

REPORT.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Moore, and ordered by the Council to be printed, July 12, 1882.



Real Estates Duties Department, Hobart, 20th June, 1882.

Sir.

I have the honor to submit the following Report on the working of the Southern Division of this Department for the year 1881-2, with the following explanatory Return showing the amount of Duty for each District for the year 1881, the amount collected, the amount remaining due on the 30th of May, and the amount remitted.

The collection of the Duty for the year 1881 has been satisfactorily carried on, nearly the whole of the Duty due in the Country Districts having been paid through the Post Office,—the facilities offered by that Department having been largely availed of. The amounts still uncollected are less than they were at the corresponding period of last year, and consist almost exclusively of small amounts in the Country Districts.

Since the date of my last Report, the Act 45 Vict. No. 19 was passed, by which the Rural Police Rate was directed to be paid to the Commissioners appointed under "The Real and Personal Estates Duties Act;" and on the 10th of January I was appointed a Collector of the Rural Police Rate for the Districts of Hobart, Kingborough, Franklin, South Longford, and Carnarvon.

Since my appointment the Demands for the Rural Police Rate for the year 1882 for the above Districts have been issued, and a large proportion of the Rate has been paid, principally through the Post Office.

The most onerous part of my duty this year has been the preparation of Assessment Rolls for the year 1882, so that a fair and equitable assessment of all properties in the Southern Division might be made, as contemplated by "The Real and Personal Estates Duties Act," on the basis indicated by Clause 17.

For this purpose Forms were sent to the owners or occupiers of all the properties on the Assessment Rolls of the different Districts, requiring a written statement of particulars relating thereto.

It was considered necessary that new Assessment Rolls should be made for the year 1882 by the Commissioners, for all the Municipal and Police Districts in Tasmania.

As regarded properties occupied by tenants, the returns received from occupiers or owners enabled me in most cases to fix the rateable value, as required by Clause 17 of "The Real and Personal Estates Duties Act." For the purpose of determining the rateable value of many of those properties in the occupation of the owners further information was necessary.

It was obviously impossible for the Commissioners to obtain such necessary information, by personal inspection of the properties, within the limited time at their command; and, as no provision had been made for the employment of Assessors with power to enter and view property, authority was obtained for the employment of gentlemen conversant with the properties in each District to give information as to the rental value of such properties in owners' occupation.

From information derived from the above sources, Assessment Rolls have been prepared, and those for the following Districts have been published:—Brighton, Carnarvon, Clarence, Franklin,

Glenorchy, Green Ponds, Hobart District, Kingborough, Oatlands, Richmond, Sorell, South Longford, and Spring Bay.

Assessment Rolls for the remaining Districts of Bothwell, Hamilton, Hobart (City), and New Norfolk are nearly completed.

Real Estates Duties Department, Launceston, 7th July, 1882.

Sir.

I HAVE the honor to submit the Second Annual Report of the Real Estates Duties Department, Northern Division, for the years 1881 and 1882, with the accompanying explanatory Returns.

No. 1, an Abstract Return showing the total number of items and amount of Duty for each District for the year 1880, and the number of items and amount of Duty collected and uncollected up to the 30th June, 1882.

On the 30th June, 1881, (see Parliamentary Return), the amount of duty then outstanding is shown as £309 18s. 5d. Of that amount I have since collected £190 2s. 1d., leaving 374 items, representing an aggregate of £119 16s. 4d., still unpaid for that year.

An examination of the third division of the Return will at once show that the major part, both in number and amount, of the balance still uncollected is for properties of small value in the following Police Districts, viz., Emu Bay, George Town, Port Sorell, Russell, and Selby, which have 293 items, representing £98 4s. 10d.; thus leaving only 81 items, amounting to £21 11s. 6d., unpaid in the remaining nine Municipal Districts.

No. 2 is an Abstract for the year 1881 of a somewhat similar character, showing the total number of items, the value, and the duty on the Rolls up to the 30th June, 1882, the amount collected, and the number of items and amount of duty uncollected on the above date.

The details under the head "uncollected" clearly prove that a very large proportion of that amount is represented in the six Police Districts; i.e., Emu Bay, George Town, Portland, Port Sorell, Russell, and Selby—viz., 1111 items, of the aggregate value of £305 13s. 6d., leaving a balance of only 486 items, representing £128 12s. 10d., still uncollected in the nine Municipal Districts, which, together with the six districts before named, make up the Northern Division.

This and the foregoing Return is intended to show in a concise form the difficulty of collecting the duty on properties of small value,—say up to £7,—more particularly in the Districts specially mentioned.

No. 3 is a comparative Abstract of the Valuation Rolls for the Northern Division for the years 1880, 1881, and 1882, giving the totals for the three years.

The figures are worthy of consideration and comparison, as they are unmistakeable evidence of the rapid and important progress made within the periods named in the occupation and settlement of the Waste Lands in the principal mining and agricultural districts of this division of the Colony.

The total number of items on the Rolls for the year 1880 is 11,985, and for 1882, 14,895, thus exhibiting an increase in the number of holdings in the two years of 2910.

Preparatory to the compilation of new Rolls for 1882, effect was given to clause 18, 43 Vict. No. 12, by issuing a copy of the prescribed notice to each owner or occupier to state particulars of the land in his occupation. Upon the basis of the information contained in the notices, manuscript rolls have been made, and then again revised and revalued. At this second revision I was assisted by a resident gentleman in each of the districts (except two), specially selected for his local knowledge and recognised ability for the important duties.

No doubt inaccuracies still exist, and possibly a few inequalities, but those cases will prove trivial in number and amount compared with the totals.

I believe the Rolls for 1882, now ready for the printer (six have already been published), will be found a fair reflex of the rental value of the freehold properties in the several districts in accordance with the standard in clause 17 of the 43 Vict. No. 12.

I have already had the honor to place before you my views with reference to certain amendments which time and the working of the Act have proved to be necessary. I need not therefore repeat them here.

No. 4 is an Abstract of the six Police Districts in the Northern Division, giving the totals in number and value, and the amount of rate collected and uncollected up to the 30th June, 1882. The demands for the rate have been made out and duly posted for five of the districts.

Those for Port Sorell have not been issued. This cessation of the work was in consequence and in conformity with your instructions, and will also account for the comparatively small sum, £1041 18s. 3d., collected.

No. 5 is a comparative Return of Police Rates for the Northern Division for the years 1881 and 1882, showing the increase for the latter year.

No. 6. This Abstract is designed to exhibit the large increase of work which has been added to the office consequent upon the passing last Session of the 45 Vict. No. 19.

The collection of the Police Rate has doubled the ordinary routine work of the office, inasmuch as the accounts have to be kept distinct, and this necessitates two sets of books, and doubles the usual weekly, monthly, and other Returns.

The totals show the number of items for this division to be 21,870, and the amount of revenue, £19,694.

The cost of the Office, as shown by the Estimates for 1883, is $6\frac{4}{5}$ per cent. upon the amount to be collected.

No. 7. Returns Nos. 1 and 2 are intended to show in a concise form the total number of Appeals received under the 43 Vict. No. 12 for the year 1882, and how the said appeals were disposed of.

No. 8 is a Return intended to show the number of Rolls issued in accordance with clause 12, 43 Vict. No. 12, for each of the Districts named therein; the number exhibited as directed; the number of places in each district where rolls had not been received: and the number of persons who failed to answer the queries.
