

Downing-street, 27th August, 1880.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to inform you that the Queen has been pleased to appoint Lieut.-General Sir John Henry Lefroy, K.C.M.G., C.B., formerly Governor of Bermuda, to administer the Government of Tasmania until the arrival in the Colony of Governor Sir George Cumine Strahan, R.A., K.C.M.G., who has been appointed by the Queen to administer the Government of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope pending the arrival there of Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, G.C.M.G., whom the Queen has been pleased to appoint to be Governor of that Colony.

As at present arranged, it is proposed that Sir John Lefroy should leave England for Tasmania by the S.S. *Orient*, leaving Plymouth September 4.
