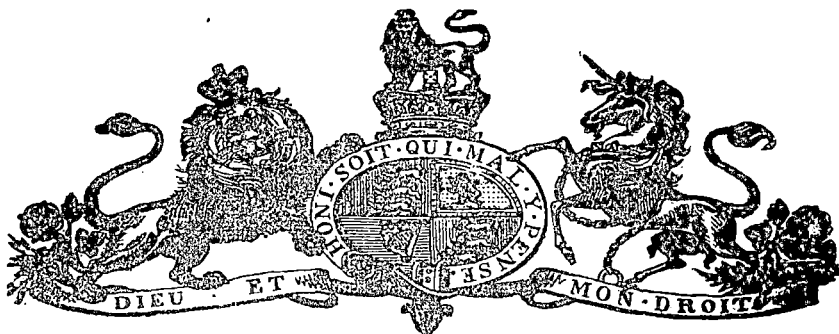

MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS.

R E P O R T.

YOUR Committee beg to report that, having gone through all the Papers and Correspondence relating to this claim and given due consideration thereto, they have arrived at the conclusion that the difference between the Public Works Department and the Contractors being so small, £2 (two pounds) only, the Contractors' estimate should be accepted.

They are further moved to make this recommendation by the fact that the sum of £5 (five pounds), which the Contractors propose as a deduction for certain work pretermitted in their contract, bears a due proportion to the contract price of the whole work.
