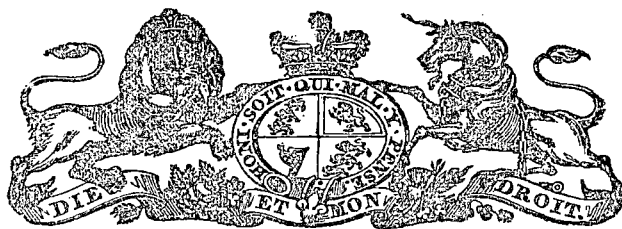

The Governor in Council has under his further consideration the letter of the Lord Bishop of Tasmania, dated August 19, 1863; requesting permission to retire from this Episcopate under the provisions of "The Superannuation Act."

His Excellency grants the Bishop a Pension at the rate of £333 6s. 8d. per annum, under "The Superannuation Act," from the date of the cessation of His Lordship's leave of Absence.
