

Return to an Order of the House dated September 16, 1869. (Mr. C. Meredith.):

No Station at which goods can be entered for Duty.

MEMORANDUM.

SWANSEA and Three Hut Point were Ports of Entry from 1st January, 1866, to 1st January, 1867; during that time no goods were entered for duty at either of the Stations.

A RETURN of Stations within the Port of LAUNCESTON at which dutiable and other Goods can be entered and cleared; also the Stations at which Vessels can enter only in "Ballast," and clear only with Colonial Produce.
