

THE Committee agree to the following Resolutions:-

Rules for the regulation of the Refreshment Room.

- 1. That the present Refreshment Room and Ante-room be reserved for the use of Members only, but Visitors to the Colony may be admitted by the Order of the President of the Legislative Council or the Speaker of the House of Assembly.
- 2. That the Lower Committee Room be available as a Refreshment Room for Visitors introduced by Members.
- 3. That the Room at present occupied by Mr. Whyte should be made available for the use in common of Members of both Houses as a Dressing-room.
- 4. That the Usher of the Black Rod be directed to give instructions to the Housekeeper to provide brushes and combs, mirror, and a daily supply of clean towels.
