



THE Annual Accounts of the Consolidated Revenue for the year 1878, which reached me in the following order, viz., Cash Account incomplete on 25th April, 1879, Comparative Statement Expenditure on 12th May, 1879, Details of Expenditure to complete Cash Account on 12th July, 1879, Balance Sheet on 18th July, 1879, were checked and completed on the 22nd instant, and returned to you the same day certified in the usual manner. I now append my report as required by Section 4 of the "Audit Act, No. 3."

It will be noticed that the terms of the Section quoted have not been strictly adhered to, the voluminous nature of the Accounts and pressure of work in the Treasury having caused the delay.

Revenue.—The Revenue proper for the year amounted to £377,528 5s. 7d. known receipts, and £4408 4s. 4d. estimated amount to be received, making a total of £381,936 9s. 11d., and showing an increase of £19,544 17s. 2d. over the Revenue of 1877: the increase under each head of Revenue will be found in the following Table:—

This amount will be increased by outstandings, which will probably amount to £5000, but the precise total Expenditure of the year will not be known till after the 31st December next, when the Account will be closed.

Included in the above is a considerable amount not provided by Parliament, but authorised by the Governor in Council under Section 19 of the Regulations under the Audit Act. (Appended is a return (A) of Ordinary and Special Expenditure not provided by Parliament.)

The amount of Guaranteed Interest paid to the Main Line Railway Company, amounting on 31st December, 1878, to £65,419 15s. 10d., has not been included as a charge against the Consolidated Revenue, but appears in the ledger under a separate head as an open account, although the Act 42 Vict. No. 5 provides for the appropriation of £56,482 5s. 10d. of the amount out of the Revenue. Probably the Government have thought it desirable that the whole amount should remain in suspense until Ways and Means shall have been provided to meet this extraordinary charge.—Vide correspondence on this subject already before Parliament.

Debt of the Colony.—The Balance Sheet states the Debt at £1,750,800, being the amount of Debentures and Treasury Bills outstanding on 31st December, 1878. The actual Debt, however, amounts to £1,733,400, exclusive of Treasury Bills £14,000, issued as a temporary provision, and £4400 for Debentures provided for redemption of Debentures falling due in 1879,—the amount of which is also included in those outstanding, and inclusive of Debentures authorised but not issued, as well as those due in London but not written off in consequence of the Consolidated Bank Account not having reached the Treasury before the Bocks for the year were closed. The Reserves under "The Waste Lands Act, 1870," for redemption of Debentures, amounted to £29,942 2s. 8d. on 31st December, 1878; the Sinking Fund under "The Local Public Works Act" to £381 0s. 8d. It will be noticed that no payment has been made to the latter fund during the year 1878; and on inquiring at the Treasury I have been informed that this was purposely omitted, in consequence of the Law Officers' opinion having been obtained to the effect that since the passing of the Acts 42 Vict. No 18 and 19, there could be no further Sinking Fund in connection with Debentures issued under Act 38 Vict. No. 18. It is at least desirable that the amount payable under former Acts for the year 1878 should be carried to credit of this fund, seeing that the repealing Acts were not passed until 9th November, 1878; and it is worthy of consideration whether faith has not been broken with the holders of Debentures sold under the condition of a Sinking Fund being provided for redemption, by repealing such conditions. The provisions of "The Cemeteries Act" as regards the Sinking Fund have not been carried out, no such fund having been formed, although the omission has been pointed out in my Reports to Parliament for several years past. It was, no doubt, intended when provision was made for final redemption of certain Debentures to thereby enhance the value of the Stock; and it is most important that nothing should be done to raise a feeling in the mind of the public creditor that the conditions under which the Government Stock has been issued have not been strictly adhered to; and I respectfully beg to observe that any arbitrary cancelling by Parliament or non-fulfilment by the Government of conditions existing at the time such Stock was sold is calculated to have a damaging effect upon the credit of the Colony. I hope, therefore, this subject will receive careful consideration during the next Session of Parliament.

Loans under Special Acts.—Under Act 35 Vict. No. 7, £1000 was lent to the Tarleton Road Trustees in the year 1874, upon the understanding that interest, at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, would be paid to the Colonial Treasurer from a special rate to be raised for that purpose; and under Act 40 Vict. No. 3, £700 was lent to the Promoters of the Penguin Breakwater in the year 1877, upon the understanding that interest, at the rate of 3 per cent., would be paid, as in the previous loan; but no interest appears to have been received by the Colonial Treasurer in either case. The omission has been referred to in previous Reports, and it is hoped that no further delay will occur in carrying out the conditions of these loans.

Deposit Accounts.—Several small amounts in temporary Deposit Accounts, standing in the accounts for several years past, require to be written off and adjusted; viz.—

Municipal Accounts.—The examination of the accounts of sixteen Municipalities have been completed and passed, and those for Glenorchy, Oatlands, and Richmond are now under examination. For several years past the accounts for Glenorchy and Oatlands have caused considerable inconvenience to this Department; in the case of Glenorchy from the careless and unintelligible manner in which the

accounts have been prepared by the Council Clerk, causing very great trouble and time to adjust; and in the case of Oatlands from the delay in rendering the accounts. I hope this prominent notice will have the effect of ensuring more careful and prompt attention for the future.

Road Trust Accounts.—Seventy Road Trust accounts have been audited, and three are now under examination, viz., Spring Bay, Clyde, and Don.

Marine Board Accounts.—The Mersey Marine Board has not yet rendered accounts. The Circular Head Account is under examination. The other Boards' Accounts have been audited.

Queries and Letters not satisfied.—I append, Statement B, a return of Letters and Queries to which no replies have been received, or in which the questions have not been satisfactorily replied to, and in order that the matter therein contained may be understood by Parliament have affixed copies of the same.

APPENDIX B.

QUERIES and Letters not satisfied.

Guaranteed Interest to Main Line Railway Company

Audit Office, 5th February, 1879.

Sir,

REFERRING to the claim made by the Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company for Interest to the 31st December, 1878, I have the honor to remind you that Act 42 Vict. No. 5 only provides for the payment of Interest to 30th June, 1878, out of the Consolidated Revenue; and that no provision as to the fund from which Interest shall be paid beyond that date has been made by Parliament.

"The Main Line Railway Act, 34 Vict. No. 13," authorises the Governor in Council to enter into a contract with any person or company for the construction of a Railway, and to guarantee Interest under certain conditions, but does not mention the fund to which such Interest shall be charged. Any further payment cannot therefore, I think, be made, except under the provisions of Sections 19 and 20 of the Regulations under "The Audit Act."

An authority of the Governor in Council has been subsequently furnished for the amount to be provided on a Supplementary Estimate, but it is not stated whether it is to be considered a case of emergency or otherwise, and the amount has been paid without previous reference to this office as required by the Regulations. Explanation therefore requested.

Description of Voucher.—No. 1140. Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company: Amount of interest due by the Government of Tasmania for Quarter ending 30 September, 1878, £8125. Paid 29 Oct. 1878.

Query or Observation.—With reference to Query No. 536, it is noticed that the payment of guaranteed interest to the Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company for the Quarter ending 30 September, 1878, has been made without the authority of the Governor in Council, and contrary to the provisions of Sections 19 and 20 of the Audit Regulations. It is regretted that this irregularity was accidentally omitted to be brought under notice before.

Description of Voucher.—No. 1068. The Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company, Limited—To one full quarter's interest, due 1st April, 1879, as per Contract between the Government of Tasmania and the Tasmanian Main Line Railway Company, at rate of 5 per cent. per annum on the full sum of £650,000, &c., £8125. Paid 29th April, 1879.

Query or Observation.—The Honorable the Colonial Treasurer is reminded that Queries Nos. 536 and 541, referring to payments of a similar nature, and raising the questions as to the legality of such payments, have not been satisfied. Explanation therefore requested.—W. L., 2nd May.

Answer or Explanation.—The Hon. the Attorney-General has given an opinion that it is not necessary to obtain further authority from Parliament to pay Interest to the Main Line Railway Company. Copy herewith.—D. Lewis, Colonial Treasurer.

Audit Office, 1st May, 1879.

In reading the report of the proceedings of the House of Assembly in this morning's papers, I notice that the items for Guaranteed Interest to the Main Line Railway Company, and the subsidy to the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company, have been omitted from the Appropriation Bill; and referring to Correspondence and Queries with respect to those items, I have the honor to remind you that it has been pointed out that no appropriation has been authorised by Parliament for such expenditure.

With regard to the Interest guaranteed to the Main Line Railway Company, the Main Line Railway Act, 34 Vict. No. 13, authorises the Governor to guaranteed interest at the rate of 5 per cent. under certain conditions, without naming the fund from which such interest is to be paid. It seems to me, therefore, that the amount should be included annually in the Appropriation Act, or that the passing of a special Act appropriating the amount until · he termination of the contract is necessary.

The payment of the annual subsidy £4200 for the maintenance of the Submarine Cable between Low Head and Victoria was authorised by resolution of Parliament, on 24th January, 1868, but no special Act appears to have been passed for appropriating the amount out of the Consolidated Revenue.

As the proposal to omit the items referred to from the Appropriation Act seems calculated to establish a dangerous precedent, 1 hope the matter will be most carefully considered before being carried into effect; and feeling the question to be of great importance, I beg to request that this letter may be referred to Parliament before the Appropriation Bill for 1879, and Supplementary Appropriation Bill for 1878, shall have been passed.

Contingencies, Government House.

Description of Voucher.—No. 113. His Excellency the Governor's Establishmen t: Allowance for Fuel and Light for the month of January, 1878, £25. Paid 2 March, 1878.

Query or Observation.—This and subsequent claims for Fuel and Light have been paid as a fixed monthly allowance, in accordance with the terms of a Memorandum from the Honorable the Colonial Secretary of 7 February, in reply to a question raised by the Colonial Storekeeper. On referring to the Estimates for 1878 it is evident that Parliament, in not voting the sum of £300 for Fuel and Light as an allowance, intended that the supply should be obtained and the accounts furnished in the usual manner through the Colonial Storekeeper. Explanation therefore requested.

Answer or Explanation.—The Governor in Council has approved of the several items of Fuel and Light, Travelling Expenses, and Stationery, now included under the head "Contingencies" in the estimates of His Excellency the Governor's Establishment for the current year, being treated as Allowances, and of their being inserted in the Estimates for 1879 under that head.

Description of Voucher.—No. 763. His Excellency the Governor's Establishment, Fuel and Light: Allowance for the month of January, 1879, £29 3s. 4d. And No. 764, the same for the month of February, 1879, £29 3s. 4d. Both accounts paid 27th March.

Query or Observation.—In reply to a query raised on the 22nd July, 1878, upon similar payments, an answer was given to the effect that the item would be included in the Estimates for 1879 under the head of Allowances; but, in referring to the Estimates forwarded to this Office approved by the Governor, it is noticed that the item has been authorised by Parliament under the head of Contingencies, and that Fuel and Light for the Governor's Establishment should be supplied through the Office of Stores. It appears, therefore, that the Vote as taken does not warrant the Honorable the Colonial Treasurer in paying the amount as a fixed monthly allowance. Explanation requested.

W. LOVETT. 31 March, 1879. Answer or Explanation.—The accounts have been furnished with supporting vouchers, and the amounts paid as an allowance deducted.
