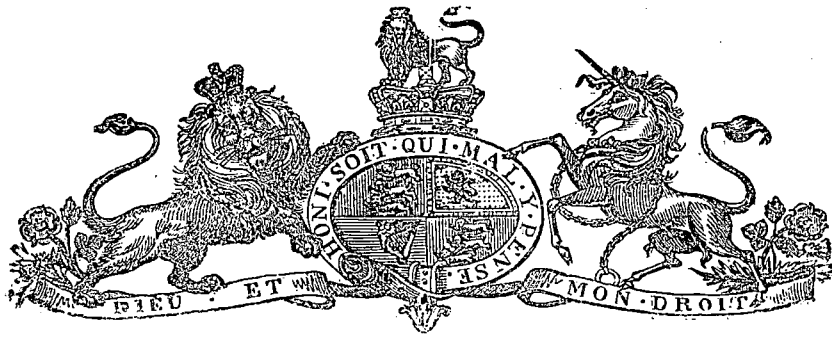

BOARD OF IMMIGRATION.

REPORT FOR 1875.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Crowther, and ordered by the Council to be printed,
September 12, 1876.



Immigration Office, 13th June, 1876.

SIR,

THE Board of Immigration have the honor to forward their usual Annual Report for the year ended 31st December, 1875.

The number of Immigrants introduced under the Bounty System was unusually small, consisting only of two married females, three single males, four single females, four male and three female children, in all sixteen souls, at a cost to the Board of one hundred and twelve pounds.

Land Certificates have been granted under the 7th Section of the Act 31 Vict. No. 26, to twenty-two individuals, entitling them to select eleven hundred and ten acres of land.

The Certificates represent nineteen male and twelve female adults, and twenty-seven children, —in all fifty-eight souls.

There were also granted five Land Orders under the 5th Section of the same Act, entitling the holders to select one hundred and eight acres of land, and representing five male and one female adults.

During the year the Board issued four family, five male and five female tickets for the introduction of relatives and friends of persons in the Colony; receiving the sum of one hundred and thirty-five pounds in payment.

In the month of June the Board caused a carefully prepared Paper to be issued, containing much useful information, for intending Emigrants, and forwarded a supply to their Agents in London for issue to persons making enquiries respecting the Colony, besides distributing copies amongst others who were likely to be applied to for particulars respecting Tasmania as a field for Emigration.

The balance at the disposal of the Board on the 31st December amounted to £6455 2s. 6d.

Appended are the usual Returns prepared by the Immigration Agent; five relating to the operations of the Board under the Bounty System, and two to transactions under the Acts 31 Vict. No. 26, and 38 Vict. No. 16.

A statement is also appended showing the acreage taken up by the holders of Land Certificates and Land Orders.
