1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.

2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. - The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.

3 PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. – The Speaker read Prayers.

4 QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.

5 CONSTITUENCY QUESTIONS. – In accordance with Sessional Order No. 48C, Constituency Questions were asked.

6 PETITION. – Ms *Haddad* presented a Petition from approximately 1042 citizens of Tasmania, requesting that the House calls on the Government to fund the renovation and/or the construction requirements of the Glenorchy War Memorial swimming pool. (HA4/2024).

Which Petition was read and received.

7 PAPERS. – The Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management laid upon the Table of the House the following Papers:-
