

### STATE SCHOOLS EXHIBITIONS, 1887.

Education Department, Tasmania, Hobart, 1st July, 1887. THE annexed Report of the Examiners appointed to conduct the Examination of Candidates for Exhibitions from State Schools is published for general information.

#### REPORT OF EXAMINERS.

THE Examiners present their Report on the Annual Examinations for Exhibitions from State Schools, which was held at Hobart and Launceston on the 14th, 15th, and 16th June, 1887.

Twenty candidates were examined-twelve boys and eight girls.

Reading.—The reading was generally very fair.

Writing and Spelling from Dictation.—In writing very few did really good work, but the majority acquitted themselves fairly. The spelling of a few was bad, but that of the majority was very fair.

Grammar.—The work in this subject was on the whole satisfactory; there were fewer bad failures than last year. The answers generally showed fair intelligence, but a few candidates used forms, phrases, and technical terms in a manner that showed that they had been learnt by rote, but not understood.

Geography.—In most cases the results were fairly satisfactory. Excellent work was done by several candidates in answering some of the questions.

History.—A few did well; the majority showed a fair general knowledge of the subject. Several answered recklessly.

Arithmetic.—A large proportion of the papers showed ignorance or inaccuracy in the simple The average of the marks obtained is not quite up to half the maximum; but a few of the rules. candidates did creditable work.

General Questions.—Most of the answers to questions in this paper were disappointing, though a few candidates showed very fair intelligence and the possession of a considerable amount of useful information.

In this examination we find that two candidates—one from Bathurst-street, and one from Sandy Bay—have been sent up in disregard of the circular sent to Teachers on the 10th of September, 1884.
