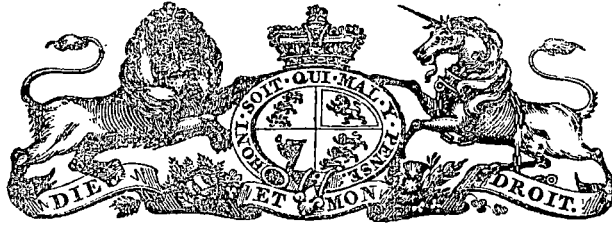

TENTH Annual Report of the Inspector of the Constabulary Forces maintained by Municipalities in Tasmania for the Year ending 30th June, 1867. (Pursuant to 29 Vict. No. 9.)

Office of Inspector of Police, 31st July, 1867.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor herewith to submit, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, my Tenth Annual Report on the state of the Constabulary Forces maintained by Municipalities in Tasmania, which with few exceptions remain unaltered in their organisation, pay, and numerical strength, and satisfactorily sustain their efficiency.

Since the date of my last Report one additional Rural Municipality only has been established, viz., Campbell Town. The difficulties in the way of extension of Municipal action to the remaining Police Districts are so obvious as to, I think, prevent any present expectations of the Government being relieved of the maintenance of their Police being realised.

In anticipation of the withdrawal of their grants in aid some Municipalities have reduced their Police Forces to a minimum strength, and further weakened their efficiency by a reduction of pay below an adequate standard. It must be admitted, as a matter of vital importance to the usefulness and efficiency of a Police Force, that all reasonable means should be used to induce well-conducted and intelligent men to enter and continue in it,—to make it, in fact, a profession; and I feel assured that the duties and responsibilities of Constables are not generally sufficiently enquired into or considered by those at whose hands they receive their remuneration. Men in the prime of life, of good character and fair education, with tact, temper, and a general intelligence, which alone ensure a discreet and energetic exercise of authority, under circumstances often of a difficult character, brought as they constantly are in collision with the worst classes of society, certainly are entitled to a wage equal to that obtainable by the skilled labourer or mechanic who is not subjected to discipline or restriction, and who has at least one day in the week (Sunday) to himself. Now that no Superannuation Fund is in existence in Municipalities, and the chance of promotion in the Force very distant, fair wages alone will secure and retain the services of honest, intelligent Constables; and as an under-paid Police cannot be an efficient one, I cannot too strongly urge this on the consideration of Municipalities.

Crime of a serious character, I am gratified to report, has materially decreased, and offences against the person are of rare occurrence. The usual class of indictable offences, committed for the most part by members of a stereotyped crime-committing community who prefer a life of vagrancy to one of honest industry, are also slightly on the decrease.

I annex a tabular Return showing the strength, organisation, and pay of the Municipal Forces; and I would observe that I continue to work harmoniously with the Municipal authorities generally.

MUNICIPALITIES.

CITY OF HOBART TOWN.

Since my last inspection there has been a reduction of two Petty Constables in this Force; the protection of the City has, however, only been slightly affected by their numerical decrease. Its organisation remains unchanged, and its standard of efficiency is a satisfactory one. The pay of the whole Force has been reduced to a scale which I consider should be now fixed as a minimum. At the time of inspection there was one vacancy; the men looked smart and healthy, and their uniforms and necessaries, accoutrements, &c. were in good order. The defaulters' book showed only one Constable to have been subjected to punishment during the year. Four Petty Constables had resigned, and one been dismissed, since last inspection.

During the year ending 30th June 312 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 216 persons had been apprehended, of whom 145 were committed for trial or convicted summarily. Proceedings had been taken against four public-houses only, and penalties inflicted in each case. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 212, of whom 120 were males and 92 females. The station-house, wards and cells were in good repair and clean, and the books, records, and returns intelligently and correctly kept.

The common lodging-houses are inspected by an Acting Sub-Inspector, who also is the Summoning Officer of the Police Court, and a medical man visits the station-house.

TOWN OF LAUNCESTON.

A reduction of one Detective Constable and one Petty Constable has been made in this Force since my last inspection; but by a change in its organisation consequent on the resignation of an Acting Sub-Inspector, and the appointment of a Petty Constable in his place, an increased amount of protection is given to the town at night, and a locality hitherto neglected has now protection extended to it. Its standard of efficiency, pay, and permanence of service is highly satisfactory. One death has occurred in the Force, and one Acting Sub-Inspector and two Petty Constables have resigned. The men looked well, and their uniform and accoutrements were in good order.

During the year ending 30th June 203 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 124 persons were apprehended, of whom 70 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. Eight public-houses had been proceeded against, and penalties inflicted in every case. 309 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 169 were males and 140 females. The station-house and cells were clean, and the books, records, and returns clearly and correctly kept. The new Police Buildings now ready for occupation, erected on the site of the old House of Correction, will prove a great accommodation and convenience.

The Sub-Inspector is Inspector of Nuisances. A medical officer visits the station-house.

RURAL MUNICIPALITIES.

This Force is efficient, and its authorised numerical strength remains unaltered, though at the time of inspection there were several vacancies for Special Constables. One Petty and one Special Constable had resigned since my last inspection, and the Superintendent had been suspended on a charge of misconduct, but subsequently restored to office. The Force has, in compliance with my request, been clothed in uniform of a good quality, and their arms and accoutrements were in good order.

During the year ending 30th June 25 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 17 persons were apprehended, of whom 13 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. Informations had

been laid against two public-houses, against one of which four convictions have been recorded, and three against the other. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 9,—7 males and 2 females. The station-houses, wards, and cells are in good repair and clean; and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

SPRING BAY.

This Force is unaltered in numerical strength or organisation, but an escort station is required on the boundaries of this Municipality and those of Richmond and Sorell. The bridge lately built across the Prosser's River greatly facilitates Police communication. There have been neither resignations nor dismissals from the Force since my last inspection.

During the year ending 30th June 8 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 6 persons had been apprehended, all of whom were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No public-houses had been proceeded against. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 5, all of whom were males. The station-houses, wards, and cells were in good repair and clean, and the books, records, and returns well and correctly kept. The uniform, arms, and accoutrements supplied to the men were in good order. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. There is no medical officer attached to the Force.

CLARENCE.

This Force scarcely comes up to a standard of efficiency, its pay having been reduced to what I consider an inadequate scale, and the services of two Special Constables dispensed with, these men having resigned on the withdrawal of their annual salaries. A large area of country known as South Arm, which is open to depredations on its river and sea-board, is now entirely unprotected. No dismissals nor resignations from the Effective Force had taken place since my last inspection.

During the year ending June 30th 15 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 8 persons had been apprehended, of whom 7 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. Proceedings had been taken against one public-house, and a penalty inflicted. 10 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 6 were males and 4 females. The men are not supplied with uniform, but their arms and accoutrements are good. The station-houses were in good repair, and the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Roads.

RICHMOND.

This Force remains unchanged either in numerical strength or organisation since my last inspection, and is efficient. There had been no dismissals nor resignations during the year, and the men were supplied with good clothing, arms, and accoutrements.

During the year ending 30th June 37 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 34 persons had been apprehended, of whom 13 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The number of persons charged with drunkenness was 33, of whom 17 were males and 16 females. The station-houses were in good order, that at Jerusalem having been repaired, and the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns are well and correctly kept. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. A medical officer is attached to the Force.

OATLANDS.

A change in the numerical strength of this Force has been effected since my last inspection by the addition of one Petty Constable, the establishment of an Escort Station at Antill Ponds, and the discontinuance of the services of Special Constables. Its efficiency, which has always been of a high standard, is still maintained, and permanency of service in it is satisfactory. One Petty Constable had been dismissed during the year, but there had been no resignations.

During the year ending 30th June 39 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 17 persons were apprehended, of whom 11 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. 14 con-

victions had been had against public-houses,—in some cases 3 and 4 against one house. 40 persons had been charged with being drunk and disorderly,—24 males and 16 females. The station-houses were in good repair, and the wards and cells clean; and the books, records, and returns well and correctly kept. No medical officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. The Constable at Tunbridge is Poundkeeper.

LONGFORD.

The numerical strength and organisation of this Force, which satisfactorily maintains its efficiency, remains unaltered. The men were well clothed, looked smart, and had their arms and accoutrements in good order. There had been neither dismissals nor resignations since my last inspection.

During the year ending June 30th there had been 51 indictable offences reported to the Police, for which 30 persons had been apprehended, of whom 21 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. No proceedings had been taken against public-houses. The number of persons charged with drunk and disorderly conduct was 141, of whom 112 were males and 29 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean; and the books, records, and returns well and correctly kept. No medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

No change in the numerical strength nor organisation of this Force has taken place since my last inspection. It is an efficient one. There have been no dismissals nor resignations within the past year.

During the year ending 30th June 45 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 35 persons had been apprehended, of whom 28 were convicted summarily or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. 51 persons had been charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct, of whom 42 were males and 9 females. The men were well clothed, and their arms and accoutrements in good order. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

SORELL.

The numerical strength of this Force has been reduced and its organisation changed since my last inspection, by the dispensing with the services of one Petty Constable and of the two Special Constables. It is still, however, efficient, though I consider it is at its minimum standard. One petty Constable had been dismissed, and one had resigned. From enquiries made into the conduct of some of the Force, I have every reason to believe that sufficient attention is not paid to discipline, which requires enforcing at the hands of the authorities. The undress uniform worn was of indifferent quality.

During the year ending 30th June 36 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 28 persons had been apprehended, of whom 17 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. Proceedings had been taken against one public-house, and a penalty inflicted. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 21, of whom 13 were males and 8 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

BOTHWELL.

No change in numerical strength or organisation in this Force, which is an efficient one, had taken place since my last inspection, though there was a vacancy for a Petty Constable. Two Petty Constables had resigned, and one been dismissed within the year. The uniform worn by the Force was of good quality, and their arms and accoutrements in good order.

During the year ending June 30th 18 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 10 persons had been apprehended, of whom 5 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. No informations had been laid against public-houses. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 31, of whom 25 were males and 6 females. No medical officer is attached to the station.

The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

This Force, which is unchanged in organisation, but reduced in numerical strength by the services of two Special Constables having been dispensed with, has had its efficiency further weakened by the reduction of the pay of its Superintendent to too low a standard. The men were well clothed, and their arms and accoutrements were in good order. One Petty Constable had resigned and one Special Constable been dismissed within the year.

During the year ending 30th June 21 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 9 persons had been apprehended, of whom 8 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. No informations had been laid against public-houses. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 12, of whom 9 were males and 3 females. The station-house was in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

NEW NORFOLK.

This Force is an efficient one, and has undergone no alteration in numerical strength or organisation since my last inspection. An out-station has been established in the Macquarie Plains portion of the District, which was much required; that locality, in which there is a considerable population, requiring and being entitled to Police protection. There were no dismissals nor resignations from the Force within the year. The uniform was in good order, and the arms and accoutrements equally so.

During the year ending 30th June 65 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 54 persons had been apprehended, of whom 37 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. Proceedings had been taken against two public-houses, and convictions obtained. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 28, of whom 13 were males and 15 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No medical officer is attached to the Force.

HAMILTON.

The numerical strength of this Force has been reduced by a Special Constable since my last inspection, but its organisation and efficiency remain unaltered. A new and commodious station has been erected at the Ouse Bridge, affording barrack-room for the Constabulary, and cells for the custody of prisoners. The men were well clothed, and their arms and accoutrements in good order. One Petty Constable had resigned and one been dismissed within the year.

During the year ending 30th June, 46 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 42 persons were apprehended, of whom 27 were committed or summarily convicted. No informations had been laid against public-houses. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 37, of whom 27 were males and 10 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. A medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

BRIGHTON.

A reduction of one effective Petty Constable has been made in this Force since my last inspection, but a Special Constable has been appointed. Its efficiency has been weakened by this change in its organisation, as well as by a reduction in the pay of its Superintendent to too low a scale. A vacancy for a Sergeant existed at the time of inspection owing to the promotion of an Officer of that rank to the office of Superintendent, consequent on the dismissal of the Officer previously holding that appointment from the Force. The men's uniform was in good condition, and their arms and accoutrements equally so. One Petty Constable had resigned within the year.

During the year ending 30th June 33 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 21 persons had been apprehended, of whom 15 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. No public-houses had been proceeded against. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 75, of whom 44 were males and 31 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical officer is attached to the station. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

FINGAL.

This Force is an efficient one, and its numerical strength and organisation remain unaltered since my last report. A new station has been erected at Mangana (the gold-field of the Municipality), and the additional buildings at St. Mary's Pass are finished. The uniform worn by the men was of good quality, and their arms and accoutrements were in excellent order. One Sub-Inspector and two Petty Constables had resigned within the year, and one Petty Constable had been dismissed.

During the year ending 30th June 30 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 20 persons had been apprehended, of whom 15 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. Proceedings had been taken against 3 public-houses, and penalties inflicted. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 48, of whom 30 were males and 18 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean; and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

WESTBURY.

This Force satisfactorily maintains its efficiency, no change having been made in its numerical strength nor organisation. The men looked well, and their uniform, arms, and accoutrements were in good order. One Petty Constable had resigned and one been dismissed within the year. The station at Exton was finished.

During the year ending 30th June 82 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 45 persons had been apprehended, of whom 25 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 174, of whom 155 were males and 19 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. A medical man is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

DELORAINÉ.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength and organisation since my last Report, and is efficient. The Superintendent, who had had charge of the Force since its formation, had retired from ill-health, and a fresh Officer appointed. The new Station-house at Elizabeth Town is finished and occupied. One Petty Constable had deserted from the Force a few days prior to my inspection. The uniform was in pretty good condition, and the arms and accoutrements in good order.

During the year ending 30th June 62 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 36 persons were apprehended, of whom 23 were summarily convicted or committed for trial. One information had been laid against a public-house, and a conviction obtained. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 201, of whom 161 were males and 40 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the cells and wards clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

GLENORCHY.

The numerical strength and organisation of this Force, which is an efficient one, remain unaltered since my last Report. The limited accommodation afforded in the existing Head Station-house should be increased. A Station has been established at Bilton's Bridge, near the main road, which affords increased

protection to that locality. One Petty Constable had resigned within the year. The men looked well, their uniform was in excellent condition, and their arms and accoutrements in good order.

During the year ending 30th June 24 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 17 persons had been apprehended, of whom 10 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. One information had been laid against a public-house, but no conviction obtained. The number of persons charged with being drunk and disorderly was 20, of whom 12 were males and 8 females. The station-house was in good repair, the wards and cells clean; and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. A medical officer is attached to the Force.

EVANDALE.

The numerical strength of this Force has been reduced since my last Report by one Petty Constable, and its organisation slightly changed by the reduction of a Sub-Inspector to the rank of a Petty Constable, the pay of the Superintendent also having been reduced. It is still efficient. One Petty Constable had resigned within the year. The men were well clothed, and their arms and accoutrements in good order. New Council Chambers, &c. are in course of erection.

During the year ending the 30th June 34 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 30 persons had been apprehended, of whom 25 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. No informations had been laid against public-houses. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 39, of whom 33 were males and 6 females. The station-houses were in good repair, the wards and cells clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

CAMPBELL TOWN.

This Municipality was established on the 18th September last, and a reduction of two Petty Constables from the numerical strength handed over to it by the Government has been effected. No change has, however, been made in its organisation. It is efficient. There are 4 out-stations,—at Cleveland, at Stony Creek (to the maintenance of which the Municipality of Fingal contributes ten shillings a week), at the Windfalls, and at Turnbull's Bridge. A Special Constable resident on the township, for escort duty, is to be appointed. The men were well clothed, and their arms and accoutrements in good order. The Superintendent, however, was absent, attending the Supreme Court, at the time of my inspection.

During the year ending 30th June 39 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 25 persons had been apprehended, of whom 18 were convicted summarily or committed for trial. No informations had been laid against public-houses. The number of persons charged with drunkenness and disorderly conduct was 137, of whom 76 were males and 61 females. The Old Gaol building is unfit for occupation, and there is not sufficient accommodation for prisoners in that occupied as the station-house, which also wants immediate repair. Four new cells at least are required, and the necessity for these has been brought under the notice of the authorities. The wards in the head station-house and the wards and cells in the out-stations, which were in good repair, were clean, and the books, records, and returns correctly kept. No medical officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent is Summoning Officer, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.
