Out of the admissions for the year 15 patients were treated for the first time.

Birth-place and Religion of Inmates.

Twenty-nine were natives of Tasmania, and one a native of India. Fifteen were Protestants, and fifteen were Roman Catholics.

The average was 20 years, the youngest was 15 years, and the oldest 28 years.
