GAOLS, HOBART AND LAUNCESTON :

SHERIFF'S REPORT FOR 1887.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



Sheriff's Office, Hobart, 12th June, 1888.

SIR,

It has hitherto been the custom to furnish separate Annual Reports by the Superintendents of the Penal Establishments at Hobart and Launceston, with a series of statistical returns attached to each.

An inquiry into the mode of preparing these Returns has disclosed that in some respects the system adopted differed in the two Establishments, and this was particularly the case in relation to the value assigned to work performed by prison labour, which has been estimated at a higher rate in Launceston than in Hobart. This discovery has led to the adoption of a uniform system in the Returns herewith, which are considerably less in number than those formerly supplied, but contain such information as will, in my opinion, be requisite for public purposes.

The Returns are prepared in such a manner as to enable a comparison of the two Establishments, and are in accord with the practice adopted in other Colonies.

I am pleased to be in a position to report that on 31st December last there were fewer inmates of the prisons, Hobart and Launceston, than on the corresponding day of the previous year. The totals being—

31 December, 1886.

596 males—290 females = 886.
601 males—180 females = 781.

being a decrease of 22 in Hobart and 18 in Launceston.

The total numbers received and discharged during 1887 were as follows—

Hobart ... 577 males—287 females = 864	596 males—290 females = 886.
Launceston 604 males—159 females = 763	601 males—180 females = 781.

Discharged.

The convictions at the Supreme Court were—

Hobart ... 26 males—5 females = 31, being 1 less than in 1886.
Launceston 21 males—2 females = 23, being 7 less than in 1886.

One prisoner, convicted of Murder, was executed at Hobart.

This Report would have been furnished at an earlier date, but, owing to changes in the clerical staff of the Launceston Penal Establishment, the information relating to that Establishment was not supplied until a recent date.
