

#### Audit Office, 9th July, 1867.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to return herewith your Balance Sheets and Annual Statements of the Public Accounts for the Year 1866, which have been carefully examined in this Office, together with the Journals and Ledgers belonging to your Department.

1. On this occasion it becomes my painful duty to record the defalcation of Mr. Tribe, an Officer of 23 years' standing, and for a long time in the responsible position of Chief Clerk in the Colonial Secretary's Office. He also held the appointment of Secretary to the Board of Immigration, and in this capacity he was entrusted with the duty of paying all accounts and claims for Immigration Services that had been authorised by the Board; but not subject, it is understood, to any further control than being many ind to obtain the immigration of the Board. required to obtain the signature of the President to cheques drawn upon the Banker.

By means of false claims against the Board he managed to procure the required signature to cheques, This system which were cashed by the Bank, and the proceeds appropriated to his own private purposes. This system of embezzlement was carried on during a series of years; and when detection could no longer be evaded, it was discovered that Mr. Tribe had defrauded the Commissioners to the extent of £991 1s. Od.

The Act 19 Vict. No. 18, by which the Board of Immigration was constituted, delegates to the Commissioners the entire control of moneys raised under that Act for Immigration purposes, and there is no clause providing for an examination of their accounts by this Department.

But, although no such provision existed, it was viewed as a matter of course that the pecuniary transactions of the Board should be subjected to the ordinary audit of Public Accounts, and, accordingly, Mr. Tribe was frequently called upon to furnish proper Accounts Current and Vouchers, but, except for the years from 1856 to 1859, he failed to comply with the requirements of this Department; and it was not indeed until after repeated and urgent applications, as well as representations to the higher authorities, had been made that a reluction compliance on his next more at longith and compared by the Coursent in had been made that a reluctant compliance on his part was at length enforced by the Government in had been made that a reluctant compliance on his part was at length enforced by the Government in August, 1866, adopting the extreme measure of suspending his salary until the required Accounts should be forthcoming. A Committee also was appointed, consisting of the Deputy Colonial Auditor and Joseph Penny, Esq., to investigate the Accounts; and Mr. Tribe was directed to give his personal attendance upon such Committee to afford the necessary explanations. It appears that the Accounts and Vouchers, when at last rendered, were found to be in such a state of confusion that the only course open to the Committee was to prepare a series of Accounts themselves for the several years from 1859 to 1866 inclusive, from the Vouchers produced, the Bank Pass Book, and such other data and information as they could obtain. Mr. Tribe had destroyed the cancelled cheques paid at the Bank, which deprived the Committee of the assistance of that element where Vouchers were wanting; but after considerable pains, and at the expense of much time and labour, these gentlemen produced a set of Accounts, which may be considered as accurate as it was possible to make them under such circumstances.

as accurate as it was possible to make them under such circumstances. The ascertained amount of defalcation on the 30th September, 1866, corresponded with the deficiency at the Bank on that date; and as Mr. Tribe had no opportunity of tampering with moneys received on account of the Board which were duly paid into their Banker's hands, it is fair to assume that the true amount of deficiency has been arrived at in the above stated sum of £991 1s. Od.

I beg leave to append hereto a copy of the Committee's Report.

Mr. Tribe was criminally prosecuted for his very serious offence, but from want of sufficient evidence

escaped the punishment he so justly merited. I regret to have further to report that Mr. Tribe also embezzled a sum of £89 10s. 0d., by abstracting from time to time some of the moneys received under The Patent Law Act, which he collected as the Finance Clerk of the Colonial Secretary's Office.

The Returns of Collections furnished by him in support of payments made into the Revenue Office omitted of course the items so embezzled, and it was not until his fraudulent proceedings were discovered in

respect to the Immigration moneys that suspicion was aroused of his dishonesty in this matter. The duty of collecting and accounting for fees receivable under this Act is for the future devolved, by order of the Governor in Council, upon the Assistant Colonial Secretary.

2. Referring to the Deputy Auditor's letter of the 15th June, 1866, and to my own of the 7th July, 1864,\* I have now to report that Mr. Reynolds, the Collector of Rural Police Rates for the District of Hobart, has not yet finally closed his Accounts of former years up to the end of 1864, and that the Rates which still remain uncollected for that year amount to £52 15s. 4d., the total of the Valuation Roll being £862 3s. 0d. The outstanding amount for 1865 is £43 3s. 0d., the total of the Roll being £583 13s. 3d.; and for 1866, £48 9s. 2d., upon a total of £582 13s. 10d.

It is probable that little, if any, more of the uncollected Rates of 1864 will now be recovered, as so long a time has elapsed since they became due, and also as a margin must always be allowed for Rates that from various causes cannot be collected at all. But as regards the two latter years, I should hope that Mr. Reynolds will yet be enabled to reduce to some extent the above-stated deficiencies, having of late engaged, he represents, a gentleman to assist him in the duty of collection, which, together with the preparation of voluminous detailed accounts, has obviously been more than he could satisfactorily discharge himself, in addition to the ordinary duties of his fixed appointment in the Police Department. In consequence, however, of this delay in flually completing his Accounts of former years, though now precisely also detailed accounts in a provide her present of the present o

practically closed, Mr. Reynolds has not been in a position to claim Commission upon the amount of his Collections from the year 1858.

In looking over the uncollected Rates of some years past, it may be observed that the amount of loss does not reach in most cases any material per centage upon the gross totals, as the following Tabular Statement will show :-

Still, I would desire to record my opinion that, had more active measures been taken to obtain payment of the Rates within the year of assessment or immediately thereafter, a more satisfactory result might have been secured.

3. The only other District in arrear is that of Port Sorell, understood to be a difficult one to deal with from the nature of the country, and its scattered population. Mr. J. Reynolds, the Collector, has lately completed his collections for 1865, less the sum of £15 for

rates of which payment cannot be obtained; but in regard to the year 1866 there still remains an outstanding amount of nearly £100, the sum of £338 2s. 6d. only having been collected out of £437 17s. 9d., the total of the Roll.

In a communication dated 26th ultimo, which you were so good as to forward for my perusal, Mr. Reynolds explains that he cannot collect this balance, in consequence of a recent Magisterial decision on a question of evidence, which renders it necessary that some means should be adopted as soon as possible to remove this obstacle in the way of compelling payment of Rates justly due to the Public Revenue; and I would therefore take leave to submit to you that if the difficulty cannot be otherwise obviated, legislative intervention should be sought, with a view to amending the wording of the Act, so as to dispel any doubts at present existing on the law of the case.

4. In concluding this subject, generally, I would beg to call attention to the fact that the deferring for so long a time to collect the Rates necessarily creates difficulties in regard to many of them, from removals of tenants or occupiers, absence of landlords, and other causes which might, perhaps, in many instances be overcome if more prompt measures were taken in the collection : and upon this point I am glad to acknowovercome if more prompt measures were taken in the collection : and upon this point I am glad to acknow-ledge the copy, with which you have favoured me, of your Circular Letter of the 27th ultimo, addressed to the several Collectors of Rural Police Rates, which seems quite to meet the requirements of the case, and indeed anticipates some suggestions I had intended to offer; but I would still take the liberty to refer you to the observations made by me in connection with this subject in my Report of the 28th August, 1862,\* wherein I indicated the advantage which I thought would be gained by issuing the Proclamation for the collection of the Rates at an earlier period of the year of Assessment,—expressing my belief that, if it were practicable to do so within the first quarter of the year, the collection of the Rates would be thereby greatly facilitated.

5. I would avail myself also of this opportunity to bring under your notice the Accounts of the Boards of Works throughout the Colony.

With every disposition to meet the requirements of the Audit Office, the members of these Boards are not generally supposed to be much acquainfed with the financial regulations of the Public Service, and are probably under the impression, for the most part, that a complete audit of their Accounts is not required to probably under the impression, for the most part, that a complete audit of their Accounts is not required to be undertaken by this Department,—as it is understood, indeed, that the Government under whom the Boards originated did not deem it necessary that their Accounts should be dealt with in the same strict manner as ordinary Public Accounts passing in detail through the Treasury. But whilst it may be readily admitted that every consideration should be shown, and a certain dis-cretionary power be allowed to these gentlemen, as discharging honorary duties for the public advantage of a responsible nature, I still incline to the opinion that their Accounts should be subjected to a proper audit

by this Department.

I would not, however, desire to propose such stringent rules for the guidance of a Board of Works in regard to their Accounts that would be applied in the case of a paid Public Servant; but I should be very glad at the same time to see some regulation established that would produce something like uniformity in the way of rendering their Accounts, and would secure an earlier settlement of them than can at present be accomplished.

With this view I would venture to suggest that, if practicable, all payments should for the future be made at the Colonial Treasury direct to Contractors and other persons entitled to receive moneys from any Board of Works, upon a perfect voucher duly certified by the Chairman, and when convenient by another member of the Board, to the effect that the claim is correct and in accordance with public contract or private agreement, or as the case may be, and that the work has been well and satisfactorily executed.

It appears to me that, unless this course should trammel the operations of the Boards in regard to small payments, it is very much to be preferred to the present mode of dealing with this expenditure; and, more-over, if it should be found necessary, as in some cases it might, to make a temporary advance to a Board

for petty disbursements, an account of particulars with vouchers could be forwarded to the Treasury as soon as the first amount was expended, and a further advance be issued for the same object, and so on from time to time as circumstances might require.

This plan would, I submit, tend to simplify materially the Treasury transactions with the several Boards of Works, and avoid the objectionable practice of having so many open Accounts of large extent throughout the Country.

6. In connection with this subject I would ask permission to recal to your recollection the correspondence on Query No. 759 raised by the Deputy-Auditor in my absence upon certain sums advanced to the Trustees of the Sorell Causeway, for the expenditure of which he desired to be furnished with proper Accounts and Vouchers. The Trustees did not, however, deem it incumbent upon them to comply with the regulations of this Department, stating that the "Sorell Causeway Act," No. 1, placed all moneys received at their sole disposal, subject to the publication of their Accounts, the control of Parliament, and their liability to removal by the Executive Government.

The correspondence was accordingly submitted to your predecessor by the Deputy-Auditor, with an urgent recommendation that, if the Law Officers construed the Act in the same way as the Trustees, legislative action should be taken to bring the Accounts of the Commissioners under the operation of the Audit Act.

The Honorable the Colonial Treasurer having ascertained from the Solicitor-General that, as the law stood, the Trustees could not be required to furnish Accounts, pronounced the opinion that the Sorell Causeway Act should be altered, on the general principle that all expenditure of Public Money ought to be subject to Audit. I had the honor, in a Minute addressed to you on the 12th December last, to express my entire concurrence in this view; and I now beg leave to repeat the suggestion then offered for the consideration of the present Executive, whether such steps should not be taken at the approaching Session of Parliament as will legally supply what appears to me to be an important omission in the original Act of the Sorell Causeway.

7. In my letter to your predecessor, of the 7th July, 1864,\* I drew attention to the fact that no detailed Accounts had reached this Office showing particulars of the expenditure of sums of money advanced by the Crown Agents in London towards the introduction of Salmon into this Colony, and suggested that a request should be conveyed to the gentleman entrusted with the management of the business in England to forward a statement in detail of the disbursements made by him for the object in question, accompanied by the requisite Vouchers, at the earliest convenient opportunity.

As considerable advances have thus been made from time to time, I take leave to renew my suggestion on the present occasion, as I consider that, although the duty be undertaken by an honorary Agent, the Colony, whilst fully appreciating the services rendered, is entitled to see the details of the expenditure just as much as if the business were placed in the hands of a paid servant of the Government; and I feel satisfied, moreover, that it will only be necessary to intimate the desirableness of this course to Mr. Youl, to at once secure that gentleman's acquiescence, and a prompt compliance with the requirements of this Department.

8. In the same letter I referred to the circumstance that the Crown Agents in England continue to render their Accounts of transactions conducted for this Colony with original Vouchers to the Commissioners of Audit in London; a course which, in our altered position relatively to the Imperial authorities, appeared to me to be unnecessary, and was indeed so far attended with disadvantage that I could not obtain in all cases satisfactory Vouchers for the disbursements made by the Agents on account of this Colony.

As all direct communication has for some years ceased between the Imperial Board of Audit and this Department, I beg now to repeat my former suggestion that the original Vouchers, instead of being handed over to the Commissioners, should be forwarded by the Crown Agents with their Quarterly Accounts Current to the Honorable the Colonial Treasurer at Hobart Town, by whom they would be transferred in due course to the Audit Office for examination.

#### Hobart Town, 12th October, 1866.

SIR, WE have the honor to report that, in accordance with instructions, we have examined the Accounts of the Board of Immigration from the 1st January, 1859, to the 30th September, 1866, furnished by Mr. Tribe, the Secretary to the Board.

The result of a careful investigation has been to show us that from the year 1859, which commences with a correct balance, the accounts have been made out in a most unsatisfactory manner; serious discrepancies occur throughout, which we think it unnecessary to detail in this Report: but we found it desirable to have an entirely new set of Accounts prepared, in which all items which had been introduced in the Accounts but which could not be allowed have been omitted, and on the contrary omissions for which vouchers or moral proof of payment has been given have been added. These Accounts have only been completed to-day, and you will, on reference to them, perceive that on 30th September last a balance of  $\pounds 2233$  17s. appears as overpaid by the Board which should agree with the overdrawn Account at the Bank; whereas the Bank-book at that date shows that the Account stands overdrawn to the extent of  $\pounds 3214$  18s., to which must be added  $\pounds 10$  for two outstanding cheques of  $\pounds 5$  each. The discrepance, amounting to  $\pounds 991$  1.., is caused from the following circumstances:—

With reference to No. 1, Mr. Tribe states--"These are double payments, and must be repaid."

On No. 2 explanation is given which, unsupported by any Voucher or other proof than a mere statement, is considered doubtful, and therefore the amounts have been disallowed.

On No. 3 Mr. Tribe states that he cannot give any explanation as the amounts cannot be traced; they have also been disallowed. His answer on this point accompanies this Report.

Upon the examination of the Accounts having been concluded, Mr. Tribe was asked whether he could furnish any of the cancelled Cheques for the amounts which had been drawn from the Bank? He replied, that he could not, as he had destroyed them. This applies to those amounts which had been introduced in his Account Current as well as to those upon which he could give no explanation.

It having been found that the amounts referred to above, numbered 3, Statement B., had not been recorded in the butts of the Cheque Books produced during the investigation, Mr. Tribe was asked, if he had been in the habit of using any other Chequebook? He replied that he had not.

We transmit herewith the Accounts of the Board of Immigration from the 1st January, 1859, to 30th September, 1866, as made out from the Vouchers and proofs produced to us, and also the original Accounts furnished by Mr. Tribe.

In making this Report we have confined ourselves to the simple facts elicited in the examination of the Accounts as furnished in the first instance by Mr. Tribe, aided by the Bank-book and such Vouchers as he could supply. Any further information that it is possible to give we will be prepared to furnish if required.
