- 1 **COUNCIL MEETS.** The Council met at 11.00 o'clock in the forenoon.
- **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE.**—The President said: "We meet today on Tasmanian Aboriginal land. We acknowledge and pay respect to the Tasmanian Aboriginal people and elders, past and present. We recognise them as the traditional and original owners and the continuing custodians of this land."

- **5 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH WORKER ACCOMODATION.** Ms *Lovell* asked the Honourable the Leader of the Government In relation to worker accommodation owned or utilised by the Department of Health can the Government:—
- (1) Provide a list of residential dwellings currently owned by the Department with a breakdown by suburb/town, date of build, date of purchase/build, number of bedrooms, last valuation amount and the occupation groups that the accommodation is made available to.
- (2) Provide for each of the last 5 years, the number of residential dwellings owned, purchased or built by the Department and the number sold by the Department.
- (3) Provide any strategy that the Department has or is considering specifically for increasing the availability of residential dwellings for health workers around Tasmania.

(3) The Department of Health provides accommodation support to eligible health staff, including newly recruited staff from interstate and overseas, rotating medical registrars, senior clinical staff, health executives and agency staff. This accommodation support can be in the form of hotel-style accommodation, short or longer-term accommodation in Crown-owned or leased properties, or financial allowances to support health staff to finance their own sourced accommodation.

As part of Health Workforce 2040 strategy (Action 5.08), a review of the policy and processes around health staff accommodation has commenced with a view to provide accommodation support more efficiently and economically, while supporting the service delivery requirements of the Department.

This project is in line with work already being undertaken by Infrastructure, as part of the Department's Residential Accommodation Reform Project to implement centralised governance to improve and standardise the management of residential leases.

The Department has also contributed to consultation with Homes Tasmania in their development of the Tasmanian Housing Strategy Action Plan, to assist in developing a framework for key worker rental accommodation.
