

# CHARITABLE ALLOWANCES.

CORRESPONDENCE.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, July 16, 1872.



Colonial Secretary's Office, 22nd May, 1872.

Sir.

With a view to discouraging mendicancy, and to prevent as far as possible the abuse of Public Charity, I am anxious that measures should be taken to enable the Local Police authorities throughout the Colony, as well as the managers of charitable bodies and the public generally, to be kept officially informed of the names and residences of all persons receiving out-door charitable relief from the Government, together with the amount of weekly relief granted to each recipient, and in the case of families of the number of children in each family assisted. I have therefore the honor to request that you will cause a list showing such particulars to be prepared from the books in your department, and forwarded to the Government Printer with directions to print a number of copies sufficient for distribution to all Mayors, Wardens, Stipendiary Magistrates, Superintendents of Police, Chief District Constables, and Managers of Charitable Bodies: such list to be corrected monthly.

As the object of the publication of this list is to check the abuse of public charity by information from local authorities and the public generally as to the circumstances, characters, and conduct of recipients of out-door relief, it is necessary that such object should be prominently stated on the list itself, and that the list should be dated from your office and bear your signature at its foot.

The subjoined, or a similar heading, would probably be found sufficient to attain this object.

MONTHLY LIST of all Persons receiving Out-door Relief from the Government of Tasmania, with the Amount of Weekly Allowance in each case, the Number of Children in Families relieved, and the Residences of Recipients.
