

I have the honor to inform you that this Company has transferred the Tasmania and Victoria Telegraph Cable to "The Eastern Extension Australasia & China Telegraph Company, Limitèd," who take over, as from 1st May, 1873, all this Company's rights and obligations contained in the Articles of Agreement between your Government and this Company, dated 24th June, 1868.

I have respectfully to request that the payments hitherto made by your Government under the said Agreement to the Bank of Australasia to this Company's credit may be made as from 1st May, 1873, to the credit of "The Eastern Extension Australasia & China Telegraph Company, Limited," who will render to you the Annual Statements of the working of the Line heretofore furnished by this Company.
