opinion, that the means at the disposal of the Committee for the proper arrangement and classification of the valuable works now in the Library are much too limited for the purpose,—the books being at present disposed in three rooms and a portion of one of the lobbies.
